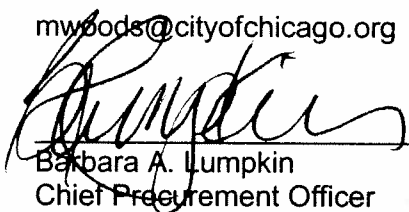

As stated in previous e-mails, we had to dispatch Heritage Environmental on emergencies throughout the city to remove and dispose of hazardous waste materials due to public health and safety issues. Below is a recap of the emergencies responded to by Heritage. Also, attached please find the invoices for each emergency response and the requisition for immediate payment.

1. A car accident at 51st and Cottage Grove caused city transformer to spill oil (PCB) onto the public way. The cost for this clean-up and disposal was \$1,518.00.
2. There was a toxic spill in the alley located at 4733 W. Augusta. The cost for this clean-up and disposal was \$3,576.76.
3. A drum had to be removed containing diesel fuel at 1509 S. Halsted. The cost for this disposal was \$708.70.
