




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

Mission

The Department of Buildings enhances safety and quality of life for Chicago's residents and visitors through permitting, inspections, trade licensing, and enforcement of the *Chicago Construction Codes*.

What inspections are required?

- Chapter 5 of the Chicago Construction Codes Administrative Provisions govern permit-related inspections
- It is the responsibility of the permit holder to request inspections when the work is ready
- If rough inspections are not passed, an inspector may require walls to be opened or work exposed for inspection

CHAPTER 14A-5
INSPECTION AND OBSERVATION OF PERMITTED WORK

14A-5-501
GENERAL

Added Coun. J. 4-10-19, p. 100029.

14A-5-501.1 Scope. All work for which a permit is required by the Chicago Construction Codes is subject to inspection by the building official in accordance with this chapter.

14A-5-501.1.1 Special inspections. Certain types of construction work must have special inspections completed by special inspectors in accordance with Chapter 17 of the Chicago Building Code.

14A-5-501.2 Visibility for inspection. It is the duty of the owner to cause work that requires a permit to remain visible and able to be accessed for inspection purposes until inspected. Neither the building official nor the City will be liable for any expense entailed in the removal or replacement of any material required to allow inspection of work done pursuant to or without a required permit.

14A-5-501.3 Authority of inspectors. Inspectors do not have authority to approve conditions that violate the Chicago Construction Codes or other City ordinances. Inspection results or comments purporting to approve a violation of or cancel a provision of the Chicago Construction Codes or other City ordinances are invalid.

14A-5-501.4 Reinspection fee. Where the building official is required to conduct more than one inspection of the same premises for the same purpose under the same permit because the previous inspection resulted in a finding of non-compliance with a provision of the Chicago Construction Codes or because the previous inspection could not be completed because the inspector was not provided full access to the premises, the building official is directed to charge a reinspection fee as set forth in Section 14A-12-1205.1.

Exception: The building official may not charge a reinspection fee where the subsequent inspection is due to an error made by the City.

14A-5-501.5 Extra inspections. Where an inspection of permitted work is specially requested by the owner or required due to inaccurate or incorrect information on the permit application, faulty construction or installation, or the failure to make necessary repairs, the building official is directed to charge an extra inspection fee as set forth in Section 14A-12-1205.1.

14A-5-502
REGULAR INSPECTIONS

provide access to and means for inspections of such work that are required by this section.

14A-5-502.2 Boiler and pressure vessel inspections. The holder of a boiler or pressure vessel permit must notify the building official when the device installed under the permit is ready for inspection. It is unlawful for any person to use any boiler or tank or tanks subject to pressure, other than the pressure in the city water mains, before the building official has issued a certificate stating that the boiler or tank may be safely used. This certificate must be framed and hung in a conspicuous place in the same room as the equipment.

14A-5-502.3 Construction inspections. The permit holder must notify the building official when work done pursuant to a permit is ready for the types of inspections listed in Sections 14A-5-502.3.1 through 14A-5-502.3.5. Upon notification, the building official is directed to cause the inspections to be made or otherwise verify ongoing compliance with the Chicago Construction Codes and allow the work to proceed.

14A-5-502.3.1 Footing and foundation inspection. Footing and foundation inspections must be requested after excavations for footings are complete and any required reinforcing steel is in place. For concrete foundations, any required forms must be in place and materials for the foundation must be on the site before inspection.

Exception: Where concrete is ready-mixed in accordance with Chapter 19 of the Chicago Building Code, the concrete need not be on site before inspection.

Editor's Note—At the discretion of the editor, the word "for" in the second sentence has been set ordinary type, although it appears in italics in the Coun. J. 4-10-19, p. 100029, Art. 1. "For" is not a defined term. Future legislation will correct this provision if needed.

14A-5-502.3.2 Concrete slab and under-floor inspection. Concrete slab and under-floor inspections must be requested after in-slab or under-floor reinforcing steel and building service equipment, conduit, piping, accessories, and other ancillary equipment items are in place, but before any concrete is placed or floor sheathing installed, including the subfloor.

14A-5-502.3.3 Framing inspections. Framing inspections must be requested after the roof deck or sheathing, framing, fire-blocking, and bracing are in place and pipes, chimneys, and vents to be concealed are complete and the rough electrical, plumbing, heating systems' wires, pipes, and ducts have been inspected.

Technical Inspection Bureaus

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New Construction Bureau

New Construction inspections (building permits for both new buildings and building alterations) include:

- Architecture
- Excavation & Foundations
- Framing
- Masonry



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New Construction Bureau (continued)

New Construction inspectors:

- Verify that the scope of work matches the approved permit drawings
- Verify that the general contractor and mason performing work are licensed and listed on the building permit
- Respond to 311 citizen complaints for working without a building permit and working beyond the scope of the building permit

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Electrical Bureau

Electrical inspections include:

- New construction, alteration and repair permits
 - Distribution & wiring
 - Emergency Lighting & Fire Alarms
 - Power & devices
 - Signage
- Signs and generators are inspected annually
- BACP License Task Force



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Electrical Bureau (continued)

Electrical inspectors:

- Verify that the scope of work matches the approved permit drawings
- Verify that the contractors performing work are licensed and listed on the building permit
- Respond to 311 citizen complaints

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Ventilation Bureau

Ventilation inspections include:

- New construction, alteration and repair permits
 - Ventilation & furnace equipment & distribution
- Annual equipment inspections for high-rise & commercial buildings

Ventilation inspectors:

- Verify that the scope of work matches the approved permit drawings
- Verify that the contractors performing work are licensed and listed on the building permit (*if required*)
- Respond to 311 citizen complaints

