The following information is provided in response to questions posed at our department's hearing on October 26, 2020, to discuss the proposed 2021 budget.

Alderman Reilly asked for estimates of how much would be saved by a five percent and ten percent cut from each department, with the exception of the Chicago Police Department (CPD) and the Chicago Fire Department (CFD). The estimates should include a two percent cut for those two departments.

- A five percent reduction from the proposed 2021 budget across departments, with a two percent reduction for CPD and CFD would result in a total Corporate budget of \$4,265,368,777. This is a \$242,899,777 million increase from the 2021 Budget Recommendations and \$153,845,223 less than the 2020 Budget Ordinance, as amended.
- A 10 percent reduction across departments, with a two percent reduction for CPD and CFD would result in a total Corporate budget of \$4,156,267,207. This is a \$133,798,207 increase from the 2021 Budget Recommendations and \$262,946,793 less than the 2020 Budget, as amended.

The current 2021 Budget Recommendation proposes a Corporate Fund budget of \$4.0 billion.

A number of factors are expected to affect the duration of the economic impact of COVID-19 on the City's revenues, but the primary driver is expected to be the course and duration of the pandemic and when a vaccine or treatment becomes widely available. The City's base forecast assumes a vaccine will be broadly available by the third quarter of 2021 and economic recovery in most areas in the beginning of 2022. However, some industries, such as the hotel industry, will likely take several years to recover.

Details on our forecast for various revenue streams begin on page 63 of the 2021 Budget Forecast and did not change significantly between the Forecast and introduction of the 2021 Budget Recommendations.

The following information is provided in response to questions posed at our department's hearing on October 26, 2020, to discuss the proposed 2021 budget.

Alderman Cardenas requested figures on the number of employees that would be eligible for early retirement.

Excluding Police and Fire who have mandatory retirement provisions in their contracts, there are approximately 5,600 employees who have the age to retire. It is difficult to gage the full number of employees eligible to retire given that many have qualifying years from other agencies which is information that the City does not have access to.

However, when considering offering an early retirement buyout, there must be some incentive offered to the employee whether it be a lump sum payment or allowing for the purchase of additional years. The lump sum payment would require an upfront investment which could negate the savings realized from the early retirement incentive. As far as offering an employee the ability to buy years of service, this would also need to be carefully considered against what the City's pension funds are able to support. Given the aging population of the City's workforce, offering a buyout would create an influx of vacancies – however many may need to be backfilled, thus possibly negating any savings. There would also be a significant loss of institutional knowledge in offering such a buyout given that many of those who are retirement-eligible are also those with the most on-the-job experience.

Given all of these reasons, additional time, research, and vetting would need to take place in order to better understand the impact and/or potential savings from an early retirement incentive. It is for these primary reasons that a buyout was not offered. As always, please let me know if you have any further questions.

2021 BUDGET INITIATIVE

Housing & Homelessness Prevention Investments

Each year, between 15,000 and 20,000 Chicagoans access services while experiencing homelessness. COVID-19 has not only increased the vulnerability of individuals experiencing homelessness, it has also magnified the effects of economic hardship putting more households at risk of homelessness. In 2020, Mayor Lightfoot increased City investments by \$10 million in housing and support services for those without a home. Additionally, the City leveraged more than \$87 million in CARES Act funding in 2020 to provide emergency housing relief and support as well as homelessness prevention.

These services continue to be prioritized for 2021, with a continuation of the \$10 million 2020 commitment. Of the 2021 investment, this includes the \$5 million investment continuing in 2021 for the Flexible Housing Pool (FHP) to rapidly connect individuals with complex needs who are frequently using crisis systems (e.g., emergency rooms, shelters, or jail detention) to supportive housing and increase access to needed services. These investments focus on youth aged 18-24 experiencing homelessness, including those aging out of the foster care system and the formerly incarcerated. The City will also continue its \$5 million 2020 investment in the Chicago Low Income Housing Trust Fund to provide crucial assistance for Chicago's most vulnerable residents, including very low-income households and the formerly incarcerated. The City is also leveraging another \$52.5 million in CARES Act funding for 2021 for housing assistance and homelessness prevention and support.

Additionally, the City is investing an additional \$2 million in 2021 for Renew Woodlawn initiatives that supports the Woodlawn Housing Ordinance passed in 2020. This initiative protects existing Woodlawn residents from displacement, expends homeownership opportunities and ensures inclusive economic growth for the historic south side neighborhood.



2021 BUDGET INITIATIVE

A MENTAL HEALTH FRAMEWORK TO SERVE ALL OF OUR COMMUNITIES

In 2019, Mayor Lightfoot announced the Framework for Mental Health Equity ("The Framework"). Grounded in data, and informed by input from advocates, clinicians, elected officials, community providers, and patients, the Framework provides a roadmap to building a network of publicly funded mental health services in Chicago. It lays out a comprehensive, transformative strategy that can serve tens of thousands of additional Chicagoans by integrating and investing in the full publicly funded mental health system.

