CITY COUNCIL APPROVES APPOINTMENTS TO LEAD NEW CHICAGO ADVISORY COUNCILS

Council to also consider new Mayoral appointments for Board of Ethics, Chicago Low-Income Housing Trust Fund Board and Chicago Community Land Trust Board

CHICAGO – The Chicago City Council today voted to approve new chairs announced by Mayor Lori E. Lightfoot last month to lead the Chicago Commission on Human Relations Advisory Councils. The Chairs approved to the Chicago Commission on Human Relations Advisory Councils will serve as liaisons between the City and key constituencies, and will be charged with elevating the needs of specific communities and solutions to address them and better support key vulnerable populations in our city.

"My top priority is ensuring that City government works to improve the lives of all of our residents, and today's appointments are essential to ensuring proper representation of our communities as policy decisions are made," said Mayor Lightfoot. "I am proud to appoint these leaders who represent the diverse backgrounds and experiences of the people who live and work in Chicago and throughout our 77 community areas, and who have dedicated their careers to continuously improving our city."
