I contacted you about 2 weeks ago about having received an anonymous gift just before Christmas, 2020. I received, at the workplace, a card left on a supervisor desk. My name and the greeting inside the card were typed, so I was unable to ascertain the identity of the gift giver. Also inside the card was a \$100 bill.

Per our conversation two weeks ago, since I cannot return a gift without knowing from whom I received it, I have donated the \$100 gift to a charity to comply with city Ethics rules. That charity is called Never 99, a non-profit recognized by the IRS as a 501c3...it is set up to provide toiletries and assistance to homeless citizens of the city of Chicago.