The Framework more than doubled the City's mental health budget in 2020 and has enabled the Chicago Department of Public Health (CDPH) to better serve residents in need of mental health support during the COVID-19 pandemic and civil unrest. Funding included new investments in outpatient mental health services in communities of high need, coordination of trauma-informed victim services for people impacted by violence, expansion of community-based treatment teams for people living with serious mental illness (SMI) and co-occurring disorders, and a commitment to coordinate the city's mental health system to ensure every resident can access the care they need, when and where they need it.

In 2021, Mayor Lightfoot will continue investing \$9.3 million from the Corporate Fund and \$10 million in CARES Act funding in The Framework's four mutually reinforcing pillars:

- 1. Strengthen the mental health safety net through expanding mental health services in the neighborhoods of greatest need. Investments in 2020 included support for 32 trauma-informed Centers of Care, including dedicated support for children, adolescents, and young adults. These investments will continue in 2021. Additionally, CDPH mental health clinics were strengthened through facility investments, telehealth, staffing, and crisis answering services. These 32 centers of care combined with the five CDPH Mental Health Clinics comprise a community-based mental health safety net system available to anyone who needs mental health services.
- 2. **Enhance violence prevention programming to address mental health needs**, focusing on the residents and communities most impacted by violence and poverty. As part of the Mayor's Office of Public Safety's comprehensive violence reduction strategy, the City will continue to fund and coordinate community-based organizations and street outreach that reaches individuals at highest risk of violence. This integration of trauma-

informed victims services represents a new level of coordination and collaboration with the City and community-based organizations in an effort to better align mental health resources across Chicago. Investments in 2020 include new funding to provide trauma-informed services to those most impacted by violence after incidents of serious victimization as well as efforts to build the trauma-informed capacity of community stakeholders, including the youth-facing workforce, faith leaders, and employers. These investments will continue in 2021.

3. Fund crisis prevention and response programs for persons living with serious mental illness and co-occurring substance use disorders who have additional needs and who often have difficulty accessing brick-and-mortar clinics. This includes teams delivering community-based care to patients with complex needs who are living in communities with high behavioral health hospitalization rates. By addressing a person's underlying needs, these teams prevent residents from cycling again and again through emergency response systems and first responder services. In 2020, the City invested in Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) and Community Support Teams (CST) in order to scale up access in neighborhoods of need and think beyond brick-and-mortar locations to help reach the many residents who need services outside of clinics. These investments will continue in 2021.

In addition, the City leveraged CARES Act funding to support new integrated healthcare services for persons experiencing homelessness (e.g. shelters, encampments, CTA) that will deliver direct behavioral healthcare services outside the walls of clinics and will include psychiatric assessment services, medication monitoring, and medications for opioid use disorder. These investments continue for 2021.

4. **Coordinate the system of care** by ensuring that everyone in Chicago who needs mental healthcare services knows how to access services. This strategy includes an anti-stigma campaign, a robust helpline, community outreach, and better data on gaps in care.

The only way to begin to close the gap in mental healthcare and address the trauma in Chicago is to transform this broader system.



2021 BUDGET INITIATIVE

COMMUNITY-BASED PUBLIC SAFETY & VIOLENCE REDUCTION INVESTMENTS

In 2020, Mayor Lightfoot made historic investments in the City's violence reduction approach, with an additional \$9 million going toward street outreach, victim services, support for high-risk youth, and trauma-informed trainings. New investments included in the 2021 budget are guided by the strategies outlined in Our City, Our Safety: A comprehensive plan to reduce violence in Chicago, which incorporated wide-reaching community and stakeholder input to determine the City's violence reduction priorities. Mayor Lightfoot is building on the 2020 investment with another \$5.25 million in the 2021 budget, in addition to \$656,000 for the co-responder pilot, bringing the total violence prevention investment for 2021 to \$16.5 million in Corporate Fund resources for community-based violence reduction efforts. Highlights include:

- Expansion of violence prevention programming. In 2020, the City invested \$6 million in street outreach and \$1.5 million victim services, respectively. In 2021, these investments will increase to \$9 million and \$2.25 million to sustain the work of community-based organizations. There will also be additional investments of \$250,000 in youth led violence prevention programming and \$500,000 in microgrants to organizations to support violence prevention activities. In addition, there is \$10 million of CARES Act funding to fill identified gaps in communities with existing street outreach infrastructure and allow the launch of new street outreach programs in identified high-need communities without current infrastructure
- Domestic violence programming. In 2020, the City invested to strengthen the City's response to victims of domestic violence through the domestic violence hotline, increase capacity of shelter services, and services related to counseling and legal advocacy. In 2021, the City will invest an additional \$500,000 in domestic violence programs, recognizing the prevalence of domestic violence in Chicago and its contributions toward community violence. Best practices in this field involve comprehensive supports for family members who have experienced domestic or intimate partner violence and working with perpetrators to change abusive patterns and build healthy relationships.
- Support for high risk youth. In 2021, the City is refocusing existing funds to focus on youth who are at highest risk of violence. These include \$900,000 for a pilot to enhance the quality and types of services provided to youth interacting with the Chicago Police Department (CPD) Juvenile Intervention

and Support Center (JISC), which will also accompany larger structural reforms to youth diversion in Chicago overall.

