



Spectrum of Public Participation

Adapted from the International Association for Public Participation

	Public Participation Goal	Promise to the Public
Inform	To provide the public with balanced and objective information to assist them in understanding the problem, alternatives, opportunities, and/or solutions.	We will keep you informed.
Consult	To obtain public feedback on analysis, alternatives, and/or decisions.	We will keep you informed, listen to and acknowledge concerns and aspirations, and provide feedback on how public input influenced the decision.
Involve	To work directly with the public throughout the process to ensure that public concerns and aspirations are consistently understood and considered.	We will work with you to ensure your concerns and aspirations are directly reflected in the alternatives developed and provide feedback on how public input influenced the decision.
Collaborate	To partner with the public in each aspect of the decision including the development of alternatives and the identification of the preferred solution.	We will look to you for advice and innovation in formulating solutions and incorporate you advice and recommendations into the decision to the maximum extent possible.
Empower	To place final decision making in the hands of the public.	We will implement what you decide.
Own	To share or place ownership in the hands of community leaders to activate, manage, and maintain the outcome.	We will provide or transfer full or partial ownership of this project to you.



* ACCESSIBLE + MEANINGFUL COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Advance reading:

Engagement-related objectives from Pillar Research teams

Examples:

- Engage historically marginalized residents and stakeholders in neighborhood decisions and processes (Housing & Neighborhoods)
- Promote collaboration and coordination among all City departments and other partners responsible for transportation and infrastructure to ensure actions are aligned with community input. (Transportation & Infrastructure)
- Establish transparent decision-making procedures (Housing & Neighborhoods)



EXAMPLES FROM OTHER CITIES - EDMONTON

Guiding Value: I want to BELONG and contribute.

Outcome (Objective):

Edmontonians can connect, be active in their community, and celebrate Edmonton's heritage, diversity, and unique identity.

Guiding Value:

I want to be able to CREATE and innovate.

Outcome (Objective):

Edmonton fosters citizen leadership, capacity building, and co-creation.





EXAMPLES FROM OTHER CITIES - MINNEAPOLIS

Goal:

Equitable Civic Participation System

In 2040, Minneapolis will have an equitable civic participation system that enfranchises everyone, recognizes the core and vital service neighborhood organizations provide to the City of Minneapolis, and builds people's long-term capacity to organize to improve their lives and neighborhoods.

8 policies relate to this goal:

- Social Connectedness
- Healthy Youth Development
- **Public Services Policy**
- Technology in the City Enterprise
- Arts and Culture in Community Development
- Heritage Preservation Outreach
- **Cultural Districts**
- Place-based Neighborhood Engagement


X EXAMPLES FROM OTHER CITIES — NEW YORK CITY

Strategy: A Vibrant Democracy

New York City will involve every New Yorker in the civic and democratic life of the city, welcoming immigrants, advancing justice, and leading on the global stage.

4 initiatives relate to this strategy:

- Empower all New Yorkers to participate in our democracy
- Welcome new New Yorkers from around the world and involve them fully in civic life
- Promote justice and equal rights, and build trust between New Yorkers and government
- Promote democracy and civic innovation on the global stage





X OBJECTIVES VERSUS POLICIES

OBJECTIVES

Defines the "what"

- Defines what we want to achieve through We Will Chicago – an outcome
- Defines **specific**, **measurable** actions the City must take to support a Guiding Question

POLICIES

Defines the "how"

- Defines how we can fulfill an objective - an action
- Considers trade-offs



X OBJECTIVES VERSUS POLICIES

GUIDING QUESTION

How do we ensure an equitable representation of Black and Brown Chicagoans in City elections?

OBJECTIVES

Increase voter turnout among Black and Brown residents in City elections



"What" = voter turnout



Outcome = a <u>measurable</u> increase in voter turnout

Increase the use of voting by mail in Black and Brown neighborhoods



NOT an objective



Vote by mail is a "how" - a specific action that can be implemented to increase voter turnout


