MINUTES [Draft]

Board Members Present: President Ghian Foreman, Vice President Paula Wolff, Eva-Dina Delgado, Michael Eaddy (via audio conference), Steve Flores, John P. O'Malley Jr., John H. Simpson, Rhoda D. Sweeney, and Andrea L. Zopp.

Board Members Absent: None.

Others Present: Chief of Patrol Fred Waller, General Counsel to the Superintendent Charise Valente, Civilian Office of Police Accountability Chief Administrator Sydney Roberts, Police Board Executive Director Max A. Caproni, and members of the public.

President Foreman called the meeting to order. He reported that Board Member Eaddy is unable to attend the meeting in person. Board Member Simpson moved to permit attendance via audio conference. The motion passed by a vote of 8 in favor (Foreman, Wolff, Delgado, Flores, O'Malley, Simpson, Sweeney, and Zopp) to 0 opposed.

- 1. Board Member Sweeney moved to approve the minutes of the Board's regular public meeting held on August 9, 2018. The motion passed by a vote of 9 in favor (Foreman, Wolff, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, O'Malley, Simpson, Sweeney, and Zopp) to 0 opposed.
- 2. President Foreman announced that the Board's next regular public meeting will be at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, October 11, 2018, at Chicago Public Safety Headquarters.

Board Member Simpson moved to close a series of executive sessions of the Board for the purposes of considering litigation and personnel matters, as authorized by sections 2(c)(1), (3), (4), and (11) of the Illinois Open Meetings Act. The motion passed by a vote of 9 in favor (Foreman, Wolff, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, O'Malley, Simpson, Sweeney, and Zopp) to 0 opposed.

- 3. President Foreman stated that a report of disciplinary actions taken by the Board during the previous month appears in the blue books made available at the meeting, and he noted that this report and the Board's written findings and decisions are posted on the Board's website. He then announced that the Board considered in a closed meeting two disciplinary cases, and that the Board will now take final action on these cases.
 - <u>Case No. 17 PB 2931</u>. Board Member Simpson moved to find Police Officer Michael Bergeson guilty of leaving the scene of a traffic accident while off duty and making a false report, and to discharge him from the Chicago Police Department. The motion passed by a vote of 9 in favor (Foreman, Wolff, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, O'Malley, Simpson, Sweeney, and Zopp) to 0 opposed. Board Member Flores moved to adopt the written findings and decision that have been reviewed by all Board members who participated in the case. The motion passed by a vote of 9 in favor (Foreman, Wolff, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, O'Malley, Simpson, Sweeney, and Zopp) to 0 opposed.
 - Case No. 17 PB 2930. President Foreman reported that the Superintendent filed charges to discharge Detective Cherie Hendricks from the Chicago Police Department for allegedly shoplifting and being absent without authorization, and that the Superintendent subsequently moved to withdraw the charges without prejudice because the respondent resigned from the Chicago Police Department. Board Member Sweeney moved to grant the Superintendent's motion to withdraw the charges. The motion passed by a vote of 9 in favor (Foreman, Wolff, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, O'Malley, Simpson, Sweeney, and Zopp) to 0 opposed.

President Foreman stated that the decision in the above cases will be entered as of today's date and will be issued to the parties, and that copies of the written decisions will be posted on the Board's website as required by the Municipal Code of Chicago.

President Foreman noted that there is one additional disciplinary matter to announce.

• Case No. 18 RR 04. Board Member O'Malley announced that pursuant to Section 2-78-130 of the Municipal Code of Chicago, he has considered a matter on which the Chief Administrator of the Civilian Office of Police Accountability and the Superintendent of Police did not agree regarding the discipline of a police officer. Board Member O'Malley reported that this matter involves allegations that Police Officer Kevyn Lott used excessive force and made a false statement to COPA. The Chief Administrator recommended sustaining these allegations and discharging the officer from the Chicago Police Department. The Superintendent recommended classifying these allegations as Unfounded. Board Member O'Malley reported that, in his opinion, the response of the Superintendent met the burden of overcoming the Chief Administrator's recommendation for discipline, and therefore, according to the Municipal Code, the Superintendent's recommendation will be implemented. A copy of the written opinion will be posted on the Board's website as required by the Municipal Code.

- 4. President Foreman announced that copies of the general orders and other directives issued by the Superintendent of Police during the previous month are listed in the blue books made available at the meeting and are posted on the Police Department's website.
- 5. President Foreman noted that the next item of business is the Superintendent's report. Board Member Simpson moved that the oral presentation be waived, and that the report be received in writing. The motion passed by a vote of 9 in favor (Foreman, Wolff, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, O'Malley, Simpson, Sweeney, and Zopp) to 0 opposed.
- 6. President Foreman called upon those members of the public who had signed up in advance to speak. (See the transcript of the meeting, posted on the Board's website, for a complete report of each speaker's remarks.)
 - Ellen Corley expressed her views on alleged police misconduct and corruption.
 - Robert More spoke on a variety of matters.
 - Queen Sister commented on police hiring and several other matters.
 - President Foreman called upon the following individuals and there was no response: Cynthia Miller and Pamela Hunt.

President Foreman stated that all persons who had signed up in advance to speak had been called. Board Member Simpson moved to adjourn the meeting. The motion passed by a vote of 9 in favor (Foreman, Wolff, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, O'Malley, Simpson, Sweeney, and Zopp) to 0 opposed, and President Foreman announced that the meeting is adjourned.

POLICE BOARD CITY OF CHICAGO

Policy Regarding the Attendance of and Participation by the Public at Board Meetings

(Adopted 15 December 2005)

The Police Board values the attendance of the public at its meetings and the opportunity to receive comments and questions on matters concerning the Board or the Police Department. The Board will treat members of the public with courtesy and respect, and expects that the public will treat Board members and Department members in a similar manner.

Toward that end, the Board has adopted the following rules governing conduct at Board meetings:

- 1. An individual wishing to address the Board must sign-up in advance by contacting the Board's office by phone, fax, or in person no later than 4:30 p.m. of the day before the meeting.
- 2. When called upon to address the Board, each speaker is to identify him/herself and speak clearly so that all in attendance may hear and so that the court reporter may make an accurate record of the proceedings.
- 3. Due to time constraints, each speaker is limited to two minutes and must conclude when asked to do so by the Board member acting as parliamentarian.
- 4. Personal attacks, obscene language, fighting words, threats, conduct intended to disrupt or interfere with the meeting, and comments not related to matters within the Board's or the Department's jurisdiction, by a speaker or any person in attendance, are strictly prohibited.

Violation of any of the above rules may result in the removal of the violator from the meeting room, or in the immediate adjournment of the meeting; in addition, repeated violations may result in the violator not being permitted to attend or participate in future Board meetings.

PERSONNEL AND TRAINING

During the month of **September 2018**, **138** training blocks were conducted for Chicago Police Recruits, Metropolitan Recruits (including surrounding agencies) and In-Service Courses.

A total of **19,144** Department attendees received In-Service/E-Learning training, which included: Body Worn Camera, LEMART In-Service and Refresher CPR, Prescribed and Aux/Alt Weapons Qualifications, Procedural Justice and Legitimacy II, Decentralized Training Unit-Roll Call Training, POWER Test, Patrol Carbine Requalification A, Force Mitigation, DUI Paperwork for Police Officers and Supervisors, TASER Qualifications and Use of Force Refresher.

A total of **737 Chicago Police Recruits** were in training along with **28 Metropolitan** Police Recruits.