Additionally, the City is also introducing new programming to support these violence prevention efforts including:

- Co-responder model pilot. The Mayor's Office, Chicago Department of Public Health (CDPH), CPD, Chicago Fire Department (CFD), and the Office of Emergency Management and Communications are collaborating to launch a new co-responder alternative dispatch pilot in 2021. Through this pilot, a trained mental health professional, community paramedic, and Crisis Intervention Team (CIT)-trained police officer will co-respond to certain 911 calls with a mental health component to provide crisis intervention support and connect individuals facing mental health challenges to appropriate services. The City has made an initial investment of \$656,000, in addition to re-allocating resources within CPD and CFD to support this promising model, which recognizes that we must expand how we respond to individuals in crisis.
- There is also \$250,000 for the West Side Initiatives in 2021, a framework of public safety and violence reduction initiatives, focused on key localized projects aimed at reducing violence and improving health outcomes. These investments are in addition to the \$1.5 million already invested by CDPH from previous years, and \$216,000 for personnel costs related to these initiatives, as well the 2020 investment sustained for 2021 of \$500,000 for building community capacity for trauma informed shooting response. These key investments continue to demonstrate that violence reduction is not a law-enforcement only responsibility; there is a significant role for community members to play in violence response, interruption, and de-escalation.

Alderman Cappleman asked for the percentage that residents pay in property taxes that each taxing body receives, as well as a breakdown by residential and commercial properties.

For the most recent tax year, 2019, the City of Chicago, including the Library Fund, receives 25.02 percent of the amount residents pay in property taxes. The table below shows the percentage amount going to each taxing body:

A way to estimate the percentage paid by residential and commercial, is to look at the breakdown of equalized assessed value (EAV) by property class.

- Residential property is 58% of EAV
- Commercial property is 41% of EAV
- Vacant and Non-Profit property is 1% of EAV

Therefore, it is estimated that residential property owners pay 58 percent of property taxes levied by the taxing bodies and commercial property owners 41 percent.

Alderman Martin asked for information regarding vehicular crashes year-over-year with a focus on automated speed camera enforcement.

Each year the Chicago Department of Transportation (CDOT) presents a report on automated speed camera enforcement, the last of which was released in January 2020. The following provides a summary of key results:

Between 2012-2013 and 2017-2018, the number of crashes for all crash types considered in this analysis – except bicycle and pedestrian – increased, both city-wide and at automated speed enforcement locations. However, increases experienced at automated speed enforcement camera locations were significantly lower than those experienced throughout the city as a whole. This fact attests to the effectiveness of the cameras.

- Fatal or serious injury crashes increased 1% near speed cameras between 2012-13 and 2017-18, compared to a 19% increase city-wide.
- Between 2012-13 and 2017-18, overall crash totals increased 4% in the automated speed enforcement locations, compared to a 26% increase in all crashes city-wide.
- Speed-related crashes increased 25% near speed cameras, compared to a 75% increase city-wide.

During our hearing, Alderman Martin asked for the available balance in TIF funds after the 2021 surplus.

TIF surplus is calculated in the following manner:

- All available balance is declared surplus for "Downtown Freeze" TIFs
- Full balance in expiring TIFs
- Remaining neighborhood TIFs will have surplus of available balance declared following a formula:
 - o 100 percent of funds over \$2.5 million
 - o 75 percent of funds between \$1.5 million and \$2.5 million
 - 25 percent of funds between \$750,000 and \$1.5 million
 - Zero percent of funds under \$750,000

The total available balance after subtracting surplus is \$53 million. This balance is spread across neighborhood TIFs and provides some liquidity to the funds ensuring they are able to fund planned projects. On average, TIF districts have \$431,559 in available balance after surplus. No TIF has more than \$1.7 million in available balance after surplus has been returned to the County Clerk.

The City's three percent excise tax on Cannabis sales began July 1, 2020. The 2020 budget estimate of \$1.58 million was based on outside estimates of sales for Illinois as well as the volume and trajectory of the industry in States that has been implemented earlier, specifically in Oregon and Colorado. Based on Statewide sales, the current 2020 year-end estimate is between \$1.5 and \$2 million for 2020.

The current 2021 estimate of \$5.1 million starts with this higher 2020 revenue estimate and extrapolates for future years based on the growth experience in other states, which seemed to reach a stable sales volume in the third year after legalization. This growth includes higher volume, likely to take place at an expanded number of dispensaries.

Content and Purpose

This quarterly report contains an overview of the City's operating revenues and expenditures through the second quarter of 2020, as compared to budgeted amounts, and explains any notable trends or aberrations in these numbers.

The purpose of this quarterly public report on the City's revenues and expenditures is twofold. First, it ensures that the City is consistently monitoring its revenues and expenditures so that it can proactively respond to unanticipated changes or emerging trends, and second, these reports increase the transparency of City finances. The City is ultimately accountable to its taxpayers to use the revenue it brings in efficiently and effectively to deliver the highest quality services, and quarterly public reporting provides taxpayers with the information they need to hold the City to this standard.

