





Population Density & Employment Density 2009







Trips From the Study Area





Transit Network Service and Coverage

- Separate fare structure and collection methods may inhibit full utilization of services



Improvement Ideas Offered By PAC Members

Need	Improvement Idea
Safety	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Improve pedestrian safety and comfort along walking routes to stations through policies to improve street conditions such as beautification and business investments • Work with law enforcement and elected officials to improve safety and security at and around rail stations/bus terminals
Travel Times	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Faster service along the following bus routes: Cottage Grove (#4), State Street (#29), King Drive (#3), 47th Street (#47), 51st Street (#51), 79th Street (restore 79th street express service)
Key Linkages	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Enhance bus service traveling east/west and connecting the Green Line and Red Line stations on 35th, 47th and 55th Streets
Customer Comfort	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Maintenance and repairs including more frequent cleaning, improved lighting, new paint, and increased seating capacity in the following locations: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Green Line: 43rd, 47th, 51st, and 55th Street stations ✓ Metra Electric Line – Lighting and seating repairs at flag stop stations south of 59th Street ✓ Increase capacity of bus shelters at busy locations • Complement maintenance repairs with pedestrian, bicycle and other enhancements to station access
Frequency of Service	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Increase frequency at Metra Electric Main Line Stations south of 59th Street during off peak hours • Add station on Metra Electric District line at 39th Street
Seamless Travel	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Create low-cost fare transferability between CTA and Metra
Knowledge of Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide more accurate and up-to-date bus and rail tracker information. • Increase information options for those without internet access.
Economically Viable Neighborhoods	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Improve types of businesses located near rail and bus stations using policy and zoning regulations in all regions of the study area
