The **Neighborhood Access Program** supports the cultural vitality of every neighborhood via grant programs and partnerships designed to be responsive to the complex needs of individual communities. This program offers direct grants for all types of community-based arts and culture activities. This program was created to support arts and culture activities in all neighborhoods with a focus on those that have traditionally not received significant funding through DCASE's Cultural Grants Program, and to collaborate with other City departments to make a collective impact on neighborhoods identified through other City initiatives.

A Knock At Midnight, NFP	Exposure to Photography	A Knock at Midnight will provide 10-week sessions of beginning and advanced photography and culinary arts classes for middle and high school students. Students will collaborate on food styling and photography, culminating in exhibits and printed catalogue of their work.
Access Contemporary Music	Vacant Storefront Cross Collaborative Musical Awakening	Access Contemporary Music will activate a vacant storefront in Uptown with a series of collaborative musical events in the summer of 2025, celebrating Uptown's rich history and cultural diversity. Highlights include a commissioned compositions based on Studs Turkel's <i>Working</i> and Bob Rehak's iconic images of the neighborhood.
Annie B. Jones Civic Arts Center	ABJ Harmonious Voices	The "Harmonious Voices" program will serve the community, ages 12-65, through film, vocal performance, songwriting and production workshops, culminating in a community performance of original songs.
Bodies In Motion II NFP	Programmatic Activities	Bodies in Motion II will provide weekly dance classes drawing upon the majorette and hip-hop genres for youth aged 4 – 24. Students will collaborate on choreography and perform in community events and a culminating recital for the public.
Chicago Rewilding Society	West Side Equestirian Trick Riders	The Chicago Rewilding Society will offer a free equestrian trick riding program for Garfield Park youth aged 5 - 18 years. Students will learn a variety of discipines such as dance, drumming, and acrobatics as part of the program, culminating in a public presentation.
Chicago Torture Justice Center	Resilience Theatre Festival	The Chicago Torture Justice Center, in collaboration with the Mud Theatre Project, will produce performances and readings of original works by artists impacted by the criminal legal system.
Chinese American Museum of Chicago	Queer in Chinatown	The Chinese American Museum of Chicago, in collaboration with Space Club 680 North, will collect and preserve the diverse queer histories within Chinatown resulting in publication at the end of 2025. Additional programming will include exhibitions of queer trans-American artists during Pride Month.
CRE8 Space, L3C	CRE8 Space	Dondre Smith will produce an eight-week long session of CRE8 Space, an initiative equipping BIPOC youth essential fashion design skills including an intensive sewing incubator and a culminating public fashion showcase.

ReinventAbility	DisFest Neighborhood Celebrations	In conjunction with their DisFest 2024 at Chicago Live on Navy Pier, ReinventAbility will offer accesible arts events in South Shore and Pilsen, focusing the workshops on disciplines and genres indigenous to those areas.
Roman Susan Art Foundation NFP	FRUTAS	FRUTAS, in collaboration with Roman Susan Art Foundation, will host bimonthly Spanish-language arts and culture events in Uptown promoting multilingualism and language justice while uplifting the Latinx and LGBTQIA+ communities.