The revenue and expenditure information in this report is organized by City fund. For definitions of the City's budgeted funds and revenue sources, please refer to the Budget Overview book and the Budget Forecast report. This report focuses on local fund operating revenues and expenditures. The quarterly budget report does not include information on grant funds, property tax levy, debt service funds, or capital expenditures. Information on those areas can be found in the Budget Overview book.

Timeframe and Limitations

The information in this report is the most accurate and up-to-date information available at the time of publication. However, this report is not an audited financial statement and the numbers provided herein are preliminary and subject to change as the year progresses. No data on revenues and expenditures is final until the City has completed its annual audit and finalized its Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR), which is released in the summer of each year for the prior year. It should be noted that the City balances its budget on an annual basis, and that each fund's revenues and expenditures may not align on a quarterly basis. This is the result of the inherent seasonality of many of these revenue streams and expenses, as is further described in the following pages.

With respect to revenues: The City regularly monitors and adjusts its revenue projections based on to-date revenue performance and other developments that may affect City revenues in order to form a more accurate picture of the City's financial position. As a result of this process, the City develops revenue projections for each month. These projections reflect historical patterns, seasonality, and other known factors that may affect certain revenue streams. These projections are used to develop the "2020 Q2 Budget" amounts shown in the tables in this report. The "2020 Q2 Estimate" presented in the tables in this report are the City's current estimates, as of the date of this report, of its collected revenues through the first quarter. As previously mentioned, no data on revenues and expenditures is final until the City has completed its annual audit and releases its CAFR. The numbers contained in this report remain estimates pending adjustments that will be made as additional information and collections are received by the City. For example, certain revenues, as noted herein, are collected and distributed by the State, and there is a time delay in when information on the amount of actual collections is provided to the City, and in some cases, a delay in when the City receives actual distributions. In addition, a small portion of the fees and fines attributable to a given quarter typically arrive later in the year due to delinquencies and disputed payments, and the actual amount of such revenues is not known until all payments are received.

With respect to expenditures: The "2020 YR Budget" amounts presented in the expenditure tables in this report reflect the total department budget by fund from the 2020 Annual Appropriation Ordinance. The City does not provide quarterly expenditure budget estimates as many expenditures are cyclical, seasonal or otherwise fluctuate and are managed on an ongoing basis to not exceed the total annual appropriations per department. The "2020 Q2 Estimate" for expenditures are extracted directly from the City's financial management system. Expenditures include funds that are encumbered but may not yet have been spent, such as the full-year cost of property rentals and payments under certain technology maintenance and licensing contracts. These figures represent a snapshot of City expenditures at a certain point in time and do not reflect final adjustments made to prepare the City's CAFR.

Certain Finance General expenditures, such as debt payments, healthcare costs, and transfers to other funds, are not entered into the City's financial management system until the end of the year and may not be captured in this report. Also, across all departments and all funds, the payroll expenses for the final pay period of the quarter will not have been entered into the system until the following month, and therefore, are not captured in this report.

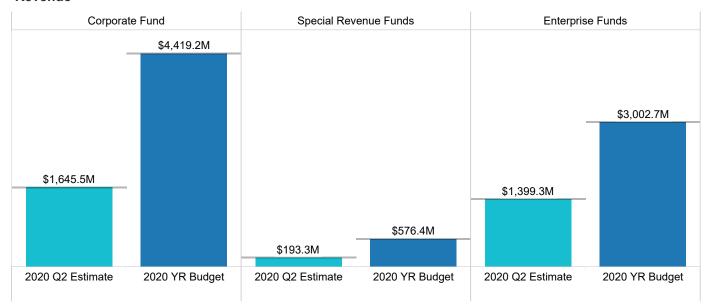


Summary of Local Funds

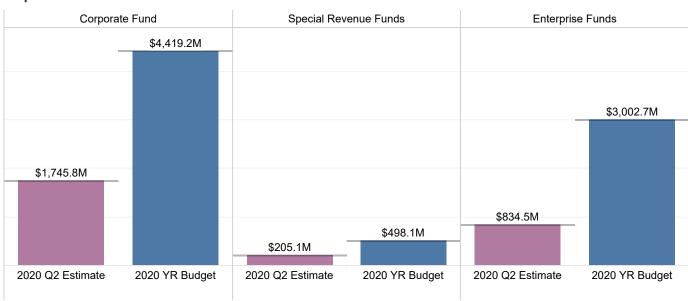
The City's local funds are comprised of the Corporate Fund, Special Revenue Funds, and Enterprise Funds. These funds are the primary funds the City utilizes to support citywide operations including public safety, garbage collection, water and sewer services, and operations at the airports.

Altogether, local fund revenues ended the second quarter below budget at approximately 58.0 percent of full-year budgeted revenue expectations. The second quarter expenditures were roughly 35.2 percent of the full-year budgeted expectations.

Revenue - Corporate Fund

Total Corporate Fund revenues finished the second quarter at 25.2 percent below budgeted expectations due to decreases in most tax revenues and non-tax revenues. The COVID-19 stay-at-home order began on March 21, 2020, and while some restrictions began to be lifted in May, the State of Illinois did not move into a reopening phase until June, impacting Q2 revenues dramatically.

