NOTICE OF LICENSE EXTENSION DUE TO COVID-19 OUTBREAK

Be advised that on December 16, 2020, the Chicago City Council passed Ordinance 2020-5783, a COVID-19 emergency-related measure to extend regulatory relief for businesses due to COVID-19. As part of this ordinance, licenses issued by the Department of Business Affairs and Consumer Protection (“BACP”) under Title 4 or Title 9 of the Municipal Code of Chicago (“MCC”) with an expiration date between March 15, 2020, and June 15, 2021 will hereby be considered active until July 15, 2021.

Note that this ordinance does not change the fee for renewal nor prorate any fees paid for renewal of a license, nor change the future renewal date of a license. Within 30 days following the repeal of the ordinance on June 15, 2021, impacted licensees will be expected to pay the full fee associated with their license in order to renew. License renewal fees can be found in Chapter 4-5 of the MCC.
