Alderman Ervin asked what the indirect cost calculation is for MOPD and how it is calculated.

Alderman Reilly asked how much each MOPD delegate agency is receiving and what services they provide.

Access Living

\$290,000 (CDBG)

Access Living provides case management services for MOPD's Personal Assistance Program

#### **ASI**

\$470,000 (CDBG)

ASI hires and manages Personal Assistants who are assigned to provide services to people with disabilities who receive services (up to six hours of assistance in their homes per week).

Extended Home Living Services (EHLS)

\$1,947,000 (CDBG)

\$100,000 (CHA funding

EHLS implements home modifications through construction and renovations.

Independent Living Solutions (ILS)

\$749,000 (CDBG)

\$400,000 (corporate fund) \$450,000 (funding from Department of Housing SARFS program)

Ada S. McKinley \$5,000,000 (CLFRP)

Ada S. McKinley was selected through the RFP process to administer the Diverse Learners Cash Assistance program which will grant \$500 to students with disabilities who meet income requirements and who were adversely impacted by Covid-19.

The following information is provided in response to questions posed at our department's hearing on October 25, 2023 to discuss the proposed 2024 budget.

Alderman Hadden asked for recommendations on how City Council can increase disability access.

MOPD has worked with the City Clerk's office to increase accessibility of City Council in the following ways:

# **Main Floor & Lower Gallery**

- A handrail was installed on the wall side of the ramp leading up to the Witness Area.
- Informational signage was installed identifying Lower Gallery accessible seating.
- The number of wheelchair spaces in the Lower Gallery was increased from six to ten.
- Automatic door openers with wall-mounted touchless activators were installed to open the double doors leading to the Main Floor from the Annex Room.
- Transition of sloped floor and seating aisles. Installed a trip guard warning strip at all
  edges that will allow persons with visual impairments to identify the edge of the floor
  level change.
- Assistive Listening Systems were installed.

#### **Annex Room Restrooms**

- In the Women's Restroom accessible stall, the sidewall grab bar was reinstalled to extend 54" from the rear wall.
- The doors into the restrooms were prepared for the installation of automatic door openers.
- The telephones in the Annex Room were removed (these were mounted too high).

MOPD will continue to partner with the City Clerk's Office and the Sargeant-at-Arms on increasing accessibility including around communication access. This can include effective open/closed captioning, American Sign Language interpretation, materials in alternate formats and any other access needs.

ID#: 48-06 Emergency Power Chair Transport

The following information is provided in response to questions posed at our department's hearing on October 25, 2023 to discuss the proposed 2024 budget.

Alderman Sicho-Lopez asked for additional information regarding the \$250,000 to be allocated to a delegate agency for emergency power chair transport.

MOPD will issue a Request for Proposals (RFP) to invite applications for a delegate agency who can provide emergency and on-demand pickup of powerchairs on a short/emergency basis, for people with disabilities who experience medical and other emergencies. This will allow for secure and safe transport of power wheelchairs. For example, a person with a disability who utilizes a power wheelchair is at Navy Pier and experiences a medical emergency, they may be taken by ambulance to an emergency room. This will create a protocol for the safe transport of their power chair since the power chair is unable to fit in the ambulance and will then be transported by the delegate agency.

We will collaborate with our public safety and transportation agencies and stakeholders to build out this new model.

Duckworth/DOJ Disabled Survivors of Gun & Community Violence Project Coordinator (1) Status: Position is currently posted, scheduled to close on November 8, 2023.
