



## SOURCES OF FAIR HOUSING TRAINING

Listed below are several organizations which offer training about fair housing laws, compliance, and enforcement. Their training programs are supported in part by the City of Chicago Department of Housing and Economic Development. The organizations may charge a fee for training.

This list is offered as a starting point for those interested in fair housing training. Parties in housing discrimination cases may wish to incorporate fair housing training into the terms of a settlement agreement or to propose such training as injunctive relief. Housing providers may wish to educate their personnel about compliance with laws prohibiting housing discrimination. Community organizations may wish to learn about the protections of fair housing laws and how to proceed if possible discrimination is identified.

These are not necessarily the only sources of fair housing training. The Commission on Human Relations does not fund any organization listed and does not exercise any oversight of training the organization may offer. These listings are not an endorsement or guarantee of service.
