<u>Federal Law Requires Masks Be</u> Worn in Public Vehicles

The Center for Diseases Control (CDC) continues to require ALL PERSONS in a public transportation conveyance to wear masks/face covering while inside the vehicle. Click here for the Federal mandate.

The Federal definition of a "<u>public</u> <u>transportation conveyance</u>" includes airplanes, trains, subways, buses, taxis, ride-hail, <u>maritime transportation</u>, trolleys, and cable cars.



Chauffeurs and passengers must continue to wear masks/face coverings while inside a public passenger vehicle (taxi, ride-hail, livery, charter bus, enclosed boat area, etc.).

Recipients of COVID-19 vaccinations are not exempt from wearing face coverings as required.
