1 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: It's 7:30. My name is
2 Ghian Foreman. I am the president of the
3 Chicago Police Board, and I am calling the
4 Board's March 19th public meeting to order.

5 To protect the public's health in
6 response to the COVID-19 outbreak, and as
7 permitted by Governor Pritzker's Executive
8 Order 2020-07, Section 6, this meeting is
9 taking place entirely via audio conference.
10 This conference call is open to the public.

11 At this time, I ask members of
12 the public to place their phones on mute so
13 that we can cut down on background noise.
14 Throughout this call, I will also be able to
15 mute everyone on the call so that we can
16 minimize noise. I will let you know when I am
17 muting and unmuting all participants but
18 myself. I will now mute participants now.

19 We have a court reporter on the
20 phone so that we can have a transcript of this
21 call. We are also recording this call.
22 Because we are on the phone, I will take
23 attendance so we know who is participating on
24 this call. I will begin by reading the names

1 of the Board members. If you are on the call,
2 please say here.

3 I have now unmuted the Board so
4 they can -- so we can take attendance and other
5 business. Police Board Vice President Paula
6 Wolff.

7 VICE PRESIDENT WOLFF: Here.

8 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Police Board member
9 Matthew Crawl.

10 BOARD MEMBER CROWL: Here.

11 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Police Board member
12 Michael Eaddy.

13 BOARD MEMBER EADDY: Here.

14 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Police Board member
15 Steve Flores.

16 BOARD MEMBER FLORES: Here.

11 INTERIM SUPERINTENDENT BECK: Here.

12 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: General Counsel to the
13 Superintendent Dana O'Malley.

14 MS. O'MALLEY: Here.

15 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Chief Administrator of
16 the Civilian Office of Police Accountability
17 Sidney Roberts.

18 MS. ROBERTS: Here.

19 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Chief of the Chicago
20 Police Department Bureau of Internal Affairs
21 Karen Konow.

22 MS. KONOW: Yes, I'm here.

23 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Thank you.

24 Deputy Inspector General for

1 Public Safety Joseph Lipari.

2 MR. LIPARI: Here.

3 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Executive Director of
4 Police Board Max Caproni.

5 MR. CAPRONI: I'm here.

6 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: We will now proceed to
7 the items on the meeting agenda. We will have
8 time at the end of this call for public
9 comments. Until then, I ask all members of the
10 public not to comment and to keep your phones
11 on mute to reduce background noise.

12 First I will ask for a motion to
13 approve the minutes of the February 20th public
14 meeting.

15 BOARD MEMBER MOTES: So moved.

16 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Can you please identify
17 yourself when making a motion or second.

18 BOARD MEMBER MONTES: Jorge Montes. So
19 moved.

20 BOARD MEMBER EADDY: Reverend Eaddy.
21 Second.

22 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: All in favor?

23 (CHORUS OF AYES.)

24 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Any opposed?

1 (NO RESPONSE.)

2 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Any abstentions?

3 (NO RESPONSE).

4 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Motion passes.

5 The next regular public meeting
6 will be held Thursday, April 16th, at 7:30 p.m.

7 Obviously, we will take into
8 consideration at that point in time any special
9 considerations we need to take as a result of
10 social distancing, and we will indicate through
11 the Board's website whether it will be held in
12 person or conference call.

13 Is there a motion to close a
14 series of executive sessions for purposes of
15 considering personnel matters and litigation,
16 as authorized by Sections 2(c)(1), (3), (4) and
17 (11) of the Illinois Open Meetings Act?

18 VICE PRESIDENT WOLFF: This is Paula Wolff.
19 I would like to move that motion.

20 BOARD MEMBER EADDY: This is Michael Eaddy.
21 Second.

22 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: All in favor, please
23 say aye.

24 (CHORUS OF AYES.)

1 Superintendent during the previous month are
2 listed in the blue books and posted on the
3 Police Department's website.

4 Superintendent Beck, or designee,
5 is there an oral report that you would like to
6 provide?

7 INTERIM SUPERINTENDENT BECK: Yes. Just a
8 couple of things that the Department has done
9 due to the Coronavirus outbreak in Chicago. We
10 have put all visible, sworn personnel in
11 uniform. We cancelled all our in-service and
12 recruit training and returned those
13 people -- put those people into the field, in
14 particular who are doing non-law enforcement
15 functions in the districts or within
16 headquarters. We've staffed our medical
17 section staff 24/7. We even invite members --
18 people allowed to work from home, some
19 non-sworn or at-risk sworn personnel. We
20 closed all the department work-out gym
21 facilities. We've taken headquarters' staff
22 both that work in the main headquarters and put
23 most of them in the field. That's over a
24 hundred individuals. We've given direction to

1 members of the CPD to limit the booking of
2 misdemeanor suspects and to use citation
3 techniques whenever possible.

