I'm 4 the Vice President of the Chicago Police Board, and I'm 5 calling the meeting to order. Board President Lightfoot and Michael Eaddy 6 7 are unable to attend the meeting in person and wish to attend via audio conference. 8 9 Is there a motion to permit them to do so? 10 MS. FRY: So moved. 11 MR. SIMPSON: Second. 12 MR. FOREMAN: All in favor? 13 (Chorus of Ayes.) The motion passes. 14 MR. FOREMAN: 15 The first item of business is the approval of the minutes of the Board's regular public meeting held 16 17 on July 21, 2016. 18 Is there a motion to approve the minutes? 19 MS. FRY: So moved. 2.0 MR. SIMPSON: Second. 21 MR. FOREMAN: All in favor? 22 (Chorus of Ayes.) 23 MR. FOREMAN: Any opposed? 24 The motion passes.

20 and it speaks for what you would you call gang bangers,

21 or whatever, in the street. It needs to stop. You

22 need to seek independent council to look at police

23 cases and review where police abuse is being upheld, so

24 I'm proposing that you look at the civilian police

Page 7 accountability council as an alternative method where 1 2 cops can be safe too, as well as the residents can be 3 safe too. So you're not snitching on each other, and 4 they're not in harms way, but an independent review board can look at these cases and root out any 5 wrongdoers from that point. This is critical because 6 7 this militarization of the Police Department will -cannot go on. It cannot continue. It will not happen. 8 9 It is an abomination, and it needs to stop. 10 And it will stop. Please consider it. 11 12 MS. FAIRLEY: Thank you. 13 MR. FOREMAN: Thank you. Next speaker, Beatrice Suarez. 14 Next speaker, Charlotte Jenkins. 15 Next speaker, Nona Farrar. 16 17 Next speaker, Raysurnet Morris. 18 Next speaker, EvaAngel Yhwnewbn. 19 MS. YHWNEWBN: Good evening. You're getting 2.0 better at my name. 21 Two things: I want to give a shout out, a 22 hip hip hooray, to the officer that purchased the 23 swimming pool for the six-year old shooting survivor in Englewood. I'd really like to give him an officer 24

fairness and beyond citation on Dream Day, August 28th. 1 2 Secondly, I was very, very disturbed and 3 grieved by what appeared to be a trophy killing. 4 know, when a hunter kills a bear or a Buffalo, I quess now a black person, they put they foot on the kill, and 5 then they get these kudos, Hey, good kill, from their 6 fellow officers, and then you can hear murmuring in the 7 background, Woe, wow, it looks like I'm going to have 8 9 desk duty for 30 days, and I won't be able to hunt and 10 kill. 11 So, that's why it's so necessary to have the 12 cameras, so that everybody can see their ugliness and 13 cut it out because that says we need United Nations intervention under the Genocide Accountability Act of 14 15 2007 that comes with a million dollar fine and your life in prison, and America is quilty of that. 16 17 So, it don't have to just stop at this 18 governmental police patterns and practices level. 19 Thank you.

- MS. FAIRLEY: Thank you.
- MR. FOREMAN: Queen sister.
- 23 QUEEN SISTER: Blessings. Please forgive me, I
- 24 got Flint, Louisiana, and Milwaukee on the line. My

- 1 family is going through something large.
- 2 You know, when THE Superintendent first got
- 3 here, I asked him just what kind of deal he made with
- 4 the devil in that old man country closet he didn't want
- 5 the people to become aware of, and to this day, he has
- 6 not answered us, but the fact remains whatever deal he
- 7 made with this devil is at the expense of public safety
- 8 of black people.
- 9 We have pictures. This is a Village seal
- 10 with Rahm's signature on it that the Superintendent
- 11 has. It also comes with a safe -- a Village Project
- 12 Safe Neighborhood portion that my organization has been
- 13 funding for the last six years.
- 14 I've been pulling dead bodies for the last
- 15 15 years out of abandoned buildings and dumpsters, and
- 16 now suitcases in Carina Johnson (phonetic), which I
- 17 just buried here. We buried her because she wasn't
- 18 eligible for victim assistance, the body that was found
- 19 on 120th place. We're coming up now again on
- 20 freaky-deaky season; Halloween is the most unsafe
- 21 season.
- These we put out for our elders and our sex
- 23 offenders to let our children know to keep going.
- 24 This is a letter from Tom Dart from the

