IMPORTANT WAV TAXICAB DRIVER LEASE SUBSIDY INFORMATION

WAV (wheelchair accessible vehicle) taxicab lease drivers should keep current on the information posted at BACP's WAV Taxicab webpage at chicago.gov/bacp. Failure to comply with BACP's protocols and deadlines may result in the denial of subsidy requests.

Download the NEW subsidy/reimbursement form posted at <u>chicago.gov/bacp</u>.

As a reminder, effective February 1, 2021, WAV Taxicab Driver lease subsidies must be submitted **no later than 6 months from the lease date** to be eligible for funding. Example: May 2021 leases must be submitted no later than November 2021. Consequently, BACP will no longer accept lease subsidy reimbursements for leases dated prior to January 1, 2020.

WAV VEHICLE LEASE SUBSIDIES

Lease agreements entered into on or after April 6, 2020, qualify for the following incentive amounts.

- **\$25** subsidy reimbursement for eligible WAV taxicab drivers per 12-hour lease agreement of a WAV taxicab vehicle.
- **\$50** subsidy reimbursement for eligible WAV taxicab drivers per 24-hour lease agreement of a WAV taxicab vehicle.
- Subsidy requests for WAV taxicab lease agreements entered prior to April 6, 2020, will be eligible for the previous \$15/12 hour lease and previous \$30/24 hour lease incentives.

Qualifications for WAV Lease Subsidy

This subsidy is limited to taxi chauffeurs who PAY MONEY to lease WAV taxis. Applicants must meet all criteria to qualify for the WAV lease subsidy including:

(1) must be an active participant and in good standing with the City of Chicago Centralized WAV Taxi Dispatch Service

(2) must complete a minimum of 1 trip per day leased (for daily leases) or 7 trips per calendar week (for weekly leases);

(3)) must be in compliance with all City of Chicago laws, including City of Chicago debt compliance; and

(4) has not received or his/her spouse, parent or child has not received, any funds for the purchase of a WAV taxi or WAV taxi maintenance reimbursement funds as individuals or as officers/owners on behalf of a taxicab medallion license holder.

*BACP will review dispatch and trip acceptance and rejection data provided by the Centralized WAV Taxi Dispatch Service in evaluating if a WAV cab driver or WAV cab is "<u>actively</u> <u>participating and responding</u>".
