1 MS. VAUGHN: All right, so welcome, everyone. We should do a quick roll call. I'm Latoya Vaughn 2 with the Office of Budget Management. I manage the 3 grants for the City. 4 5 MR. McCLARN: I'm Graylen McClarn. I'm in grants administration as well, and I oversee the 6 7 delegates. I'm your friend. MS. CHERNAWSKY: I'm Kirstin Chernawsky with 8 9 Erie Neighborhood House. MS. BUTTS: Pam Butts, New Eclipse Community 10 11 Alliance. 12 MS. VAUGHN: All right. So we can get 13 started with updates from the last meeting. So we 14 met with the subcommittees I want to say maybe 15 three weeks ago. And from there, we were supposed 16 to give you guys a full package that included the 17 recommendations from the last committee as well as some new recommendations that were made from our 18 19 analysts regarding some additional money that we 20 received from HUD this year that we were planning 21 to reallocate next year in the event that we can 22 get those dollars. It's about \$6.8 million that 23 we're hoping to redistribute. But we have not been 24 able to finalize that analyst report because the

1 mayor announced more recently that we're going to be creating a Department of Housing. And so we 2 3 want to make sure that we have support for that 4 department. So they -- the analysts are now 5 looking to see how we can support the Department of Housing activities with CDBG money. That's always 6 7 been a priority is to make sure that, you know, the roof repairs are occurring. I think that's the --8 9 MR. McCLARN: And porches. 10 MS. VAUGHN: Roofs and porches. So we want 11 to continue those services and make sure that the 12 new department has enough administration, so that's 13 one thing that they're evaluating right now. And I 14 was told that we would have a more definitive 15 analyst report or analysis from the analyst report 16 for the next CDAC committee, but that is going to 17 be after we present the draft action plan. But that's not to say we still won't have time to 18 incorporate funding priorities. And likely some of 19 20 the priorities that you guys are already reviewing 21 are things that we've already incorporated in the 22 budget. We just need to kind of cross-check to 23 make sure that those priorities are the same and 24 consistent with what you guys have done a review of.

1	We also asked each of the
2	subcommittee members to come together separately to
3	kind of talk about things in a group that they
4	would like to prioritize and present. So this
5	meeting, we're going to kind of see if you guys had
6	a chance to complete the first half based on the
7	prior committee's recommendations. And to see if
8	you guys have anything that you can prioritize and
9	recommend or discuss openly today.
10	We can also follow up at the next
11	committee to show any progress that we've made and
12	kind of provide that analysis for the next for
13	the increased allocation.
14	So that's the update that I have.
15	Some housekeeping notes also is we do have so
16	we're in budget season right now. I think we plan
17	on presenting our budget I want to say October
18	15th. And then we're going to be doing a public
19	hearing for the CDBG program on the 17th of
20	October. We will post on the OBM website when the
21	date is finalized and when the location is
22	finalized. And also, we're going to be posting it
23	in the local newspapers, so Sun Times, Hoy, and
24	Tribune.

1	MR. McCLARN: Defender.
2	MS. VAUGHN: Oh, the Defender.
3	That's pretty much all I have for
4	updates and open items. But I'm going to open the
5	floor to the members.
6	MS. BUTTS: Pam Butts. We didn't meet the
7	subcommittee didn't meet because we were waiting
8	for the analyst's recommendation.
9	MS. VAUGHN: I was worried about that.
10	MS. BUTTS: Yeah, so
11	MS. VAUGHN: Did you get a chance to review
12	the prior committee's recommendations.
13	MS. BUTTS: I did, but we didn't meet as a
14	committee to review it. Because I think that we
15	were thinking that, you know, we had to look at the
16	analyst and kind of make a decision based on the
17	additional \$6.8 million.
18	So I did send an e-mail to David,
19	and I think I copied you guys too.
20	MS. VAUGHN: I did see that.
21	MS. BUTTS: And I asked like the status and
22	that, but I didn't get a response.
23	MS. VAUGHN: I got the update this morning
24	from David, and he wanted me to let the committee

1 know that due to the newly created Department of 2 Housing, the funding priorities and analysis has 3 been taken into a different direction until they 4 can get more information that they can provide to 5 the CDAC committee, it's going to be on hold. But 6 he did promise we would have something for the next 7 committee.

