These natural areas inhabit the grounds surrounding the Chicago Read Mental Health Center, a State-run hospital. A wetland 11 is located south of the parking lot, near the southwest corner of the property. The wetland is relatively small and filled with common reed (phragmites, an invasive weed).

To the west of the buildings is a larger complex of second-growth woods 2 and wetland 3. Great quantities of invasive teasel are found here, but there are also some native goldenrods and other flowers growing amidst the weeds.

The most significant feature of the Read-Dunning Wetlands is the overall size. The more natural, ungroomed portions are within a large, lightly tended open space 4; if restoration was undertaken for the unused portions of the grounds this would be a significant addition for nature and wildlife on the city's northwest side.