Recreation tax revenue is below budgeted projections for the second quarter by \$42.6 million, or 29.6 percent, driven primarily by a decrease in Amusement Tax. Amusement Tax was impacted early by the COVID-19 pandemic, with the majority of Amusement Tax derived from in-person amusements including sporting events, concerts and theater events.

Transportation tax revenue is also below budgeted expectations in the second quarter by \$71.4 million, or 38.8 percent, heavily impacted by the pandemic and resulting stay-at-home order. This decrease is caused primarily by a \$31.0 million drop in Parking Tax and a \$30.8 million decrease in Ground Transportation Tax.

Business tax revenue decreased \$42.5 million, or 70.2 percent, due to a decrease in Hotel Tax. This loss is due to impacts from the pandemic on both business travel and tourism that were realized as early as February 2020, and continued throughout Q2.

Transaction tax revenue is below budgeted projections for the second quarter by \$28.1 million, or 11.4 percent. This is primarily due a decrease in Real Property Transfer Tax, which decreased by \$19.5 million in Q2. Utility taxes are also below budget by \$16.0 million, or 7.0 percent, mostly driven by a decrease to Gas Tax collections.

The residual Sales Tax revenue from the Sales Tax Securitization Corporation (STSC) through the second quarter was \$221.0 million, 36.8 percent, or \$128.9 million, below budgeted expectations. This is recorded in the category "Proceeds and Transfers In."

Certain sales taxes imposed by the City and collected by the City were not sold to the STSC and therefore do not flow to the STSC. These revenues continue to be reflected in 'Sales and Use Taxes' in the chart on the following pages. In total, the City's Sales and Use Tax revenue experienced a decrease in the second quarter of \$13.5 million, or 27.6 percent. Impacts to STSC residual proceeds as well as City Sales and Use Tax revenues reflect the pandemic impact of the closure of non-essential businesses throughout the majority of the second quarter.

Non-tax revenue is below budget projections for the second quarter by \$178.2 million, or 26.3 percent. This is driven primarily by a few decreases – fines, forfeitures and penalties, charges for services and licenses and permits. Charges for services experienced a decrease of \$130.9 million caused by a backlog of reimbursement receipts as well as decreases to use of services due to the pandemic. Fines, forfeitures and penalties are down \$60.4 million due to lower enforcement and deferrals in response to the pandemic. Licenses and permits are also down \$10.8 million due to fewer licenses and permits during the stay-at-home order.

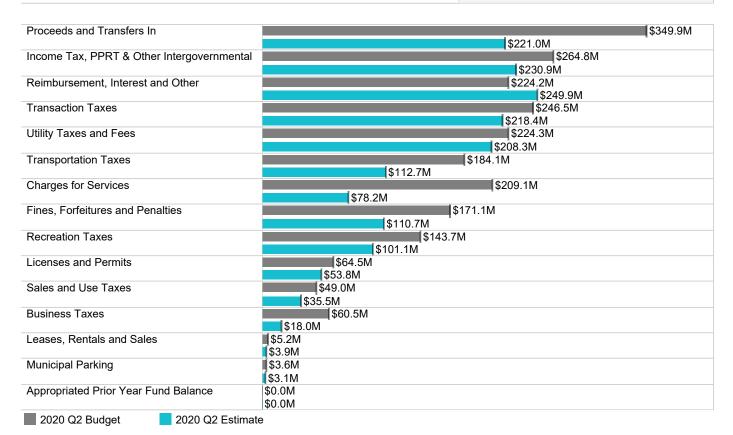

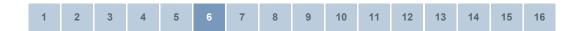

Revenue - Special Revenue Funds

Vehicle Tax Fund

Proceeds from the sale of vehicle stickers consistently make up the largest portion of the Vehicle Tax Fund, with revenues in the second quarter ending below budgeted projections by \$12.5 million or 19.1 percent. Overall, the Vehicle Tax Fund was below budgeted projections in the second quarter by \$20.1 million, or 24.7 percent due to reductions in the vehicle sticker tax, as well as decreases to impoundment, pavement cut and other fees.

Motor Fuel Tax Fund

Revenues in the Motor Fuel Tax (MFT) Fund come from two primary sources – the State's Motor Fuel Tax and revenue from fees paid by tour boat operators and concessionaires along the Riverwalk. Revenue to the MFT Fund was below second quarter budgeted expectations by \$10.2 million, or 17.8 percent, driven by impacts of the stay-at-home order.

Revenue from Chicago Riverwalk concessions and tour boat operations as well as MFT revenues have been pledged to pay debt service on both outstanding MFT bonds and a loan issued by the U.S. Department of Transportation under the Transportation Infrastructure Finance Innovation Act (TIFIA). The City used proceeds from the TIFIA loan to fund expansion of the Chicago Riverwalk.