8 And we are in budget season, so the decisions are being made kind of quickly. I 9 shouldn't say quickly. Decisions are being 10 11 reviewed, and it takes a little bit of time for us 12 to finalize things. And then by the time we 13 actually meet as a group, it's maybe a month or two 14 later, so it's a little bit difficult to coordinate 15 those efforts in the midst of the budget season, so I think that's another risk or another challenge 16 17 that we face with the committee.

One thing I will say is we do have another person coming on board within the budget office to manage the CPG program. This person is set to start on the 8th. And one thing I do recognize since I've been a part of this committee is we've had two -- we've had some transition. So it's been difficult to kind of get all the

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1 information that we need and all the members on board. So that's been a challenge as well. So I 2 3 do recognize that. But did you get a chance to review 4 5 any of those recommendations, and do you have any comments or feedback? 6 7 MS. CHERNAWSKY: I saw the previous, the ones from the last group. Yes, to be honest, I didn't 8 9 know that today we were supposed to like present 10 thoughts on that, so I didn't really prepare 11 anything. 12 MS. VAUGHN: No worries. 13 MS. CHERNAWSKY: I think it would be helpful 14 to know what the expectations are for the next 15 meeting so that we can come prepared. And I know 16 for me, for the subcommittees, is there a lead of 17 each subcommittee? Or if there's not, if you could maybe assign a lead or send an e-mail to each 18 subcommittee with expectations of what they're to 19 20 do so that we can come prepared to the next 21 meeting. 2.2 MS. VAUGHN: Yes. So we don't have -- I don't think we have a lead established. We just 23 24 sent out a list to all the members of all the

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1	places that they identify that they would like to
2	participate, and then we just shared each other's
3	contact information so we can reach out. But we
4	never established a lead, which would have been
5	ideal to make sure that
6	MR. McCLARN: You all usually do that on your
7	own in the subcommittees.
8	MS. VAUGHN: Oh, then they would pick a lead.
9	MS. BUTTS: Yeah. So I know that Anthony and
10	I have been in contact, and you know, so we were
11	going to make sure we contact everybody else once
12	we got that information.
13	MS. CHERNAWSKY: I can just informally then
14	take the lead with my subcommittee, but then just
15	knowing, yeah, what the expectation is for the next
16	meeting.
17	MS. VAUGHN: For the next meeting, what I'm
18	hoping to have is that list to you guys from the
19	analyst's recommendations. We do have 6.8 million
20	that we are hoping to allocate to either new or
21	existing activities. It's really open to a host of
22	different, you know, stakeholders to see what the
23	best path would be to fund those types of
24	activities and identify if it's going to be an

existing activity or a new activity. 1 2 One concern or risk is that this might be a one time or short or limited funding 3 allocation. So we don't want to fund things 4 5 that -- like salaries, for example. You might not 6 want to fund something where you may have to lay off a person or you might not want to fund 7 something where you have to establish a new program 8 and then it has to end because we don't have enough 9 10 funding to support the activity. So we want to be 11 cognizant of that. 12 So I would say by the time we meet 13 the next time -- and we'll send out an updated 14 meeting notice just to make sure we've reviewed 15 quickly. Because what we'd like to do is leverage 16 the previous committee's recommendations, do a 17 review of that to see if it's still relevant, or if you guys want to make an updated recommendation. 18 And then also give you guys the analysis from the 19 20 analyst, which basically provided a list of 21 eligible activities that the City could fund with 22 CDBG dollars. That will be based on like a one- or 23 two-time funding stream as opposed to a consistent 24 funding stream.

