The refuse charges began January of 2020 and is \$9.50 per month. The eligibility is determined through both Department of Finance and the Department of Streets & Sanitation.

The following information is provided in response to questions posed at our department's hearing on October 5, 2021 to discuss the proposed 2022 budget.

Alderman Tunney asked for information regarding what measures are in place to ensure Republic, Waste Management, and other Private Services used by the City comply with their contracts, who is monitoring performance and 311 complaints for missed service, and if there is a long-term plan to either eliminate the use of Private Services for Recycling and/or expand the Private Service to encompass the entire City as opposed to select areas.

- 1) DSS monitors their tonnage daily. CDPH conducts inspections twice a month for compliance. MWDBE compliance is monitored by the Department of Procurement.
- 2) All 311 complaints for missed service are monitored by DSS staff. Additionally, 311 complaints for missed recycling service are monitored by our vendor and by DSS to ensure completion.
- 3) The Department entered into a new vendor agreement (in June 2021) for private recycling services and will be evaluating the services throughout the course of the agreement.

The following information is provided in response to questions posed at our department's hearing on October 5, 2021 to discuss the proposed 2022 budget.

Alderman Tunney asked for the compliance rate of the amended recycling ordinance that took effect on January 1, 2017, the number of properties out of compliance in the 44th Ward and the number of non-compliance citations that have been issued.

The 2021 compliance rate for the recycling inspection is 83%. In 2021, there have been 17 recycling inspection requests entered for properties in the 44th ward. Currently, 7 of those requests are open. The recycling inspection is a complaint driven response. DSS inspects properties that have been reported as non-compliant. In 2021, twenty (20) citations have been issued city-wide for the recycling ordinance.
