MINUTES [Draft]

Board Members Present: President Lori E. Lightfoot, Vice President Ghian Foreman, Eva-Dina Delgado, Michael Eaddy, Steve Flores, John P. O'Malley Jr. (via audio conference), John H. Simpson (via audio conference), and Rhoda D. Sweeney.

Board Members Absent: None.

Others Present: First Deputy Superintendent of Police Kevin Navarro, General Counsel to the Superintendent Charise Valente, Civilian Office of Police Accountability Interim Chief Administrator Patricia Banks, Police Board Executive Director Max A. Caproni, and members of the public.

President Lightfoot called the meeting to order. She reported that Mr. O'Malley and Mr. Simpson are unable to attend the meeting in person. Vice President Foreman moved to permit attendance via audio conference. The motion passed by a vote of 6 in favor (Lightfoot, Foreman, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed.

- 1. Vice President Foreman moved to approve the minutes of the Board's regular public meeting held on October 19, 2017. The motion passed by a vote of 8 in favor (Lightfoot, Foreman, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, O'Malley, Simpson, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed.
- 2. President Lightfoot announced that the Board's next regular public meeting will be at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, December 14, 2017, at Chicago Public Safety Headquarters.

Vice President Foreman moved to close a series of executive sessions of the Board for the purposes of considering litigation and personnel matters, as authorized by sections 2(c)(1), (3), (4), and (11) of the Illinois Open Meetings Act. The motion passed by a vote of 8 in favor (Lightfoot, Foreman, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, O'Malley, Simpson, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed.

- 3. President Lightfoot stated that a report of disciplinary actions taken by the Board during the previous month appears in the blue books made available at the meeting, and she noted that this report and the Board's written findings and decisions are posted on the Board's website. She then announced that the Board considered in a closed meeting one disciplinary case, and that the Board will now take final action on this case.
 - Case No. 17 PB 2926. Mr. Flores moved to find Police Officer Daniel Smith not guilty of use of using deadly force without justification. The motion passed by a vote of 3 in favor (Flores, O'Malley, and Simpson) to 2 opposed (Lightfoot and Eaddy). Mr. Flores moved to adopt the written findings and decision and dissent that have been reviewed by all Board members who participated in the case. The motion passed by a vote of 5 in favor (Lightfoot, Eaddy, Flores, O'Malley, and Simpson) to 0 opposed. (Board Members Delgado, Foreman, and Sweeney recused themselves from this case pursuant to §2-57-060(c) of the Municipal Code of Chicago.)

President Lightfoot stated that the decision in the above case will be entered as of today's date and will be issued to the parties, and that a copy of the written decision will be posted on the Board's website within ten business days pursuant to the Municipal Code of Chicago.

President Lightfoot noted that there is one additional disciplinary matter to announce.

- Case No. 17 RR 07. Mr. Flores announced that pursuant to Section 2-78-130 of the Municipal Code of Chicago, he has considered a matter on which the Chief Administrator of the Independent Police Review Authority and the Superintendent of Police did not agree regarding the discipline of a police officer. Mr. Flores reported that this matter involves allegations that Police Officer Brandon Ternand used excessive and unwarranted force when he shot Mr. Dakota Bright. The Chief Administrator recommended sustaining these allegations and discharging the officer from the Chicago Police Department. The Superintendent did not concur with this recommendation, stating that the officer's actions were justified. Mr. Flores reported that, in his opinion, the response of the Superintendent did not meet the burden of overcoming the Chief Administrator's recommendation for discipline, and therefore the Chief Administrator's recommendation is deemed accepted by the Superintendent. A copy of the written opinion will be posted on the Board's website as required by the Municipal Code.
- 4. President Lightfoot announced that copies of the general orders and other directives issued by the Superintendent of Police during the previous month are listed in the blue books made available at the meeting and are accessible on the Police Department's website.
- 5. President Lightfoot noted that the next item of business is the Superintendent's report. First Deputy Superintendent Navarro reported that the Department is working hard to strengthen the trust of the community and work on reforms. He also discussed reductions in crime and shootings in Englewood, and addressed allegations resulting from the State's Attorney's review

of criminal cases. (See the transcript of the meeting, posted on the Board's website, for a complete report of First Deputy Superintendent Navarro's remarks.)

- 6. President Lightfoot called upon those members of the public who had signed up in advance to speak. (See the transcript of the meeting, posted on the Board's website, for a complete report of each speaker's remarks.)
 - President Lightfoot called upon the following individuals and there was no response: Ellen Lewis, Ellen Corely, Sarah Ortiz, Crista Noel, Pamela Hunt, and Queen Sister.
 - George Blakemore spoke about several matters.
 - President Lightfoot called on Martin Preib, who passed on the opportunity to speak.
 - Robert More spoke about a variety of matters.

President Lightfoot stated that all persons who had signed up in advance to speak had been called. Vice President Foreman moved to adjourn the meeting. The motion passed by a vote of 8 in favor (Lightfoot, Foreman, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, O'Malley, Simpson, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed, and President Lightfoot announced that the meeting is adjourned.

Policy Regarding the Attendance of and Participation by the Public at Board Meetings

(Adopted 15 December 2005)

The Police Board values the attendance of the public at its meetings and the opportunity to receive comments and questions on matters concerning the Board or the Police Department. The Board will treat members of the public with courtesy and respect, and expects that the public will treat Board members and Department members in a similar manner.

Toward that end, the Board has adopted the following rules governing conduct at Board meetings:

- 1. An individual wishing to address the Board must sign-up in advance by contacting the Board's office by phone, fax, or in person no later than 4:30 p.m. of the day before the meeting.
- 2. When called upon to address the Board, each speaker is to identify him/herself and speak clearly so that all in attendance may hear and so that the court reporter may make an accurate record of the proceedings.
- 3. Due to time constraints, each speaker is limited to two minutes and must conclude when asked to do so by the Board member acting as parliamentarian.
- 4. Personal attacks, obscene language, fighting words, threats, conduct intended to disrupt or interfere with the meeting, and comments not related to matters within the Board's or the Department's jurisdiction, by a speaker or any person in attendance, are strictly prohibited.

Violation of any of the above rules may result in the removal of the violator from the meeting room, or in the immediate adjournment of the meeting; in addition, repeated violations may result in the violator not being permitted to attend or participate in future Board meetings.

PERSONNEL AND TRAINING

During the month of **November 2017**, **132** training blocks were conducted for Chicago Police Recruits, Metropolitan Recruits (including surrounding agencies) and In-Service Courses.

A total of **21,129** Department attendees received In-Service/E-Learning training, which included: Body Worn Camera, LEMART, Prescribed Weapons Qualifications, Procedural Justice and Legitimacy 1 and 2, Force Mitigation, CIT, Power Test Annual Fitness Incentive, Patrol Carbine Requalification A/ Operator Course/ Instructor Course/ Zeroing Course, TASER Qualification and Re-Certification/ Repairs, Firearms Concealed Carry Act Online Course, Body Warn Cameras, Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA), Command Staff ASI Workshop, Driving Unit In-Service, FBI Task Force Tactical Room Entry, Officer Involved Shooting, Directives: September 2017, Domestic Violence 4-Part Refresher, Use of Force 4 Hour Post-Classroom Requirements, Occupational Exposure to Disease – 2017 Refresher, Public Safety Investigation Instructions and In Car Camera Systems 2015.

A total of 655 Chicago Police Recruits were in training along with 26 Metropolitan Police Recruits.