1	So if we can get that information to
2	you guys, we'd love for you to take that into
3	consideration when you review the prior committee's
4	recommendations. And then come to you'll meet
5	separately with your group and then come to the
б	table with more feedback that you can provide or
7	maybe a final recommendation from each group,
8	dependent on what you guys selected. Whether it
9	was citizen participation or housing or, you know,
10	those types of things.
11	Now we know for sure that we're
12	probably going to be for sure and the word
13	probably. So now we are certain that certain
14	that we're going to be including the Department of
15	Housing in the budget, so we'll we breaking out the
16	Department of Planning and Development into
17	Housing. So if you guys want to take a special
18	look into the housing section to see if you
19	know, what funding considerations we have already
20	kind of considered are baked in.
21	By the next time we meet, it's going
22	to be after we present the budget recommendation,
23	which is going to be that draft draft action

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1 chance to look at that as well. So I would also 2 take the draft action plan with the current funding 3 recommendations into consideration with the 4 analyst's recommendations, along with the last 5 committee's recommendations and kind of bake those 6 together into something formal that you guys can 7 submit.

8 MS. BUTTS: Okay. I guess we were under the 9 impression that we had to make some decision prior 10 to October 17th. Is that --

11 MS. VAUGHN: That's what we were hoping. 12 That we could take some of your considerations into 13 the draft action plan. That's a challenge right 14 now because we didn't get those analyst reports 15 completed. What I'm hoping is that a lot of things 16 that we're currently doing is stuff that we built 17 on from prior committees and that we're kind of on the same path and not too far from it. 18

We will have more time to make some recommendations for funding for additional allocations. So what we were planning to do in the budget office is set aside some funding for priorities, so that will be an opportunity. It will be a budget revision, but it will be an

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1	opportunity for us to go and break out the funding
2	to distribute costs to different departments or
3	different initiatives within the CDBG eligibility.
4	So we do have some options in place
5	but not much flexibility.
6	MS. CHERNAWSKY: So still ideally you'd like
7	this feedback by October 17th?
8	MS. VAUGHN: Let me see when our next
9	committee meeting is.
10	MS. CHERNAWSKY: Or you just want it by the
11	next committee meeting?
12	MS. VAUGHN: By the next committee meeting
13	would be perfect. So we have a public hearing to
14	talk about the draft action plan and to prepare for
15	the CAPER in the October 17th meeting. So that's
16	when we typically discuss it, at that meeting. But
17	when we meet as a CDAC committee, that's when we
18	pull together more proposals on how we're going to
19	split out the money. And then to see if we have
20	any established funds available or any other
21	options.
22	MS. CHERNAWSKY: You're saying even if it's
23	after the 17th that's when we can do a budget
24	revision.

1	MS. VAUGHN: Exactly.
2	I'm going to check to see when the
3	next CDAC committee is scheduled. So the next
4	committee meeting is scheduled for November 15th.
5	The CDBG allocation goes live January 1st through
6	December of 2019, so any time between that we'll be
7	able to make adjustments to the funding,
8	specifically for money that we've set aside that's
9	going to be set aside in our in the budget
10	office's costs.
11	MS. BUTTS: What date in January?
12	MS. VAUGHN: January 1st is the start date of
13	the CDBG program, and it goes through December 31st.
14	MS. CHERNAWSKY: And is the meeting on the
15	15th at 2:00 or 2:30?
16	MS. VAUGHN: It is at 2:00 o'clock. And it's
17	going to be in this room, 1103?
18	Correction. I'm sorry. It's going
19	to be in City Hall Room 604, 2:00 o'clock,
20	November 15th. It's a full CDAC.
21	MS. CHERNAWSKY: I'm sorry. You said
22	room 604.
23	MS. VAUGHN: Room 604.
24	It just hit me the August 20th

