KNOW BEFORE YOU RIDE!

Taxicab Passenger Safety Tips

The Department of Business Affairs and Consumer Protection takes measures to make sure Chicagolicensed taxicabs are safe for passengers, pedestrians and drivers. Here are additional tips for passengers to know before you ride.



HAILING A TAXICAB

- Look for a City of Chicago issued medallion on the hood of the vehicle.
- A licensed Chicago taxicab number is four digits or less and matches the license plate.

ENTERING THE TAXICAB

- Enter and exit on the curbside.
- Make sure the City of Chicago issued public chauffeur license is displayed.
- Jot down the name of the driver and the taxicab's number upon entering.
- Make sure the placard, with passenger information and rates, is visible.
- Be as specific as possible as you inform driver of your destination address.
- Passengers are advised to wear seat belts.
- Look for bike riders, runners, and walkers before entering and exiting.
- Passengers traveling with children are advised to bring appropriate car seats or boosters for children.
- Passenger capacity should not exceed vehicle manufacturer seating capacity – number of passengers should equal the number of seat belts.
- Cab drivers are not allowed to use electronic mobile devices or wear ear buds while driving.

PAYING FOR A TAXICAB

- Portable, mobile credit card payment gadgets are not approved devices for accepting and processing taxicab fare payment.
- City of Chicago licensed taxicabs have mounted, fully-functional credit card payment system equipment capable of accepting and processing credit/debit cards.
- There is no minimum fare imposed for a passenger to pay by credit card.
- Double check ALL credit/debit transactions for the dollar amount being charged before signing authorizing payment.
