






# **NBDC Program**

### Neighborhood Business Development Centers (NBDC) Program

- Provides grants to Chicago-based chambers of commerce and business support organizations to assist in the development of small businesses in Chicago
- Serves as liaison between local businesses and the City of Chicago
- Provides neighborhood business development services







## Getting Started – Counseling

#### ILLINOIS SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CENTERS (SBDC)

- Located throughout the state, SBDCs provide information, confidential business guidance, training and other resources to start-up and existing small businesses;
- Services Include one-on-one business advice and management assistance, assistance with the development of business plans, help with accessing market information and the development of marketing plans, assistance with accessing business financing programs, assistance with financial analysis and planning, access to business education and training opportunities, specialized services in technology, innovation and entrepreneurial development;
- Located at the following NBDC delegate agencies: Women's Business Development Center, Chicagoland CC, Little Village CC, Bethel New Life, Greater Englewood CDC, Greater Southwest Development Corp., Far South CDC, Rogers Park Business, South Shore Chamber and Build Bronzeville.

#### CITY OF CHICAGO SMALL BUSINESS SOLUTION STATION

- Located at City Hall, 121 N. LaSalle, Room 800, The Small Business Center Solution Station is open Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 9:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. Counseling is provided by our partner organizations including SCORE, The Law Project, the Women's Development Center, IRS and ACCION Chicago.
- The Business Start-up Certificate Program requires the completion of the nine category curriculum within six months of the start date. Completion of the Business Start-Up Certificate Program provides entrepreneurs and the experienced business owners the basic fundamentals for licensing, opening and/or expanding a business. Workshops are held Wednesday 3:00 p.m. 4:30 p.m. and Friday, 9:30 a.m. 11:00 a.m.

# **Business Registration**

#### **CITY OF CHICAGO**

Business License

#### **COOK COUNTY CLERK - ASSUMED NAMES**

- For Sole Proprietors or General Partnerships
- If using an assumed name, then obtain an Assumed Name Certificate

#### **ILLINOIS SECRETARY OF STATE - FILE NUMBER**

- For Limited Partnerships, Corporations, LLCs, or NFPs
- When registering a new legal entity, you will be provided with a File Number

#### **INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE - EIN**

- For any type of legal entity
- An Employer Identification Number (EIN) is required to file/pay federal taxes

#### ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE - ACCOUNT ID NUMBER

- For any type of legal entity
- If conducting business in Illinois, then obtain a Certificate of Registration





# Business Licensing – SBC

#### **BUSINESS LICENSE REQUIREMENT**

 Most businesses operating in Chicago require a City of Chicago business license

#### **BUSINESS LICENSE EXEMPTION**

- Some businesses licensed by the State of Illinois are exempt
- Ex.: Doctors, Attorneys, Architects, CPAs

#### TRADE LICENSES ISSUED BY DOB

 Department of Buildings issues General Contractor, Electrician, Plumbing, & Carpenter licenses

### **Business Education - BACP**

#### **BUSINESS EDUCATION WORKSHOPS**

- BACP offers free Business Education Workshops every Wednesday and Friday online at cityofchicago.org/business education
- Class topics focus on start-up operations, financing, marketing, social media and more.
- Classes are taught by industry professionals, not for profit agencies, and city employees.

#### THE BUSINESS START-UP CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

- The Business Start-Up Certificate Program is free and designed to teach business owners the essential elements of starting and growing a business.
- Entrepreneurs can earn a Business Start-Up Certificate when they complete a curriculum of BACP Business Education Workshops.

#### **SMALL BUSINESS CENTER SOLUTION STATION**

- The Small Business Solution Station offers free one-on-one business counseling for entrepreneurs.
- This is where you can talk to an expert about planning, legal issues, small business loans, tax matters or just get expert advice.

### **Neighborhood Resources**

#### **SPECIAL SERVICE AREAS (SSA)**

- SSAs are geographic districts that fund expanded programs and services within a Citydesignated area through property tax levies.
- Before contacting an SSA Provider, first check if your business is in an SSA district.
- SSA Providers can support services include public property beautification and maintenance, safety, building rehab rebates, and district marketing, public meetings and information about SSA decision-making processes, and more information about SSA budgets.

#### LOCAL INDUSTRIAL RETENTION INITIATIVE (LIRI) COUNCILS

- LIRI agencies are City-contracted non-profits that provide economic development services to companies located in and around industrial corridors.
- They can help you with information about a particular industrial corridor, neighborhood or business industry, getting a new small business started, troubleshooting, City-related issues for small businesses, connecting you to financial resources, business-to-business networking resources and employment and workforce development assistance.

#### **LIBRARIES**

- Harold Washington Library Center has small business experts on hand to assist you.
- Additionally, your local branch of the Chicago Public Library is an excellent place to begin your business research.

# Chicago Microlending Institute

#### **ACCION CHICAGO**

- Offers loans from \$300 to \$1M, These loans can be used for working capital, to purchase inventory, for equipment and other hard assets, for short-term business training, for promotions and advertising, to retire existing business debt, or for the purchase of an existing business.

#### CHICAGO NEIGHBORHOOD INITIATIVES MICROFINANCE GROUP (CNIMFG)

- CNIMFG provides credit to small businesses that do not have access to loans from commercial sources. CNIMFG offers loans of \$50,000 for established businesses and start-up businesses as well as credit builder loans ranging from \$500 to \$5,000 with terms from 6 to 72 months.

### **Grant Programs**

#### **GRANTS – DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT (DPD)**

- Small Business Improvement Fund (SBIF)
  - Matching grants to cover half o the cost of remodeling work, with a max of \$250k for industrial and \$150k for commercial - https://somercor.com/loansgrants/#smallbusiness
- Neighborhood Opportunity Fund (NOF)
  - NOF receives funds from that downtown development in order to support commercial corridors in Chicago's underserved neighborhoods. Business and property owners may apply for grant funding that will pay for the development or rehabilitation of real estate and projects that support new or expanding businesses or cultural assets. www.neighborhoodopportunityfund.com





### **Grant Programs**

### **Current grant opportunities**

- Business Interruption Grants State of Illinois (www2.Illinois.gov/dceo)
  - A \$220 million second round of BIG aims to provide relief for all types of small businesses, but with a particular focus on businesses downstate, in disproportionately impacted areas (DIAs), and for heavily impacted industry and regions – representing businesses that have been unable to reopen or operating at a severely diminished capacity since the spring
    - Grant amounts will be calculated based on two months of eligible operating expenses for businesses in heavily impacted industries and two months of revenue losses for all other industries
- Distressed Communities


