Alderman Osterman asked what level of funding would be required to construct all needed accessible housing citywide and best practices from other cities for accessible housing.

MOPD will be working with the Department of Housing (DOH) to conduct mid construction accessibility assessments. This will help ensure that housing units are built according to Code and the designs presented during permit reviews. MOPD will also be working with DOH to develop a tracking process for accessible units to ensure that the City knows the quantity and locations of any accessible units being built.

MOPD on occasion does look into what other cities are doing for accessible housing. They provide interesting ideas, but no one city has a model that is appropriate for Chicago.

The following information is provided in response to questions posed at our department's hearing on November 9, 2020 to discuss the proposed 2021 budget.

Alderman Moore asked for information about disability services for seniors.

The Small Accessible Repairs for Seniors (SARFS) program provides safety, security and accessibility improvements that help senior citizens to remain in their homes. Repair types are limited to minor repairs that may include, but are not limited to:

- Grab bars
- Lever faucets
- Door repairs
- Carbon monoxide detectors
- Smoke detectors
- Wheelchair ramps

SARFS is for Chicago seniors who earn no more than 80 percent of the area's medium income and are at least 60 years of age. Qualified recipients may be owners or renters residing in a one- to four-unit building (a renter must have permission from the landlord and the landlord needs to certify that he or she will not increase the rent as a direct result of SARFS improvements).

<u>Delegate agencies</u>, under contract to the Department of Planning and Development are available to assist seniors with the following:

- Application process
- Make on-site assessments to determine service needs
- Provide limited home improvements at no cost to the applicant

Residents must provide proof of age, income, and ownership, or owner/agent approval at time of application.

Alderman Mitts asked for MOPD leadership and their responsibilities:

Rachel Arfa, Commissioner leads the City of Chicago's efforts to make Chicago a more accessible city.

Laurie Dittman, Senior Policy Analyst oversees the departments; Identifies and directs MOPD's legislative priorities and spearheads department accessibility compliance and policy initiatives. The unit also helps promote an understanding of issues concerning people with disabilities, from high-level initiatives to community outreach and education. Specific issues include emergency preparedness, pedestrian safety and accessible transportation. Position also serves as MOPD's FOIA officer.

Joseph Albritton, Deputy Commissioner oversees DHS/Substance Abuse Prevention Program for the Deaf grant, SSA/Work Incentives Planning and Assistance grant, Empowered Cities grant Illinois Telecommunications Access Corporation (ITAC) program, and MOPD Youth Employment Program/One Summer Chicago and Training Services.

Vacant, Deputy Commissioner of Accessibility and Compliance oversees accessibility plan reviews, technical assistance and information about federal, state and local accessibility codes and laws.

Kimberly Taylor, Deputy Commissioner of Finance and Administration is responsible for fiduciary matters; paying of invoices, contracting, delegate agencies, human resource matters; liaison with other administrative departments. Oversight of Access Chicago, and direct service staff for the Disability Resource Unit, Independent Living Program, Personal Assistance Homemaker, HomeMod Program and Housing Assistance, outreach and education.