Garbage Fee Fund

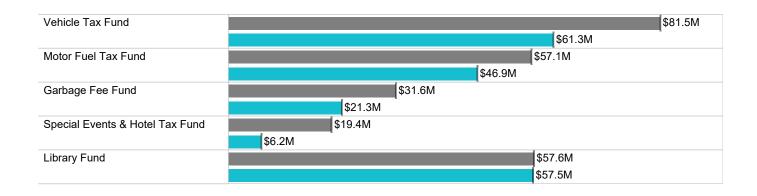
The City collected approximately \$21.33 million in garbage fee revenue in the second quarter, which is below the budget by \$10.3 million, or 32.5 percent. This is primarily due to collections being in arrears, as well as deferred penalties due to the pandemic.

Special Events & Hotel Tax Fund

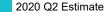
The Special Events and Hotel Tax Fund revenue for the second quarter was significantly below budgeted expectations, a decrease of 68.3 percent, due to decreases to both the Hotel Operators' Occupation Tax by 66.0 percent, and decreases to recreation fees, rentals and other charges by 72.7 percent. These losses are due to impacts from the pandemic on both business travel and tourism, as well as the cancellation of events across the city.

Library Fund

Revenue from the City's Library Fund does not generally fluctuate from budgeted levels, as the majority of this revenue comes from the City's Property Tax levy.

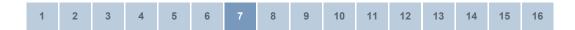

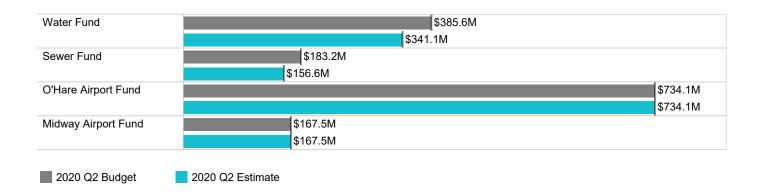
Water and Sewer Funds

The Water and Sewer Funds operate as commercial enterprises with each fund deriving its revenue from charges for service and associated user fees. The Water Fund ended the second quarter below budgeted expectations by 11.6 percent, while the Sewer Fund also ended the quarter below budgeted expectations by 14.5 percent. The Water and Sewer Funds overall budgets reflect the seasonality in usage along with overall reduction in water use attributable to citywide water conservation efforts.

Aviation Funds

The Midway and O'Hare Airport Funds operate as commercial enterprises. Each airport derives its revenue from charges and associated user fees, and revenue is aligned with fund expenditures. Revenues are derived from landing fees and terminal rent payments from the airlines, as well as car rentals, parking, food and beverage sales, and retail concessionaires at the airport locations. Combined, these revenues cover the full cost of airport operations, debt service and the costs incurred by other City departments providing support to the airports.

Expenditures

As stated in the beginning of this document, the "2020 YR Budget" amounts presented in the expenditure tables in this report reflect the total department budget from the 2020 Annual Appropriation Ordinance. The City does not provide quarterly expenditure budget estimates as many expenditures are cyclical, seasonal or otherwise fluctuate and are managed on an ongoing basis to not exceed the total annual appropriations per department and fund.

Finance and Administration

Finance and administration functions include essential City services, such as accounting, contract management, legal and administrative services, and technology and systems expertise. The departments that perform these functions include the City Clerk, the City Treasurer, Department of Finance, Department of Human Resources, Department of Law, Department of Assets, Information and Services, Department of Procurement Services, Office of Budget and Management, and the Office of the Mayor.

Infrastructure Services

Infrastructure services are provided by the Department of Streets and Sanitation (DSS) and the Chicago Department of Transportation (CDOT). Corporate Funds are used to provide City services – recycling and garbage collection; tree trimming and graffiti removal; maintenance of Chicago's streets, sidewalks, and bridges; and the planning and engineering behind this infrastructure. DSS is primarily funded through the Corporate Fund with additional expenditures, including garbage collection, towing and vehicle impoundment, and snow removal funded with Special Revenue Funds. Much of the City's major infrastructure construction performed by CDOT is funded through Special Revenue Funds, State and federal grants, TIF, and bond financings, and thus is not represented as a Corporate Fund expenditure.

Public Safety

Each year, the largest portion of Corporate Fund spending is dedicated to public safety functions, including services provided through the Chicago Police Department, the Chicago Fire Department, the Office of Emergency Management and Communications, the Police Board, and the Civilian Office of Police Accountability (previously called the Independent Police Review Authority). Beginning in 2020, this also includes the Office of Public Safety Administration. Public safety departments have not experienced reductions to the extent that other segments of the workforce have over the past 10 years. Over the last 10 years, public safety positions have made up approximately 60.0 percent of total Corporate Fund expenditures each year.

City Development

City development activities provided through the Department of Planning and Development (DPD) include planning and zoning; the promotion of retail, industrial, and commercial projects. While these activities are mostly funded through State and federal grants, the corporate budget in 2020 included \$11.0 million in funding for DPD. Grant funding for DPD and the projects they support are discussed in more detail in the grants section. In 2019, the City added the Department of Housing, which created a department focused exclusively on supporting access to housing and implementing the City's affordable housing strategies. The Department of Cultural Affairs and Special Events, which manages the promotion of tourism, cultural planning, and the coordination of special events, is supported almost solely by the City's Special Events and Municipal Hotel Operators' Occupation Tax Fund.

