The following clarifications/answers to Bidder's questions are being issued for the above-referenced Bid Documents to all prospective Bidders. The answers/clarifications to the prospective Bidder's questions by the City are for informational purposes only and do not amend the Bid Documents. All other provisions and requirements as originally set forth except as amended by previous addenda remain in full force and are binding.

SECTION 1. NOTICE OF REVISIONS/CHANGES/CLARIFICATIONS

The following questions and requests for clarification were submitted in accordance with the instructions provided in the Contract Documents. The City's response (shown in ***bold italics***) follows each question or request for clarification in the table below:

Question 1.	Any condition that will last more than 60 days will require a minimum of 60 Days notice to the CDA security representative to format and submit for approval to the transportation security administration, an amendment to the ASP. The 60 days notice comprise the 45 days to notice transportation security administration plus 15 days review/write up by CDA security representative. Question: Has the notice been provided by Commissioner or is contractor required to file notice? Should the request and review be included in the construction schedule?
Response	<i>Refer to Drawing Sheet GC-102, Note 1. This notice will be sent by Commissioner prior to NTP for the gate/fence work shown in the plans. The Contractor will have access through an established Guard Post until this new gate can be installed, provided the Contractor has badged their employees through the CDA process.</i>
Question 2.	Utility service connections will be available no later than sixty days following the completion of the utility infrastructure and facilities per the contract documents and as required by the utility service provider. The contractor will be responsible for all utility installation cost, connection fees, and usage costs until the date of substantial

	<p>completion. At substantial completion, all utility services will be transferred from the contractor to the city or third party as directed. This does not apply to the contractor's trailer. The contractor will retain responsibility for all utility costs associated with the trailer and termination. These services will not be turned over the city.</p> <p>Question: What utility service connections are required by the City?</p>
Response	<i>Per the Bid Drawings, utility service connections are not required for this project. This is a general note that covers the Contractor's trailers that may require utility services.</i>
Question 3.	<p>The contractor must provide all temporary electrical circuits to maintain airfield lighting and signage circuits impacted by construction activities associated with this project. All work associated with these temporary circuits is incidental to the project.</p> <p>Question: No work is identified. What temporary lighting and signage circuits are anticipated to be impacted by construction activities?</p>
Response	<i>Per the Bid Drawings, this is a general note and airfield lighting and signage circuits will not be impacted.</i>
Question 4.	Both stockpile A and C are located over existing FAA utilities. What are the surcharge impacts to these utilities?
Response	<i>Refer to Drawing Sheets GI-107, CG-206 and CG-209. Per the legend, these existing utilities are abandoned. Stockpiles A and B are shown over abandoned FAA utilities. The active FAA utilities are identified and called out for protection on the Drawings.</i>
Question 5.	Within Book 3, Volume 1, page P-152-2, Section 1.03D, "Wood must be sorted, chipped and disposed of offsite." Please clarify the method of payment for the offsite hauling, disposal, and also the method of payment for chipping the material.
Response	<i>Refer to Specification Section P-152, Paragraph 4.01. This is incidental to Unclassified Excavation.</i>
Question 6.	Plan Sheet GC-102 identifies three stockpile areas designated as A, B, and C. Please identify which material (suitable, topsoil, etc.) will go in to each PR Stockpile A, B, and C.
Response	<i>See response to Question #82 of Addendum #1, which was advertised and made available on January 23, 2017.</i>

In accordance with Section 1 of the "Requirements for Bidding and Instructions for Bidders" in Part One of Three: Interpretation of Contract Documents, the deadline for questions has passed. No additional questions will be answered prior to bid opening except as the Chief Procurement Officer, in her sole discretion, deems to be in the best interest of the City.
