STEPS TO ENSURE COMPLIANCE FOR ALL EXPIRED PUBLIC VEHICLE & PUBLIC CHAUFFEUR LICENSES

Expired Public Vehicle licenses are not permitted to operate for hire. Public Vehicle

license holders who have not renewed for the current licensing term must;

- (1) Surrender any expired public passenger vehicle license to BACP, OR
- (2) Complete license renewal for current license term.
- Any Public Vehicle license operating in expired, or violation status may be subject to enforcement action including citations, license/medallion confiscation, vehicle impoundment and/or revocation.
- > It is illegal to operate without a current license.

VERIFY LICENSE STATUS AND NEXT STEPS:

- 1.) Check the <u>license status and information</u> of your license at the City of Chicago open data portal at <u>data.cityofchicago.org</u>.
- 2.) If status is expired or in violation, review the license renewal information and checklist at the BACP Web site (<u>chicago.gov/bacp</u>):
 - Renewal applications are available for download.
 - View dates and times of scheduled taxicab, livery, and ambulance vehicle inspections.
- 3.) Resolve outstanding debt (ground tax, WAV fees) by contacting the Dept. of Finance at <u>revenuedatabase@cityofchicago.org</u> or 312-747-4747. The Department of Finance web site is <u>cityofchicago.org/finance</u> and can be used to identify outstanding tickets, fees, and taxes.
- 4.) Visit <u>ilsos.gov</u>
 - For business licenses: Verify company is in good standing with the Illinois Secretary of State's Web by performing a Corporation/LLC Search
 - For chauffeur licenses: Obtain your MVR Court Purposes and Supervision abstracts for a small fee.
- 5.) Email <u>BACPPV@cityofchicago.org</u> to request forms or ask questions. You may also submit completed renewal applications with required supporting documentation.

The BACP Public Vehicle Licensing Facility is open to the public. Arrive before 2pm to ensure same day service.