4 We limited the amount of
5 citations given, both traffic and parking, that
6 are not public safety issues.

7 We're dispensing some protective
8 equipment to the districts in order to keep our
9 officers as safe as we can. We've also
10 increased frequency of station lockup cleanings
11 for the personnel. And this morning we have
12 our first member as a confirmed individual with
13 COVID-19. And we have taken steps to ensure
14 that the contact -- the contacted members of
15 the organization are aware and are taking the
16 precautions that they need to to remain
17 healthy. That concludes my report.

18 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Thank you very much,
19 Superintendent. I will now -- members of the
20 Board are now going to take final action for
21 some of the disciplinary cases.

22 The Board as authorized by The
23 Open Meetings Act has considered in a closed
24 meeting two disciplinary cases.

1 The Board will now take final
2 action on these cases. Regarding case number
3 18 PB 2949, is there a motion to find Police
4 Officers Michael Coughlin and Jose Torres
5 guilty of using deadly force in violation of
6 the Police Department's rules and policy and
7 guilty of other charges and to discharge each
8 respondent from the Chicago Police Department?

9 VICE PRESIDENT WOLFF: This is Paula Wolff.
10 So moved.

11 BOARD MEMBER EADDY: Reverend Eaddy.
12 Second.

13 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: I will now call on the
14 members of the Board for their votes.

15 Wolff?

16 VICE PRESIDENT WOLFF: Aye.

17 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Crawl?

18 BOARD MEMBER CROWL: Aye.

19 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Eaddy?

20 BOARD MEMBER EADDY: Aye.

21 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Flores?

22 BOARD MEMBER FLORES: Aye.

23 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Montes?

24 BOARD MEMBER MONTES: I abstain. I did not

1 participate in this case.

2 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: O'Malley?

3 BOARD MEMBER O'MALLEY: Aye.

4 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Sweeney?

5 BOARD MEMBER SWEENEY: Aye.

6 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Zopp?

7 BOARD MEMBER ZOPP: Aye.

8 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: And I also vote in
9 favor of the motion.

10 Voting in favor are Board Members
11 Wolff, Crawl, Eaddy, Flores, O'Malley, Sweeney,
12 Zopp and myself. The motion passes. As
13 stated, Board Member Montes did not participate
14 in this case.

15 Is there a motion to adopt the
16 written findings and decisions that have been
17 reviewed by all Board members who participated
18 in the case?

19 VICE PRESIDENT WOLFF: This is Paula Wolff.
20 So moved.

21 BOARD MEMBER EADDY: Reverend Eaddy.
22 Second.

23 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: All in favor by saying
24 aye.

1 (CHORUS OF AYES.)

2 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Any opposed?

3 (NO RESPONSE.)

4 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Any abstentions?

5 (NO RESPONSE.)

6 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: The motion passes.

7 Regarding case number 19 PB 2960,
8 is there a motion to find Police Officer
9 Ediberto Diaz guilty of discharging a firearm
10 while intoxicated and off duty and guilty of
11 other charges and to discharge him from the
12 Chicago Police Department?

13 BOARD MEMBER MONTES: This is Jorge Montes.
14 So moved.

15 BOARD MEMBER EADDY: Reverend Eaddy.
16 Second.

17 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: I will now call on the
18 members of the Board for their votes. Wolff?

19 VICE PRESIDENT WOLFF: I abstain. I did
20 not participate in the case.

21 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Crawl?

22 BOARD MEMBER CROWL: I also abstain. I did
23 not participate in the case.

24 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Eaddy?

1 BOARD MEMBER EADDY: Aye.

2 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Flores?

3 BOARD MEMBER FLORES: Aye.

4 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Montes?

5 BOARD MEMBER MONTES: Aye.

6 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: O'Malley?

7 BOARD MEMBER O'MALLEY: Aye.

8 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Sweeney?

9 BOARD MEMBER SWEENEY: Aye.

10 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Zopp?

11 BOARD MEMBER ZOPP: Aye.

12 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: And I vote in favor of
13 the motion.

14 Voting in favor are Board members
15 Eaddy, Flores, Montes, O'Malley, Sweeney, Zopp
16 and myself. The motion passes. Board members
17 Wolff and Crowl did not participate in this
18 case.

19 Is there a motion to adopt the
20 written Findings and Decisions that have been
21 reviewed by all Board members who participated
22 in the case?

