AGREED PLAN OF OPERATION

The City of Chicago Department of Business Affairs & Consumer Protection (“BACP”), the Local Liquor Control Commission (“LLCC”), and the above named licensee have agreed to the following license conditions concerning the operation of the business:

- 1. Liquor Prohibited.** Licensee agrees not to have any alcoholic beverages sold and/or consumed on the licensed premises. Licensee agrees not to allow BYOB (Bring Your Own Bottle) of beer, wine, or alcoholic liquor at the licensed premises. Licensee agrees not to apply for a liquor license.
- 2. Hours of Operation.** Licensee shall operate between the hours of 8 a.m. and 2 a.m. daily.
- 3. Permitted Business Activity.** The permitted business activity at the licensed premises is limited to athletic activities to occur on Licensee’s indoor soccer field. Provided, however, that nothing in this plan of operation shall limit Licensee from applying for a retail food license or limited business license.
- 4. Firearms Prohibited.** Licensee shall not allow firearms, concealed or otherwise, in the licensed premises, unless the individual carrying a firearm is otherwise permitted to do so, because they are authorized to carry a firearm under Section 24-2(e) of the Illinois Criminal Code.
- 5. Duty to Monitor.** Licensee shall regularly monitor the exterior area around the licensed premises during all of its business hours in order to address and abate noise, loitering and littering complaints about Licensee’s patrons or employees.
- 6. Duty to Deny Entry.** Licensee shall deny entry to any person who is visibly intoxicated and shall notify local police of all unlawful acts witnessed by, or reported to, any of its employees, including instances of public intoxication, loitering, use of narcotic drugs, unlawful use of marijuana, or other



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7. public disturbances. Licensee shall train all employees regarding their duty to report such incidents. Licensee shall document all incidents reported to the police in a written log and shall retain all incident reports generated for no less than one (1) year.
8. **Duty to Address Nuisance Conditions.** Licensee shall immediately address any public nuisance issues that adversely impact the health, safety, and welfare of the community.
9. **Duty to Contact Police.** Licensee shall immediately notify the police of any illegal activity viewed in and around the licensed premises. Licensee shall designate an employee during each shift who shall be responsible for contacting police when illegal activity is viewed in and around the licensed premises. Licensee agrees to provide victim assistance, where reasonable and where said employees and / or personnel are able to provide such assistance without any risk of personal injury or bodily harm, and to halt any ongoing activity.
10. **Log Book.** Licensee shall maintain a log book of all instances that Licensee contacted 9-1-1 and / or the police station to address nuisance issues and illegal activity. The log shall include the date, time, and nature of the incident, as well as the name of the employee or personnel who reported the nuisance or illegal activity to police.
11. **Duty to Monitor Noise.** Licensee shall monitor the noise levels emanating from the licensed premises to ensure compliance with the Chicago Environmental Noise Ordinance.
12. **Duty to Cooperate.** Licensee agrees that in the event the BACP or LLCC receives a complaint, Licensee shall cooperate fully with any investigation, including, but not limited to, submitting any requested records. Licensee shall cooperate with any law enforcement agency, including but not limited to the Chicago Police Department, with investigations and requests for information.
13. **Parking.** Licensee shall make its parking lot, inclusive of approximately 40 parking spaces, available for its patrons' use. Within 45 days of execution of this plan of operation, Licensee shall establish website and social media page(s), which include information to patrons and the public of locations of available parking lots and / or garages in the reasonable vicinity of the licensed premises.
14. **Security Camera(s).** If Licensee has security cameras monitoring the licensed premises, then Licensee shall be bound by the following restrictions: Licensee shall index all camera recordings by date and time. Licensee will preserve all camera recordings on Licensee's computer system for at least seven (7) days after recording. All camera recordings will be maintained on hard drives for a minimum of 72 hours from record date. All camera recordings will be stored at the licensed premises in a secure manner within in its offices, the access to which shall be limited only to authorized Licensee personnel. All camera recordings will be made immediately available to the Chicago Police Department upon request.



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15. Meetings. Licensee agrees to meet with local Aldermen, City agencies and all local community groups at their request to identify, address and resolve issues reasonably attributed to Licensee's business operations. Licensee may designate an agent, who is legally authorized to act for and on behalf of the Licensee, to attend and participate in meetings identified in this section.

16. Non-Smoking Laws. Licensee will enforce all applicable City and State non-smoking laws as they relate to both the interior and the exterior of the Premises.

The agreed conditions of this public place of amusement license are legally binding and may be enforced by City of Chicago enforcement authorities. Violation of the above stated agreed conditions may result in the imposition of a fine and/or suspension or revocation of all business licenses issued to the licensee. Violations of the above stated agreed conditions may also result in the issuance of cease and desist orders prohibiting the activity which violates the conditions of the liquor license.


The agreed conditions of the public place of amusement license shall apply to the business address and licensee and to all officers, managers, members, partners and direct or indirect owners of the entity of which is licensed. The sale of the business to other persons purchasing the stock of the licensed entity shall be subject to the same agreed conditions set forth in this plan of operation.



