



Effective June 3, 2020, all liquor sales for off-premises consumption are prohibited after 9 p.m. and all liquor sales for on-premises consumption are prohibited after 11 p.m. until further notice.

To stop the spread of COVID-19 and protect Chicago's communities, the City of Chicago has implemented the following change to the Municipal Code to discourage congregating ("gathering") inside and outside of all establishments and ensure social distancing.

Under Code Section 4-60-130, every establishment licensed under Chapter 4-60 of the Code shall:

- cease all sales of alcoholic liquor for off-premises consumption between 9 p.m. and the hour at which the licensee is permitted to resume alcoholic liquor sales.
- cease all sales of alcoholic liquor for on-premises consumption between 11 p.m. and the hour at which the licensee is permitted to resume alcoholic liquor sales.