23 BOARD MEMBER MONTES: This is Jorge Montes.
24 So moved.

1 BOARD MEMBER EADDY: Reverend Eaddy.

2 Second.

3 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: All in favor?

4 (CHORUS OF AYES.)

5 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Any opposed?

6 (NO RESPONSE.)

7 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: The motion passes.

8 The decisions in the cases on
9 which the Board took final action this evening
10 will be entered as of today's date and will be
11 issued to the parties and will be posted on the
12 Board's website.

13 I will now call upon members of
14 the public who signed in advance to speak. As
15 I call your name, please unmute your phone.
16 This is going to be a really critical time for
17 us to adhere to the rules of the two minutes.
18 I will ask people to stop the two minutes. And
19 if I need to, I will press mute. But let's be
20 patient with each other and let's try to
21 respect each other's time considering this is a
22 new way that we're all conducting business
23 right now.

24 First caller is Matt Brandon.

1 MR. BRANDON: Good evening, President
2 Foreman and Board members. And thank you for
3 having the meeting.

4 You know, as summer approaches,
5 I'm apprehensive. Not much at all has been
6 accomplished over the past months to
7 reestablish the relationships that once existed
8 between the community and Police Department.
9 The underlying substance that led to an
10 epidemic of violence in the communities of
11 color still exists. Add to this, the pandemic
12 sweeping the country, this state and our City
13 and the underserved communities have a
14 propensity for a total collapse of public
15 safety. Our first responders are being ordered
16 to work in unsafe, unhealthy surroundings. And
17 I heard the Superintendent say they are getting
18 the gear now. But up til that point, I hadn't
19 heard that they had gotten it yet. So he needs
20 to be applauded for that.

21 Community conversations held
22 across the City and that we participated in
23 CAPS meetings for the 3rd, 6th, 4th and 7th
24 Districts, we found to be a little bit lacking.

1 When the communities that have
2 (inaudible), they were told it couldn't be
3 done. When we asked for putting more foot
4 patrol, it couldn't be guaranteed regularly.

5 Now, one of the problems that we
6 see in our communities is that our districts --
7 our main districts are being used as training
8 districts. That leaves us with unprepared
9 officers and situations that call for seasoned
10 veteran officers. Some of officers come from
11 the academy with a year or two years or even as
12 recruits and have to attend roll calls on basic
13 elements of community enforcement such as
14 enforcing the no-loitering affidavits that
15 exist in our business districts.

16 I think if community policing is
17 to be viable for the police department, there
18 needs to be a curriculum established in the
19 academy, and that hasn't been made system-wide
20 for the police department.

21 I thank you for your time and
22 appreciate the opportunity.

23 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Thank you very much.
24 The next speaker, Jennifer Edwards.

1 MS. EDWARDS: Good evening, everyone. I
2 hope everyone is staying safe. I briefly want
3 to report on our March 3rd interaction. I
4 believe President Foreman mentioned it last
5 month.

6 We have an interaction between
7 our community and the 5th District with -- at
8 79th and Cottage Grove, one of our hot spots,
9 under the direction of Commander Rahman
10 Muhammad of the 6th District.

11 We had officers in plainclothes,
12 community members on the corner, and we also
13 had services at Leak Funeral Home. We have a
14 station there. Services for jobs, mental
15 health and other services that we felt the
16 community at that area needed. We found it to
17 be very successful. We were hoping to have
18 another one today but because of the pandemic,
19 we weren't able to do that.

20 I'd like to also state what Mr.
21 Brandon said about having more
22 officers and more seasoned officers -- excuse
23 me. Because the police officers and the
24 community were out on the corner, we had more

1 cleanliness, the drug dealers and the
2 problems at the -- the bus stations and all of
3 that seemed to kind of disappear. So it is
4 important that we have an officer bike patrol
5 or foot patrol or car stationed there most of
6 the days, if possible, at 79th and Cottage.

7 We also hope to have more
8 interaction. As I said, we wanted one today.
9 We want to have some in the 3rd District, and
10 in the 7th District and in the 4th District.

11 We'd like to take back our
12 community. The community is very interested in
13 doing this and working with the police.

14 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Thank you very much,
15 Ms. Edwards. And, again, I commend you and
16 your community to going out and being part of
17 the movement.

18 Next speaker, Zakiya Mohammad.
19 Ms. Mohammad.

20 (NO RESPONSE.)

21 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Next speaker, Mary
22 Hartfield.

23 MS. HARTFIELD: Hello. I'm here.

24 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Hello.

