• Officer Crystal Rivera:

Fatally shot on June 5, 2025; mother, age 36, with four years of service. Wake held on the day of the meeting; funeral scheduled for June 26.

• Officer Malissa Tores (18th District):

Recently passed from self-inflicted injury; honored by the council.

Approval of Previous Minutes

May 2025 Minutes:

Motion to approve passed without opposition.

Key Discussion Topics

1. Public Comment Highlights

• Traffic & Parking Enforcement:

Ongoing illegal parking and traffic violations. Suggestions for stricter penalties and questions about handling minors involved.

• CARE Program (Mental Health Response):

Concerns about limited scope and hours; request for expansion.

• 1200 N. Dearborn (Walgreens):

Ongoing safety concerns and a lack of progress on frequent disturbances.

• Illegal Airbnb's & Galleries:

Reports of unregulated properties on Cedar Street and the surrounding areas.

• Crime Trends:

Residents requested up-to-date data to verify if crime is decreasing post-pandemic.

2. Nominating Committee Report – Robert Johnson

- Three Commissioners on CCPSA have terms expiring in 2026:
 - o Two juvenile members' terms are expiring.
 - o One other Commissioner from the North side has term expiring. .
- A long vetting and interview process is expected.
- An eight-hour preparatory meeting has already been held.

3. Retail Theft Prevention Initiatives

• Law Enforcement Collaboration:

- Over 500 felony retail theft arrests in 2 years (with Macy's & Sheriff Dart).
- o \$5M+ in recovered goods through a multi-agency task force.
- o Year-over-year:
 - Felony theft down 31%
 - Related crimes down 28%
 - Misdemeanor theft down 1% YTD; 24% decrease in past week

• Local Coordination:

- o June 26 meeting with CPD/detectives and retailers.
- o Store cooperation is essential for prosecution.

4. Non-Permitted Protests

- High protest volume in the 18th & 1st Districts; permits are often bypassed.
- Safety, economic impact, and predictability cited as concerns.
- Advocacy underway for better permit enforcement by the city.

5. Traffic Stop Policy Presentation – Commissioner Sandra Wortham (CCPSA)

• Policy Context:

- o CCPSA oversees CPD policy; traffic stops intersect with the consent decree.
- o Pretextual traffic stops are defined and debated.

• Proposed Changes from Commissioners to the CPD Draft Policy:

Restrict stops for certain non moving issues (e.g., loud music, expired stickers under 1 year).

• Consent Searches:

o Proposed moves from "consent" to "reasonable suspicion ."

Survey Results:

o 67% of 1,300 citywide respondents opposed restrictions, though results were not disclosed until a FOIA filed.

• Final Decision Pending:

Policy may fall under future consent decree oversight.

6. Community Engagement & Survey Plans

• Commissioner Wortham encouraged broader public participation.

7. Police Leadership Update – Captain Albert Perez

- **Experience:** 32 years in law enforcement; recent transfer to 18th District.
- Concerns:
 - o Youth gatherings at North Avenue Beach; groups often from outside the district.
 - o CPD plans to "shadow" groups to reduce residential disturbances.
- Curfew Enforcement:
 - o 10 PM curfew for beaches; earlier curfews require City Council approval.
- CARE Program:
 - o Shared with 19th District; limited hours (9 AM–5 PM). Expansion needed.

8. Additional Community Concerns During Police Q&A

• Walgreens/Division St.

Increased arrests, new policies, and better store cooperation are aiding prosecution.

• Illegal Airbnbs:

Police are limited to immediate incident response; broader enforcement is civil.

• Retail Theft & Drug Activity:

Shoplifting is often linked to the drug trade; businesses enabling illegal behavior may face license revocation.

• Quality of Life:

Noise, gatherings, and petty crime rose; residents were encouraged to remain engaged.

• Crime Stats:

Citywide crime was down significantly in 2025 despite reduced police staffing.
