**MINUTES [Draft]**

**Board Members Present:** President Demetrius E. Carney, Vice President Ghian Foreman (via audio conference), William F. Conlon, Michael Eaddy, Rita A. Fry, Elisa Rodriguez, and Rhoda D. Sweeney.

**Board Members Absent:** Melissa M. Ballate and Susan L. McKeever.

**Others Present:** First Deputy Superintendent of Police Alfonza Wysinger, First Assistant General Counsel to the Superintendent William E. Bazarek, Independent Police Review Authority Chief Administrator Scott M. Ando, Police Board Executive Director Max A. Caproni, Police Department command personnel, and members of the public.

President Carney called the meeting to order. He reported that Vice President Foreman is not able to attend the meeting in person and wishes to attend via audio conference. Ms. Fry moved to permit attendance via audio conference. The motion passed by a vote of 6 in favor (Carney, Conlon, Eaddy, Fry, Rodriguez, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed.

1. Rev. Eaddy moved to approve the minutes of the Board's public meeting of December 11, 2014. The motion passed by a vote of 7 in favor (Carney, Foreman, Conlon, Eaddy, Fry, Rodriguez, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed.

2. President Carney stated that the Board's schedule of regular monthly public meetings for 2015 is included in the blue books made available at the meeting and is posted on the Board's website.

3. President Carney announced that the Board's next public meeting will be at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, February 19, 2015, at Chicago Public Safety Headquarters. Ms. Fry moved to close a series of executive sessions of the Board for the purposes of considering litigation and personnel matters, as authorized by sections 2(c)(1), (3), (4), and (11) of the Illinois Open Meetings Act. The motion passed by a vote of 7 in favor (Carney, Foreman, Conlon, Eaddy, Fry, Rodriguez, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed.

4. President Carney stated that a report of disciplinary actions taken by the Board during the previous month has been made available at the meeting and on the Board's website, and he noted that the Board's written findings and decisions are posted on the website. He then announced that the Board considered disciplinary cases in a closed meeting, and that the Board will now take final action on these disciplinary matters.

- Case No. 14 PB 2852. Ms. Fry moved to find Police Officer Taric Webb not guilty of the charges that he failed to reside in the City of Chicago, and to reinstate him to his position with the Chicago Police Department. The motion passed by a vote of 5 in favor (Carney, Conlon, Fry, Rodriguez, and Sweeney) to 2 opposed (Foreman and Eaddy). Ms. Fry moved to adopt the written findings and decision and dissent that was reviewed by all Board members who participated in the case. The motion passed by a vote of 7 in favor (Carney, Foreman, Conlon, Eaddy, Fry, Rodriguez, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed.
- Case No. 14 PB 2858. Ms. Fry moved to find Police Officer Broderick Snelling not guilty of the charges related to where he actually resides in the City of Chicago, and to reinstate him to his position with the Chicago Police Department. The motion passed by a vote of 7 in favor (Carney, Foreman, Conlon, Eaddy, Fry, Rodriguez, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed. Ms. Fry moved to adopt the written findings and decision that was reviewed by all Board members who participated in the case. The motion passed by a vote of 7 in favor (Carney, Foreman, Conlon, Eaddy, Fry, Rodriguez, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed.

President Carney stated that the decisions in the above cases will be entered as of today's date and will be issued to the parties, and that a copy of the written decisions will be posted on the Board's website within ten business days pursuant to the Municipal Code of Chicago.

5. President Carney announced that the Board plans to consider revisions to its Rules of Procedure for the handling of disciplinary cases, and that a draft of the proposed revisions will be posted on the Board's website. He stated that any individual or organization wishing to comment on the proposed revisions will have an opportunity to do so at the February 19 and March 19 public meetings of the Board. He also stated that the Board will consider written comments received in the Board's office by March 31, 2015.

6. President Carney announced that copies of orders issued by the Superintendent of Police during the previous month are listed in the blue books made available at the meeting and are available on the Police Department's website.

7. President Carney noted that the next item of business is the Superintendent's report. Rev. Eaddy moved that the oral presentation be waived, and that the report be received in writing. The motion passed by a vote of 7 in favor (Carney, Foreman, Conlon, Eaddy, Fry, Rodriguez, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed.

8. President Carney called upon those members of the public who had signed up in advance to speak.

- President Carney called upon Dan Tuls and Robert More, and there was no response.

President Carney stated that all persons that had signed up in advance to speak had been called. Ms. Fry moved to adjourn the meeting. The motion passed by a vote of 7 in favor (Carney, Foreman, Conlon, Eaddy, Fry, Rodriguez, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed.

**Policy Regarding the Attendance of and Participation by  
the Public at Board Meetings**

(Adopted 15 December 2005)

The Police Board values the attendance of the public at its meetings and the opportunity to receive comments and questions on matters concerning the Board or the Police Department. The Board will treat members of the public with courtesy and respect, and expects that the public will treat Board members and Department members in a similar manner.

Toward that end, the Board has adopted the following rules governing conduct at Board meetings:

1. An individual wishing to address the Board must sign-up in advance by contacting the Board's office by phone, fax, or in person no later than 4:30 p.m. of the day before the meeting.
2. When called upon to address the Board, each speaker is to identify him/herself and speak clearly so that all in attendance may hear and so that the court reporter may make an accurate record of the proceedings.
3. Due to time constraints, each speaker is limited to two minutes and must conclude when asked to do so by the Board member acting as parliamentarian.
4. Personal attacks, obscene language, fighting words, threats, conduct intended to disrupt or interfere with the meeting, and comments not related to matters within the Board's or the Department's jurisdiction, by a speaker or any person in attendance, are strictly prohibited.

Violation of any of the above rules may result in the removal of the violator from the meeting room, or in the immediate adjournment of the meeting; in addition, repeated violations may result in the violator not being permitted to attend or participate in future Board meetings.

## **PERSONNEL AND TRAINING**

During the month of **January 2015**, **107** training blocks were conducted for Chicago Police Recruits, Metropolitan Recruits (including surrounding agencies) and In-Service Courses.

A total of **9,134** Department attendees received In-Service/E-Learning training, which included: Patrol Carbine Operator Course and Requalification, LEMART, Law Enforcement Protective Measures, Taser Qualification and Recertification, In-service Firearm Review (3.5 Hr), Striker Fired 1-Day Transition Course, Domestic Violence 4-Part Refresher, Firearms Concealed Carry Act Online Course, Contact Information System, First Amendment Online Training, Crowd Control Online Review, Hate Crime Online Training (ADL) – 3 Part Program, Hazmat Annual Refresher, Pedestrian Safety, Parking Monitor Application, Vehicle Pursuits and Balancing Test, Use of Force Policy, Gang Violence Reduction Strategy (GG 10-01).

A total of **203** Chicago Police Recruits were in training along with **71** Metropolitan Police Recruits.
