
The Executive Order directs the following governmental entities to collaborate to develop a working structure and common goals:

SHORT TERM GOALS **Overarching goals to achieve:** 


- 1. Initiate a coordinating structure

AREA OF FOCUS & COORDINATION






INITIAL OPERATING STRUCTURE




INITIAL OPERATING STRUCTURE
