CCPSA Feedback Form on Traffic Stops (December 17, 2024 - April 24, 2025)

1. "ID": This is a unique row ID of the response.
2. "Start Time": The datetime the form was started.
3. "Completion Time": The datetime the form was completed.
4. "Email": Email was not collected – all are "anonymous".
5. "Name": Name was not collected – all are blank.
6. "Language": The form had a drop down to view and respond to the form in English or Spanish.
7. "What are your experiences or your family's experiences with traffic stops?":
Checkbox response with the following options:
 - a. I have been pulled over by a member of the Chicago Police Department
 - b. A member of my family has been pulled over by a member of the Chicago Police Department
 - c. I have witnessed others being pulled over by a member of the Chicago Police Department in my neighborhood
 - d. I have no experience with traffic stops involving the Chicago Police Department
 - e. Other (open response field)
8. "Please provide any additional feedback or context to your experiences regarding traffic stops": Long-form, open field response.
9. "Should the Chicago Police Department be limited in the types of stops made for low level, non-moving violations?": Radio buttons with options including:
 - a. Yes
 - b. No
 - c. Other (open response field)
10. "Should CPD policy limit the stops that they make for low level, non-moving violations?": Checkbox response with the following options:
 - a. Expired license plates
 - b. Missing front license plate
 - c. A single missing or broken headlight or taillight
 - d. Items hanging from the rearview mirror
 - e. Tinted windows
 - f. Other (open response field)
11. "What else do you think should be included in a policy regarding traffic stops?":
Long-form open response field.
12. "What would you like to see CPD prioritize?": Checkboxes response with the following options:
 - a. Responding to calls for service
 - b. Walking or driving their beats
 - c. Meeting community members and attending events
 - d. Solving crimes
 - e. Moving-violation enforcement for things like speeding and DUIs
 - f. Other (open response field)

13. “What Chicago Ward do you reside in?”: Drop down with 1-50 and “I do not live in the City of Chicago”
14. “What Chicago Police District do you reside in?”: Drop down with 1-25 (excepting 13, 21, and 23) and "I do not live in the City of Chicago”.
15. “What zip code do you reside in?”: Short answer field – all redacted.
16. “How do you identify yourself?”: Check boxes with the following options:
 - a. American Indian or Alaska Native
 - b. Asian
 - c. Black or African American
 - d. Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander
 - e. White
 - f. Hispanic Non-white
 - g. Other (open response field)
17. “What is your current gender identity?”: Radio buttons, with the following options:
 - a. Woman
 - b. Man
 - c. Non-binary
 - d. Prefer not to say
18. “What is your age?”: Radio buttons with the following options:
 - a. Under 16 years
 - b. 16-25 years
 - c. 26-49 years
 - d. 50-65 years
 - e. Over 65 years