Community Services

Community services are provided through the Department of Family and Support Services, the Chicago Department of Public Health, the Chicago Public Library (CPL), and the Mayor's Office for People with Disabilities.

Regulatory

Regulatory services include the activities of six departments. The Department of Buildings enforces design, construction, and maintenance standards and promotes conservation and rehabilitation through permitting and inspection. The Department of Business Affairs and Consumer Protection is responsible for business licensing and consumer protection activities, including the regulation of minimum wage compliance, ground transportation, and food trucks. Additional regulatory departments include the Board of Ethics, Animal Care and Control, Office of the Inspector General and License Appeal Commission.

Legislative and Elections

The legislative and elections departments manage the City's legislative and election functions, while also maintaining and promoting the efficient and accurate administration of all local, State, and federal elections. This includes City Council and its staff, committees and legislative offices, and the Board of Election Commissioners. The City Council is the legislative body of the City of Chicago, consisting of the aldermen elected from each of the 50 wards to serve four-year terms. The Board of Election Commissioners registers voters and administers local, State, and federal elections within Chicago.

Finance General

Citywide expenses include contract and information technology costs, payments for legal costs and settlements and judgments, pension payments, employee benefits and other costs that are budgeted separately from the City's operating departments. These expenses are largely citywide personnel-related expenses such as healthcare costs and workers compensation.

Expenditures - Special Revenue Funds

Special Revenue Funds are established to account for the operations of specific activities and the revenues generated for carrying out those activities. The City's Special Revenue Funds account for revenue from specific sources that by law must be used to finance specific functions, such as road repair, libraries, 911 services, special events, and tourism promotion. In the second quarter, total Special Revenue Fund expenditures totaled 41.2 percent of the total annual appropriation.

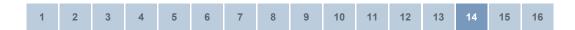

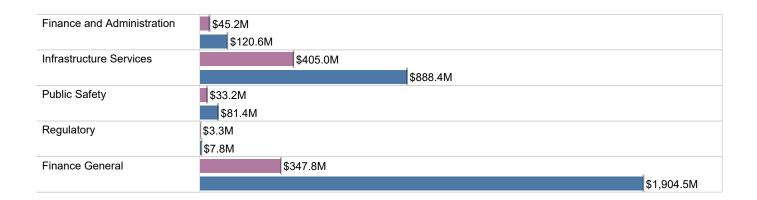

Expenditures - Enterprise Funds

Enterprise Funds are established to account for the acquisition, operation, and maintenance of government services, such as operating the water and sewer systems and the airports. These self-supporting funds operate like commercial enterprises, in that each pays expenses with revenue derived from charges and user fees for the services it supports. The City's four Enterprise Funds are the Water Fund, Sewer Fund, O'Hare International Airport Fund, and Midway International Airport Fund. In the second quarter, total Enterprise Fund expenditures totaled 27.8 percent of the total annual appropriation.

Alderman Hairston requested an update on the new offices created in 2020.

The Office of Public Safety Administration (PSA) worked towards full operationalization in 2020 to align the finance, human resources, information technology and logistics functions of the City's public safety departments. In summer 2020, the Executive Director was appointed, and the Chief Medical Director is expected to begin before the end of the year. PSA also began auditing all cross-departmental equipment, including phones, vehicles and information technology.

The City also implemented the merger of the Department of Fleet and Facility Management with the Department of Information Technology to create the Department of Assets, Information and Services. The merger was designed to ensure day-to-day data and technology services are aligned with the existing shared services model that supports all departments and functions of city government. This merger was completed in January 2020.

The following information is provided in response to questions posed at our department's hearing on October 26, 2020 to discuss the proposed 2021 budget.

Alderman Hadden requested more information regarding the roles and functions of the Mayor's Office public safety section. Below is a summary of the 2020 highlights:

Office of Violence Reduction:

Expanded Mayor Lightfoot's community-based approach to reduce violence:

- Initiated street outreach RFP and launched street outreach funding on May 1, 2020 (Total of \$7.5 million in 2020).
 - Establishing a protocol for street outreach organizations to respond to shooting incidents in hospitals.
 - Working with CDPH to provide more street outreach support for FY21.
- Initiated victim services RFP and launched brand new network of traumainformed victim services in nine communities on the south and west sides, starting May 1, 2020 (Total of \$1.5 million in 2020).
- Developing an RFP to support small organizations with capacity building and to compliment violence prevention activities with street outreach.
- Engaged national violence prevention offices in various cities to share our efforts and to learn about their approaches.

• Engaged partners for an all-hands on deck approach:

Maintained regional coordination meetings with city agencies, community-based organizations, police, state's attorney's office and others in Area 4 and Area 1. We also established a regional coordination meeting in CPD Area 2.

- Launched the Mayor's Office Violence Reduction dashboard as an accessible tool for closer to real-time violence trend data for city agencies and partners who respond to violent incidents.
- Supported weekly discussion between local commanders and street outreach to analyze incidents at the district level.
- Met with over 100 organizations to learn more about their work and what type of support they are requesting.
- Launched the Public Safety newsletter to partners and city-agencies to convey monthly updates on the violence reduction and reform strategy.

