MAYOR BRANDON JOHNSON STATEMENT ON THE RULING IN THE LAWSUIT AGAINST THE TRUMP ADMINISTRATION

CHICAGO – Yesterday, Judge Susan Illston in San Francisco issued a <u>Temporary</u> Restraining Order halting the Trump administration's firings of federal workers in response to the <u>lawsuit filed by a nationwide coalition of cities, counties, union organizations, and non-profit groups</u>. This order represents the "<u>broadest effort yet to halt the Trump administration's overhaul of the federal government</u>." In response to the ruling, Mayor Johnson issued the following statement:

"We are pleased with the U.S. District Court's ruling, temporarily restraining President Trump's administration from reorganizing our government in a way that sows chaos and division. Today and every day, Chicago stands with working people. We will continue to push back against the federal government's policies that harm our people. I am grateful to the cities and labor unions across the nation that took this stand and filed suit with Chicago; our continued unity is going to be vital as we work to preserve our democracy and invest in our communities."
