### SOLE SOURCE JUSTIFICATION AND REQUEST FOR NON-COMPETITIVE PROCUREMENT

#### PROCUREMENT HISTORY

Back in May of 2001, the Chicago Police Department submitted for approval a request for non-competitive procurement with the Oracle Corporation for the purposes of developing the Department's Citizen and Law Enforcement Analysis and Reporting (CLEAR). Attached as Exhibit 1 is the original sole source justification that was approved.

This current request is to inform and seek approval of the Committee for requested changes to the original contract. The current amendment extends the agreement through December 31, 2005. Additionally, the maximum dollar value for the contract is increased by \$9.5 million and the scope of services is expanded. It should be noted that all of the funding for services will be from non-corporate sources.

The scope of work provided in the current amendment has minimal differences from the original scope of work and provides the Department with the ability to fully realize the range or services for CLEAR. Specifically, the scope of work was expanded to include work to be completed on the new I-CLEAR component of the project. I-CLEAR, was recently endorsed by both Mayor Daley and Governor Blagoevich as the future of law enforcement reporting for the state of Illinois. One of the components of this project is I-CASE, which will allow for automated case reporting from the squad car for law enforcement officers. The scope of work was also expanded to create a database of facilities storing hazardous materials. This database would be used for tracking and planning purposes. Because of the long-standing relationship with Oracle and their unique knowledge of CPD processes, to find another vendor to complete the project in the amount of time allotted would be problematic as there are grant dollars involved in this contract which have specific timelines that need to be addressed. Additionally, this amendment to the original agreement would allow the Department to continue working on fulfilling the original vision of CLEAR.

No other modifications to the original agreement and approved amendments one and two are requested at this time.

#### **Necessity to Contract Non-Competitively**

For years, the Department has worked on a comprehensive technology plan that allows for the automation of all operational aspects of the Department. Since August 1996, the Department, in cooperation with the Oracle Service Industries, has been designing a comprehensive Criminal History Records Information System (CHRIS/CLEAR). The second stage of this development has been named Citizen and Law Enforcement Analysis and Reporting (CLEAR). The goal of the project is to create a single relational data system to service all of the Department's electronic data entry and storage needs.

Improving the Chicago Police Department's crime-related informational systems has been identified as an essential element in the Department's efforts to successfully meet its mission. The initial design area addressed by the CHRIS/CLEAR development project concerned arrest processing data and criminal history record information. Subsequent components in development included modules to address the Department's needs with respect to: case reporting, warrants, stop orders, name checks, ordinance violations, youth records, firearm registrations, bicycle registrations, evidence and inventoried property, court witness notifications, nuisance abatement orders, asset

forfeitures, forms automation, internal investigations, gang information and analysis, and personnel management.

#### 1. Responsiveness and Knowledge of the Project

The City of Chicago and the Department currently operate under a comprehensive agreement with Oracle regarding computer system development and maintenance. The foundation for this selection of the Oracle Corporation has been based upon Oracle's extensive preliminary work in support of the CHRIS/CLEAR project. During the period of 14 August through 3 November 1995, Oracle played a key role in the development of an extensive functional model for CHRIS/CLEAR. As part of this effort, Oracle participated in 18 group interview sessions with various units of the Department; so as to understand the informational needs of these divisions of the Department, their functions, processes and procedures. More than 100 Department members, representing all aspects of the Department, participated in these Joint Application Design (JAD) sessions, the purpose of which were to identify the key information processing and system issues. These sessions then formed the basis from which the CHRIS/CLEAR architecture and functional structure has been formed.

#### 2. Expertise and Experience

Oracle is a world leader in the development of advanced technological architecture and database design. The Department has previously identified the Oracle database product as the best relational database software architecture for use with the development of CLEAR. Using the Oracle consultant services for the design and development of CLEAR has allowed the Department to maximize the features of the Oracle database product, and therefore the Department's resource investment. The iterative stages of development are directly connected to the larger CLEAR project. As such, use of consultant staff with extensive experience in the design and functionality of CLEAR overall will be critical for efficient, timely and cost effective completion of the project.

During 1996, the initial project startup time investment made with the Oracle Corporation regarding CLEAR was 13 weeks and \$150,000. Since 1996, the CLEAR project has grown substantially. The participation of the Oracle consultants during the Department's transition to CLEAR has been extensive and crucial throughout the project's development completed to date. Already, the level of integration in the Department's central information system is substantially ahead of that of any other major law enforcement agency. The CLEAR project has increasingly become the information systems integration model for law enforcement agencies from across the country. As each new component for CLEAR is developed and/or enhanced, the need for a comprehensive understanding of the full CLEAR structure and functionality becomes increasingly critical. A lack of this systems knowledge poses a substantial risk of an inefficient component development process. This knowledge deficiency also poses the risk that the final product of the component developed will not be fully effective, and as such will not adequately address the Departmental needs intended. More importantly, this deficiency could, through a poor system's design, result in a final product that degrades the effectiveness, efficiency and reliability of CLEAR overall. Finally, should these deficiencies have a significant and negative impact on CLEAR, based upon its ever increasing and critical role within the Department, a substantial and negative effect would then also result to the Department's actual operations. Accordingly, the related resource investments, and the potential risks to both the Department's information system and its operations, could be considerable.

