PUBLIC VEHICLE & CHAUFFEUR LICENSING UPDATES

► Follow social distancing protocols, minimize exposure to others, and avoid traveling and driving and to make an in-person trip by e-mailing questions or comments to BACPPV@CITYOFCHICAGO.ORG.

II. NOTICE OF LICENSE EXTENSION DUE TO COVID-19

All public chauffeur and public vehicles licenses which are active and in good standing and expired between March 15, 2020 and September 30, 2020, will not be considered expired until October 30, 2020.

► Licenses must be paid for in full before issued.

► Any public passenger vehicle or public chauffeur license OR Taxicab medallion licenses expiring **before March 15, 2020**, are considered **expired now.**

III. RENEW ANY EXPIRED LICENSE VIA E-MAIL

► Renewal by email continues. You are encouraged to renew by email due to social distancing restrictions in place at the Ogden office.

► E-mail your license documents to <u>BACPPV@cityofchicago.org</u> to begin the license renewal process.

IV. <u>RESOLVE "VIOLATION" LICENSE STATUS</u>

- The City of Chicago Data Portal at data.cityofchicago.org is updated daily with the current license status of each public passenger vehicle and public chauffeur license.
- The two most common reasons for a license to be in "VIOLATION" status are: (1) expired license and (2) failure to have proof of current insurance filed with BACP.
- A license in "VIOLATION" status is not in compliance with City laws and may not operate as long as the license remains listed in "VIOLATION" status.
- Email <u>BACPPV@cityofchicago.org</u> to resolve a "VIOLATION" status by (1) renewing the license via e-mail and/or (2) submitting proof of insurance.

V. <u>TO "UN-SURRENDER" PUBLIC VEHICLE LICENSE</u>

► A license in "SURRENDER" status may not operate.

- ► E-mail <u>BACPPV@cityofchicago.org</u> to initiate a "un-surrender".
 - A request to "un-surrender" a license must be supported by proof of current mandated insurance.
 - A request to "un-surrender" will be processed if the license is current.
 - The taxicab will be scheduled for an inspection upon activation.

VI. <u>CAUTIOUS REOPENING OF BACP PUBLIC VEHICLE FACILITIES:</u> 2350 W. Ogden and 2420 W. Pershing (39th Street)

The BACP Public Vehicle Ogden office and 39th Street vehicle inspection facility are reopened to the public. Visitors to BACP facilities are required to wear face coverings and maintain six feet of social distancing while in the facility. Visitors are encouraged to bring their own pen and frequently use hand sanitizers stations while at the facilities.

Visitors to the facility at 2350 W. Ogden Avenue will undergo a symptom screening, including a temperature check, before entering the facility.

Once the building reaches social distancing occupancy limits, visitors are expected to wait outside the building. Please dress appropriately for inclement weather.