1 MS. HARTFIELD: Thank you for allowing me
2 to talk about the things that's going on in the
3 community in the Austin neighborhood. I'm just
4 very concerned about the killings that's going
5 on in our community. It's so much going on.
6 And we don't deal with -- and the people not
7 trusting the police officers, that's another
8 part of the -- the -- that's another part that
9 needs to be dealt with. We got police officers
10 that not following the rules, and then they
11 want you to follow the rules. You know, how
12 you going to have the respect? Police supposed
13 to have respect for one another. Our children
14 is being shot down dead in our community, you
15 know, and they don't have anything to do now.
16 You know, we look around our community. Our
17 community don't have anything. You know, we
18 got one restaurant in the Austin neighborhood
19 and what else? We don't have anything else.
20 We have no ma-and-pa stores like we used to
21 have. I don't have anything that -- against
22 Arabs, but we don't have African American
23 community social stuff for our children to do.
24 We don't have anything. We need to work on

1 getting money back into the community. They
2 keep talking bringing money to the community.
3 Where is the money? Where is the money and
4 what is the police officers doing to take care
5 of all these shootings? I hear shooting every
6 night I go to sleep in the Austin community.
7 And that's terrible. Where are these guns
8 coming from? Who is allowing these guns to
9 come into our community?

10 I just appreciate that -- I would
11 appreciate that we work more with one another
12 so we can, you know, trust one another.

13 If I don't trust you, I would not
14 give you no information about nothing that's
15 going on in the community, because some of the
16 police officers tell on you and tell on the
17 neighbors. So they don't trust you, you know,
18 to bring your information to the police. I
19 want you all to work on that.

20 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Thank you, Ms.
21 Hartfield. I appreciate your comments.

22 Next speaker, Mr. George
23 Blakemore.

24 MR. BLAKEMORE: Thank you, sir, for having

1 me. My problem is that the -- the consent
2 that's out for the police of racism is in the
3 police department. I was at Giordano's and
4 looked what happened, the manager came out and
5 attacked me, and then he -- I hit him after he
6 attacked me. A white hand. And he is a white
7 racist. Police would not let me sign a
8 complaint on him. I'm an old man and they say
9 you not -- they size up with him.

10 You know, racism is
11 still -- people don't want to bring the race
12 issue up. These police are racists in the 18th
13 District, all these districts, and now -- I
14 can't on a white man that hit me, but he can
15 sign a complaint on me when I struck him back.

16 Now, that's what I -- I want this
17 to be investigated. And I want those
18 policemen -- COPA to do something about that,
19 because black lives do not matter. White lives
20 matter.

21 I hit this white man but he hit
22 me. Nothing gonna happen. And I'm outraged,
23 though very articulate here, but the big
24 picture is black lives do not matter.

1 You'll never hear of a white --
2 a black policeman shooting a white man. He got
3 the uniform on, he gets the same pay, but he
4 know he better not never abuse a white person.

5 Now, I've been abused. And I
6 want you all to find out why you didn't let Mr.
7 Blakemore sign his complaint on this white man,
8 that manager at Giordano's on Rush and
9 Superior.

10 That's the big picture.
11 Institutional racism and white folks will do
12 whatever they want to a black man.

13 I hit that white man because that
14 white man attacked me.

15 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Thank you, Mr.
16 Blakemore.

17 MR. BLAKEMORE: He attacked me and I hit
18 him.

19 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Thank you, Mr.
20 Blakemore.

21 Mr. Blakemore, I can follow up
22 with you to get information to make sure that
23 you are getting in contact with the appropriate
24 person at COPA.

1 MR. BLAKEMORE: Thank you very -- COPA
2 hasn't been doing any investigating on this
3 incident. 18th District is racist. That's the
4 big picture.

5 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Okay. Mr. Blakemore,
6 I'll --

7 MR. BLAKEMORE: Institutional racism.

8 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: All right. I'm going
9 to unmute the phone now, and I'm going to call
10 for Mr. Robert More. Mr. Robert More.

11 (NO RESPONSE.)

12 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: At this time, all
13 members of the public who signed up in advance
14 to speak have been called upon.

15 Is there a motion to adjourn?

16 BOARD MEMBER WOLFF: This is Paula. I move
17 to adjourn this meeting.

18 BOARD MEMBER EADDY: Yes. Eaddy. Second.

19 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: All in favor?

20 (CHORUS OF AYES.)

21 PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Thank you very much.
22 The motion passes and the meeting is adjourned.
23 I appreciate everyone's patience with the
24 telephone system and thank you for

1 participating in the Police Board meeting.

2 Thank you very much.

3 (WHEREUPON, the proceedings
4 were adjourned at 7:52 p.m.)
