

TB Screening Locations in Chicago

This page serves as a resource for all individuals who are newly arriving to Chicago, or for those seeking a tuberculosis (TB) screening to meet employment requirements, to find reduced health especially for TB screening and care. **Individuals who are experiencing significant economic hardship will not be turned down for care, please reach out to the below healthcare centers for more information.**

The following locations are called **federally qualified health centers (FQHCs)**, meaning that they receive federal funding and offer reduced health costs using a sliding fee scale to those who need it based on their family size and income. TB screening is part of a comprehensive healthcare screening and thus may require you to schedule a visit before receiving TB care.

This document, developed by the Chicago Department of Public Health's (CDPH) Tuberculosis Program, serves as a resource for those seeking tuberculosis screening and healthcare services in the Chicago area.

Tuberculosis, **often referred to as TB**, is caused by a bacterium called *Mycobacterium tuberculosis*. When a person with TB sneezes, coughs, speaks or sings and a person close by breathes in the TB germs, they can develop TB anywhere in their body, although TB usually infects the lungs. Not all people who are exposed to TB germs will develop TB disease, however. Some people may have TB germs in their body but will not have any symptoms and are not able to spread TB to anyone else, this is called latent TB infection (LTBI).

There are two TB tests that are commonly used: a **TB skin test and a TB blood test**. A TB skin test is also referred to as the Mantoux tuberculin skin test (TST) and the TB blood test is also referred to as the interferon-gamma release assay (IGRA). There are two IGRAs: the QuantiFERON-TB Gold test or the T-Spot TB test. The skin test involves inserting a small amount of liquid (called tuberculin) under the skin, often on a person's arm. The blood test involves getting blood drawn and sending it to a lab to get tested for TB. One benefit of getting the **TB blood test** is that you **only need one visit with a healthcare provider**, but with the TB skin test, you must return to the health center 2 to 3 days after the test to have the results read.

If you have a positive TB test, you may have LTBI or TB disease. Your doctor will need to perform some or all of the following to determine if you have TB disease: a chest x-ray, further review of your medical history or other lab tests. Both LTBI and TB disease treatment involve taking several drugs. **It is important to get a TB test and take all your medication because TB can be deadly if untreated.**

If you were born outside of the United States, you may have received the TB vaccine, also known as the Bacille Calmette-Guérin (BCG) vaccine. A history of TB vaccination may result in a false positive TB skin test result.