- 1 Cook County Sheriff. I've been served an eviction.
- 2 I'd like to know how it is that I'm being evicted out
- 3 of my house when my back rent don't total 1 percent of
- 4 the -- the contract kickbacks that are being taken
- 5 through here.
- When we come to deal with the issues that
- 7 we're confronted with in the street, I'm constantly met
- 8 with resistance rather than assistance. I'd like to be
- 9 reimbursed so that I can pay my back rent, and I can be
- 10 made whole because my community is not going to allow
- 11 the Cook County sheriff to put my belongings out on the
- 12 street because that home has never belonged to me. My
- 13 home is open to the community. Any of you all are
- 14 welcomed to out to my home, in my home; it's the
- 15 village.
- We put our youth in touch with creative
- 17 abilities to help them discover who they are, and they
- 18 don't have to slang, bang or pop they thang unless they
- 19 choose to. In the village's time, the (inaudible)
- 20 because kids that can't read, kids that can't write,
- 21 and parents just don't seem to understand. We put them
- 22 in touch with creative abilities that has everything to
- 23 do with their culture, teaching them about who they are
- 24 and taking pride in who they are.

- 1 And allowing them options, alternatives and
- 2 opportunities to sell the things they create rather
- 3 than contribute to the destruction of my community
- 4 selling things that are illegal that jeopardize the
- 5 lives of everybody in my community.
- I need some assistance. I've been waiting
- 7 now since he got there --
- 8 MR. FOREMAN: You're out of time. Let's talk
- 9 after this. There's a couple of grants I want to
- 10 introduce you to.
- 11 QUEEN SISTER: Let me get your card. I got over a
- 12 hundred family members on this conference call.
- 13 MR. FOREMAN: We'll talk after this.
- 14 Have a great day and a safe season.
- 15 QUEEN SISTER: Thank you.
- MR. FOREMAN: Mr. Robert More.
- 17 MR. MORE: It is July the -- it is July the --

- 20 criminal report.
- 21 At any rate, this is the Chicago Police Board
- 22 meeting. I've got to interrupt everything here in
- 23 terms of the ongoing planned senseless murders
- 24 (inaudible) residence projects because I was subjected

- 1 to a theft on the 22nd and 23rd of July, and I got to
- 2 read this into the public record.
- 3 This conveyance constitutes legal notice
- 4 July 22nd and July 23rd, 2016. Robert J. More is the
- 5 victim of two thefts committed at Unit 2024 of Extra
- 6 Space Storage facility at 707 West Harrison Street,
- 7 Chicago, Illinois. The crime report labeled HZ 360-742
- 8 is produced in this regard. If the video recording
- 9 from the video cameras located in that facility to the
- 10 time period after the theft is not preserved according
- 11 to manager A. Kavalauskas (phonetic), it will be copied
- 12 over 30 days from the date of such theft, which will be
- 13 this coming Sunday evening and Monday.
- 14 Although, a similar situation several years
- 15 ago, RJM, Robert J. More, was permitted to view the
- 16 video without any police involvement used to catch the
- 17 thief. The present policy prohibits such type of acts
- 18 (inaudible) police involvement. The City of Chicago
- 19 Police Department was notified, (inaudible) documented
- 20 concerns were not immediately removed from the
- 21 facility.
- 22 After having been told that the
- 23 non-preservation of such video may result in the
- 24 perpetrator of this crime getting away with it, an

- 1 arrangement (inaudible) and conviction might have been
- 2 procured from such footage.
- In other words, that evidence may constitute
- 4 a balance tipping evidence in terms of procuring a
- 5 conviction and helping me to recover my property.
- 6 So I'm putting the Chicago Police Department
- 7 on notice, and I guess I'm going to have to try to go
- 8 get a warrant tomorrow, but I'm seeking to whoever
- 9 represents the City of Chicago, City of Chicago Police
- 10 Department to address the issue as to what I have to do
- 11 to preserve that evidence because I presume that Extra
- 12 Space Storage will definitely preserve that evidence if
- 13 they get an order from the City of Chicago Police
- 14 Department to preserve that evidence.
- MR. FOREMAN: Thank you, Mr. More.
- 16 At this time, all of those people who signed
- 17 up in advance to speak have been recognized.
- 18 Is there a motion to adjourn?
- 19 MS. FRY: So moved.
- 20 MR. SIMPSON: Second.
- 21 MR. FOREMAN: The motion passes. The meeting is
- 22 adjourned. Thank you.
