The City reviewed the types and locations of damages experienced from severe storms during the 2023 and 2024 summers, identifying concentrated impact on the West Side.



Unmet Needs Assessment (Pages 17-52)

The City assessed the three core areas of disaster recovery (housing, infrastructure, and economic revitalization) and identified \$970M in unmet need. The need is greatest in infrastructure, where the Department of Water Management estimates at least \$919M is needed to upgrade the West Side's infrastructure to protect homes and businesses.



Mitigation Needs Assessment (Pages 53-60)

Leveraging the <u>2024 Cook County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan</u>, the City determined that urban flooding is the greatest natural hazard risk faced by Chicago residents. This section summarizes past projects and proposals for investments that will improve the City's ability to handle severe storms without extensive damage.



Proposed Use of Funds (Pages 61-74)