1	meeting was set for 2:30. I think that's why I
2	thought this one was 2:30. Random thoughts.
3	That's pretty much all I had on the
4	agenda for today to kind of have some open
5	discussions to talk about planning and
6	recommendations and give you guys an update on
7	where we were with the funding priorities and pubic
8	hearings.
9	Is there anything else you guys want
10	to talk about? We definitely can.
11	Graylen's not going to say much.
12	MR. McCLARN: I'm sorry.
13	MS. CHERNAWSKY: You said more than I thought
14	you were going to say.
15	MR. McCLARN: I generally don't say anything.
16	MS. BUTTS: That's all I have right now. We
17	can certainly contact the folks and get together.
18	MS. VAUGHN: And I like that you said you're
19	going to informally kind of assign yourself as the
20	lead. Can you let your committee know you've been
21	assigned as the lead? Because I agree with that
22	designation.
23	And Pam, if you're okay or
24	Pamela, I'm sorry, if you're okay, you could be the

1	lead for your committee?
2	MS. BUTTS: I don't know. I don't know if
3	we're on the same ones.
4	MS. CHERNAWSKY: I don't know if we are
5	either. I was just trying to find my e-mail to see
б	who signed up for what. And you don't have that
7	with you, do you?
8	MS. VAUGHN: I do not have it with me.
9	MR. McCLARN: I can send it back out to
10	everyone.
11	MS. CHERNAWSKY: I know I have it saved
12	somewhere. I was just trying to see
13	MS. BUTTS: I have it.
14	MS. VAUGHN: If you guys are on separate
15	committees, I would love for you to be the leads.
16	MS. BUTTS: Sure.
17	MS. CHERNAWSKY: Here it is.
18	MR. McCLARN: It's almost time to go through
19	the application process again.
20	MS. CHERNAWSKY: I'm on public service.
21	You're on citizenship.
22	MS. BUTTS: So I'll take citizenship.
23	MS. CHERNAWSKY: So we're on separate ones.
24	MS. BUTTS: Right on. It worked out.

1	MS. VAUGHN: We're sitting here in front of
2	two leads on our subcommittee, and I really
3	appreciate you guys taking the lead on that.
4	One thing that Graylen just brought
5	up, and I'm glad he did, is the application renewal
6	process. So we're going the be renewing our CDAC
7	committee, and I really hope you guys have
8	reapplied. Like I said, we have another resource
9	coming to our office who's going to be more
10	dedicated to the CDBG program. And he can be a
11	better lead for the subcommittees and the full. So
12	I'm really, really looking forward to the next
13	round, and to leverage everything we've done in the
14	past to kind of make it better.
15	We did not get a chance to do tours.
16	We were hoping to do some tours across the
17	community, so that's still on the table for the
18	next committee. I think that application process
19	is going to be starting soon, and we'll send out an
20	e-mail notice to everybody. But we have to have
21	folks identified I think by February, because I
22	think this expires in this membership expires
23	May 31, 2019, so we'll be working to vet new
24	members, accept applications.

1	If you guys know anybody that would
2	love to be a member, please feel free to share that
3	notice that we sent out. It's going to go out
4	through e-procurement.
5	MR. McCLARN: Yes. That's where you're going
6	to do the application. It will be processed
7	through there as well. We were looking for people
8	like yourselves. It's like please bring some to
9	the table, you know.
10	MS. VAUGHN: Active members, members that are
11	really active in the community that can bring good
12	ideas to the table. Typically we fund the same
13	activities as it relates to like the EHAP program
14	or senior service activities. We fund those same
15	things every year because typically those are the
16	areas of need. But if you guys know of new areas
17	of need, certainly bring those to the table.
18	If you know of anybody that's
19	willing to participate, we'd love to get our
20	membership up and be more active. And like I said,
21	we have a new member coming to our team that's
22	going to help bring some more that's going to
23	help extend our resources, which we're really
24	looking forward to. So I would love for you guys