• Responded to increased violence during COVID-19 and summer 2020:

- Designated street outreach partner organizations as essential workers to provide COVID-19 messaging and PPEs in their respective communities.
- Coordinated street outreach partners attendance at protests to assist in mediating potential conflicts and minimizing escalation.
- Led daily calls from March 2020 to September 2020 to analyze every shooting in Chicago to determine potential retaliation and necessary follow up. Since September calls have been reduced to twice per week.
- Oversaw the first ever Summer Operation Center, which coordinated the City's response to violence and other public safety issues to ensure better outcomes.

Policy & Operations:

Developed comprehensive violence reduction plan informed by stakeholder engagement:

- Convened over 100 stakeholders including government officials, service providers, faith leaders, philanthropic and university partners, and advocates to form a Violence Prevention Planning (VPP) Committee, which was tasked with developing recommendations to reduce violence in the city of Chicago.
- Convened a public safety Research Advisory Council (RAC) comprised of representatives from various local universities and research-based institutions. The RAC supported the identification of metrics for measuring progress and provided input on overarching goals as well as evidence supporting various approaches.
- Based on the input from the VPP Committee and the RAC, drafted and published a 108-page violence reduction plan titled 'Our City, Our Safety: A Comprehensive Plan to Reduce Violence in Chicago.'

• Addressed community needs through improving policing:

- Initiated a juvenile diversion reform process, including convening stakeholders and partners to advise on diversion work, implementing short-term changes to the current JISC facility, expanding the scope of work of on-site service providers at JISC, and also developing a re-imagined vision for youth diversion in the longterm.
- Coordinated the CPD/CPS School Resource Office working group to review the current CPD policy. The working group convened for five two-hour sessions to create a list of recommendations to improve the current CPD SRO policy.
- Re-structured the Chicago Council on Mental Health Equity (CCMHE) in conjunction with the Chicago Department of Public Health to address the City's response to persons experiencing a mental or behavioral crisis.

Coordinated city departments for increased capacity and improved safety outcomes:

- Convened the Public Safety Cabinet--comprised of eighteen City departments and sister agencies--quarterly to improve coordination on public safety issues per consent decree requirement. Among other initiatives, the Public Safety Cabinet meetings are used to coordinate summer safety efforts and help to promote cross-departmental collaboration and the coordination of resources.
- o Coordinated departmental responses and follow up work to OIG reports.
- Hired seven new full time staff members (3 Policy Advisors, 1 Policy Assistant, 1 Regional Coordinator, 1 Victim Services Coordinator, 1 Community Engagement Coordinator)

Alderman Lopez asked about the City's ability to negotiate changes to existing employee workweeks.

The City has the right to establish employee or work schedules for employees. These schedules must follow the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) and any applicable provisions of a Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) for represented employees. FLSA, in broad strokes, limits FLSA Non-Exempt employees to 40 hours of work in a work week, with hours beyond 40 paid at the overtime rate. CBAs generally allow for changing an employee's work schedule with proper notification given to the union and employee as defined in the applicable CBA. Under some of our CBAs, there are certain circumstances where union consent or bargaining is required prior to changing work schedules (e.g., when permanently changing the start time beyond the window set forth in the CBA). Provisions for uniformed and sworn members of the Chicago Fire Department and Chicago Police Department respectively, adhere to different FLSA rules and their CBAs tend to be more restrictive about changing employee schedules.

In some cases, historical work practices and/or side letters have been negotiated that may dictate employee work schedules, so any changes in those instances may require bargaining. It is also possible that changes that adversely impact union employees may result in grievances, arbitration and/or impact bargaining. Regardless, the City maintains management rights to establish employees' schedules according to operational needs.

As part of this transition, one of the top goals will be to improve job satisfaction and therefore, increase job retention, by designing a structure that helps to recognize the importance of their role through employee appreciation while also fostering stronger relationships with the school communities they serve.

Some of the immediate transition plans include a "welcome orientation" that serves as a virtual "meet and greet" with CPS team members to build relationships while also sharing important information and answering questions. In addition, CPS is considering other ideas such as listening sessions to get input from the crossing guards on how they can improve the program.

Finally, the new plan will address existing vacancies and attrition concerns by promoting the opportunities through community organizations while also simplifying the hiring process.

The following information is provided in response to questions posed at our department's hearing on October 26, 2020 to discuss the proposed 2021 budget.

Alderman Sigcho-Lopez requested the Chicago Police Department (CPD) but for settlements and judgements in 2019 and 2020, the actual expenditures, and information on how the difference is made when the expenditures exceed the budget.

In 2019, CPD's Corporate Fund settlements and judgements budget was \$35 million, and was increased in 2020 to \$82.6 million. In 2019, a total of \$58.8 million was spent on CPD settlements and judgments, and in 2020, \$46.4 million has been spent as of September 30th.

Over the past several years, the City has been increasing the Corporate Fund budget for expenses incurred in connection with settlements and judgments against the City. In 2016, the City issued a bond to pay for a large portion of settlements and judgments, a portion of which has been used since then annually to cover the amount that exceeds the budget.
