




The Annual Chicago Point-In-Time (PIT) Count is conducted to provide a “snapshot” of homelessness on one night of the year and is mandated by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. This year’s PIT Count was held on January 23, 2020. Data is used to inform planning efforts, monitor trends over time, seek funds to assist people experiencing homelessness, and build public awareness of homelessness.

from 2019 to 2020




2% TOTAL INCREASE