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Refrigeration Bureau

Refrigeration inspections include:

- New construction, alteration and repair permits
 - Refrigeration systems
 - Air conditioning units
- Annual equipment inspections

- Verify that the contractors performing work are licensed and listed on the building permit (*if required*)
- Respond to 311 citizen complaints

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Plumbing Bureau

Plumbing inspections include:

- New construction, alteration and repair permits
 - Underground plumbing
 - Rough plumbing
 - Supply piping and connections
 - Waste piping and connections
 - Distribution
 - Fixtures
- BACP License Task Force



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Plumbing Bureau (continued)

DOB Plumbing inspectors:

- Verify that the scope of work matches the approved permit drawings
- Verify that the contractors and workers performing work are licensed and listed on the building permit
- Respond to 311 citizen complaints




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Boiler Bureau

Boiler inspections are performed for all buildings except residential buildings with less than 4 dwelling units and include the following:

- Inspections for new construction, modernization and repair permits
 - Boilers used for generating heat or power and all pressure vessels
- Verify that the scope of work matches the approved permit drawings
- Annual equipment inspections
- Respond to 311 citizen complaints
- Building permit inspections are requested online at www.cityofchicago.org/buildings




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Iron Bureau

Iron inspections include:

- New construction, alteration and repair permits
 - Structural steel
 - Structural reinforcement bar
 - Water tanks
 - Scaffold
 - Marquees
 - Canopies
 - Fire escapes
 - Balconies
- Iron Hoist Inspection



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Iron Bureau (continued)

Iron inspectors:

- Verify that the scope of work matches the approved permit drawings
- Respond to 311 citizen complaints

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Elevator Bureau

Elevator inspections include:

- Inspections for new construction, modernization and repair permits
 - Passenger & freight elevators
 - Platform lifts
 - Stage lifts
 - Escalators
 - Window washing rigs
 - Amusement rides



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Elevator Bureau (continued)

Elevator inspectors:

- Verify that the scope of work matches the approved permit drawings
- Verify that the contractors performing work are licensed and listed on the building permit
- Accident investigation
- Annual equipment inspections
- Respond to 311 citizen complaints

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Construction Equipment Bureau

Construction Equipment inspections include:

- New construction, alterations & wrecking permits
 - Construction Cranes
 - Heavy Construction Equipment
- Periodic crane & heavy equipment inspections



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Construction Equipment Bureau (continued)

Construction Equipment inspectors:

- Verify that the cranes are erected & reconfigured according to the approved plans
- Verify that the crane company and operator on site hold valid licenses
- Respond to 311 citizen complaints

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Certificate of Occupancy Inspections

Certificate of Occupancy team inspections are performed from construction start to finish for the following building permit types:

New construction with any of the following:

- Residential buildings with 4+ dwelling units
- Non-residential buildings 10,000 sq.ft. and greater
- Institutional or Assembly occupancy types

Building rehabilitation with any of the following:

- Residential buildings with 4+ dwelling units & more than one subcontractor
- Change of Occupancy
- Non-residential buildings 10,000 sq.ft. and greater
- Institutional or Assembly occupancy types

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Certificate of Occupancy Inspections (continued)

Certificate of Occupancy team inspections include the following (additional bureaus are included as required):

- New Construction
 - Architecture, excavation, foundations & masonry
 - Ventilation
 - Department of Zoning
 - Fire Department
- Electrical
- Plumbing
- Verify that the scope of work matches the approved permit drawings
- Verify that the contractors performing work are licensed and listed on the building permit
- Building permit inspections are requested online at www.cityofchicago.org/buildings

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Conservation Inspections

Conservation Inspections include:

- Annual maintenance inspections on existing buildings
 - Exterior walls, parapets, overhangs
 - Windows, doors, gutters, downspouts & roof
 - Porches & fences
 - Interior walls & ceilings
 - Carbon monoxide & smoke detectors
 - Excludes single family homes & 3 story residential buildings without a basement dwelling unit



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Conservation Inspections (continued)

- Alteration permits inspected by Conservation Bureau:
 - Exterior wall repair
 - Porch repair & replacement
 - Deconversion of illegal dwelling units
- Administrative Hearings & Circuit Court reinspections
- Respond to 311 citizen complaints regarding existing buildings
- Request inspections for building permits that address building violations and the alteration permits listed above online at www.cityofchicago.org/buildings



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Special Inspections Program (SIP)

Special Inspections Program includes:

- Inspection of exit doors, exit corridors & exit stairs, exit capacity, travel distance, exit signs, emergency lighting, occupancy capacity signs & fire rated separations
- BACP License Task Force
- Liquor Licenses (new inspections)
- Public Place of Amusement License (new & annual renewal inspections)
- Single Room Occupancy License (new & renewal inspections)
- Nursing Homes (new & renewal inspections)
- Assembly Occupancies of more than 100 persons (new & annual inspections)
- Respond to 311 citizen complaints

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Troubled Buildings Initiative / Strategic Task Force (STF)

Strategic Task Force inspections are performed at the request of other departments and include:

- Inspecting buildings with drug & gang activity
- Administrative Hearings (DOAH) & Circuit Court
- Attend Police Department's CAPS Meetings
- BACP License Task Force

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
Vacant and Abandoned Buildings

Vacant & Abandoned Buildings inspections include:

- Inspection of vacant buildings and open garages
- Inspection of fire damaged buildings
- Fast Track Demolition Process inspections
- Circuit Court Demolition Process inspections
- Process demolition bids for abandoned buildings and authorize wrecking contractor start
- Manage the registration of vacant buildings
- Respond to 311 citizen complaints
