**Official Notice of Changes to Chicago Municipal Code Section 4-60-130
Hours of Operation**

Consumption on Premises and Tavern License Holders – Sunday Hours

Please be advised of recent changes to the Municipal Code of Chicago (MCC) regarding the service of alcohol on Sundays at those establishments that hold a Consumption on Premises or Tavern liquor license, as well as a Retail Food license.

Date of Effectiveness:

The amendment to ordinance 4-60-130(a)(2) will go into effect Wednesday, **March 18, 2020**.

Business Licenses Effected:

The amendment to ordinance 4-60-130(a)(2) will impact Consumption on Premises – Incidental Activity and Tavern liquor licenses who also hold a Retail Food license.

Summary of Ordinance (O2020-123):

- Any premises that holds a Consumption on Premise – Incidental Activity license, who also holds a Retail Food license, shall be allowed to sell alcoholic liquor beginning at 9:00 a.m. on Sundays.
 - Consumption on Premises – Incidental Activity and Tavern licensees may not sell incidental or secondary package goods between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. on Sundays.
 - Any premises that holds a Tavern liquor license, who also holds a Retail Food license, shall be allowed to sell alcoholic liquor beginning at 9:00 a.m. on Sundays.
 - However, any alcoholic liquor sold between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. at these locations must be incidental or secondary to serving food.
