

### CHICAGO MAYOR SCHEDULED SPEAKER AT CISCO LUNCHEON - APRIL 21, 2017

Under Mayor Rahm Emanuel, the City of Chicago has experienced a construction renaissance. In addition to having set a post-recession record for crane permits in 2016, Chicago was recently named by the *PitchBook* research company as the top city for the most profitable start up companies in the country.

Chicago's construction boom is further evidenced by its record number of building permits, the billion dollar renovation of CTA infrastructure, as well as the billion dollar-plus redevelopment program for Navy Pier and the McCormick Square neighborhood to name just a few examples.

### CISCO SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS TO BE HONORED DURING LUNCHEON

Having extended the deadline to Friday, February 24, CISCO expects to be reviewing all applications for its 2017 Scholarship Program next week, before the Board of Directors announces the winners.



The winners will be recognized at the Annual Luncheon on April 21st. CISCO presents (3) four-year scholarships (\$2,000/year) to high school seniors; (2) two-year awards (\$1,000/year) for seniors attending community college; and (2) two-year continuing education awards (\$1,000/year) to union members or contractor employees.

### LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

After holding its recent Legislative Committee meeting on Feb. 13, there were some recent developments on both the state and federal fronts.

1) A press release was issued by the Governor's Office this week stating that Illinois Department of Labor (IDOL) Director Hugo Chaviano had been replaced, for now, by Deputy Director Anna Hui.

2) The New Hampshire State Assembly did not pass anti-union legislation last week – a victory for working families.

3) According to NBC News: AFL-CIO's President Richard Trumka said, "Working people changed the game on this nomination. Unlike Andy Puzder, Alexander Acosta's nomination deserves serious consideration. In one day, we've gone from a fast-food CEO who routinely violates labor law to a public servant with experience enforcing it."