Additionally, Oracle has extensive and intimate knowledge of the CHRIS/CLEAR system. As the main provider of services of this system, Oracle is well versed in the many interfaces of the system, the hundreds of code tables supporting the system, and in how each of the system modules (Arrest, Case, Personnel Suite, AIRA, Gang, etc.) work with one another to achieve the desired objective: a relational database structure fueling an enterprise model. This knowledge allows the Department to capitalize on its data power by connecting information at the lowest

source possible. Further, doing so allows the Department to avoid a critical IT pitfall: independent, stove-piped systems that cannot interact with other systems.

More importantly, the knowledge of CPD's business processes is extremely familiar to the Oracle consultants. This intimate knowledge has been gained over the course of eight years. This type of knowledge is priceless given that system rules are dependent upon business rules. To provide another contractor with this type of knowledge would be extremely time consuming and not fiscally responsible.

Finally, the size of Oracle's organization allows staff to perform their services on site and exclusively for the Department. Additionally, because of the size and interrelatedness of the project, Oracle has assigned management to oversee the overall development and deployment of the project on site. Oracle Corporation developed the management style of the project. Known as Oracle's Custom Development Method Fast Track (CDM Fast Track), this methodology is an approach that allows developers to quickly provide custom applications. It is a Rapid Application Development (RAD) method made compliant with the Dynamic System Development Method (DSDM), the emerging de facto standard worldwide. It deals with a number of aspects of a typical RAD project, including timeboxing, prioritizing and prototyping, and allows the project team to provide quick, robust, user-driven approaches to the customer with a minimum of risk.

#### 3. Time Constraints

For the proposed increase in funding, there are currently three separate grants that would provide for the resources under this initiative. These funds, from both federal and state grant sources, have tight time restrictions that come along with the funding. Considering these restrictions, it is critical to undertake the proposed development as soon as funding is available. The full scope of the development proposed will require an estimated twelve to twenty-four months to complete.

Secondly, should a vendor other than Oracle be selected, several additional weeks/months would be lost for that vendor to acquire even the most basic working knowledge of the underlying CHRIS/CLEAR project. Additionally, any other vendor would then also need to undertake the lengthy process of learning the Department's related operational processes. All of these additional months of project startup would not only delay the actual start of development, but they would also draw heavily from the limited funding available for the project, as these hours would be billable.

#### 4. Uniqueness

As the design and development of CHRIS/CLEAR has proceeded, no company other than Oracle has had their level of program participation. Oracle has been the only consulting company involved in the development of the critical table, operating, editing and reporting conventions that form the CHRIS/CLEAR architecture. This architecture is the basis on which all the system's applications must operate. Additionally, no other consulting resources (other than minority firm subcontractors under Oracle's direct supervision) have been involved in the development of the main CHRIS/CLEAR modules, particularly CHRIS/CLEAR Arrest and CHRIS/CLEAR Case. The subcontractors that have worked under Oracle's supervision have had only limited involvement in the development of lesser system forms and reports, and they lack Oracle's depth of experience and knowledge of CHRIS/CLEAR overall and the interrelatedness of the system's architecture and its main components.

More importantly, CHRIS/CLEAR is based upon a one-of-a-kind system that lowers development costs. This system, known as Project Marvel, is specific to Oracle and cannot be found through other vendors. Oracle's project

marvel is uniquely positioned in providing a development environment for the construction of database centric, custom web-deployable applications that are tightly integrated with Oracle database while open and deployed utilizing standard internet based presentation technologies.

The development platform allows for rapid application development of software utilizing the industry leading performance of the Oracle database, SQL and pl/sql toolsets. The robust environment leverages declarative programming techniques and a significant palate of "built-in" features pre-constructed and available to the application developer to build and deploy custom applications in a fraction of the effort required of other technology approaches. The intuitive and feature rich development platform leverages the existing skill sets of in-house CPD staff resulting short technology learning curves and lower total cost application development.

#### Scope

Oracle is submitting this proposal on a time and material basis as Amendment 3 to the Consulting Services Agreement dated May 31, 2001 between Oracle Corporation and City of Chicago, Chicago Police Department (CPD) (Vendor # 1031093A, Contract No. T1918291501), to provide CPD consulting services in connection with the development and implementation of the Citizen and Law Enforcement Analysis and Reporting (CLEAR) system.

As part of the services provided, Oracle will provide Oracle Education classes.

The scope of services is described below.

#### **ICASE**

Oracle will assist CPD in development of the ICASE project as part of the statewide ICLEAR (Illinois CLEAR) initiative. A combined Case Management system will be developed for CPD and Illinois State Police (ISP). This will involve requirements capture, design, development, testing, and implementation.

#### Gangs