1	to share and spread the word. We'll post any of
2	you guys are posting when you actually complete the
3	application online and make it available for the
4	public to respond. But please feel free to share
5	anybody that you feel is relevant.
6	MS. BUTTS: Is there a maximum number of
7	members that you guys
8	MS. VAUGHN: I don't think we have a maximum
9	number.
10	MR. McCLARN: 40 was supposedly the original
11	number, but that was high, and then it started to
12	shrink.
13	MS. VAUGHN: So I don't think we have any
14	statutory requirements to keep it at a certain
15	level. HUD asks us to make sure we have citizen
16	participation, and so we want to make sure that
17	this complies with the citizen participation
18	requirement. So you know, any citizen that wants
19	to participate is definitely welcome to this
20	committee, and we invite as many people as
21	possible. So
22	MR. McCLARN: And we also look for you to
23	bring citizens into the public hearings because we
24	need to know what they think as well.

1	MS. VAUGHN: Just because we fund something		
2	every year doesn't mean that it's working or maybe		
3	we can kind of tweak the formula a little bit. I		
4	know we talked about bringing departments in as		
5	well with the community tours, bringing departments		
6	in to give you an idea of what they do in the		
7	department and how we can better serve communities		
8	and pull together program outcomes better. So		
9	that's definitely something that can be on the		
10	table for recommendations.		
11	I don't know if you guys had a		
12	chance to look at like the calfer not the		
13	calfer, I'm sorry the CAPER. That's our		
14	Comprehensive Annual Performance Evaluation Report.		
15	But that will show you our performance target and		
16	our performance levels for each one of our		
17	programs, and so that's available on the OBM		
18	website. The most recent version is 2017.		
19	MS. CHERNAWSKY: Did you send a link? In the		
20	last e-mail you sent, I just see for the final		
21	action plan.		
22	MS. VAUGHN: The final action plan, and it		
23	might have been one before that. I'm not sure.		
24	But the final action plan and the CAPER are on the		

1	same website, so you should be able to access it
2	from the CityofChicago.org/budget site. And then
3	under that, it will be an option towards the bottom
4	that says "What We Do," and then if you click on
5	Grants Administration, you'll be able to see
6	different types of information. And then we also
7	have
8	MS. CHERNAWSKY: If you could send a link to
9	that in like
10	MS. VAUGHN: Absolutely. I'm trying to
11	remember
12	MS. CHERNAWSKY: I'm like you know, not
13	that I don't have complete faith in navigating the
14	City's website, but
15	MS. VAUGHN: I got you. Okay. So we'll send
16	a link to the 2017 CAPER.
17	MS. CHERNAWSKY: Then as my subcommittee
18	lead, I'll make sure that we
19	MS. VAUGHN: See, this newly established
20	leadership is working well.
21	So we'll send the 2017 CAPER link,
22	and then we'll also send just a quick expectation
23	for the next meeting, what we hope what we're
24	going to bring to the table, which is that analysis

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1	of eligible funding activities, as well as we're	
2	going to should we send out that report again or	
3	you guys okay with that or	
4	MS. CHERNAWSKY: I have it.	
5	MS. BUTTS: Which one? The final?	
6	MS. VAUGHN: The recommendation for final.	
7	No, not the final action. The recommendation from	
8	the prior group just to kind of	
9	MS. CHERNAWSKY: Oh, resend that.	
10	MS. BUTTS: Yeah, I have that too.	
11	MS. CHERNAWSKY: Let's see. Yeah, if you	
12	could wait, no, is that attached on here? I	
13	think that's attached.	
14	MS. VAUGHN: Because I'll reference it. I'll	
15	say, you know, this is the expectations for the	
16	next meeting. We want you guys to take a look at	
17	this, that, and the other. It will be the 2019	
18	draft action review. We'll send you 2017 CAPER.	
19	We'll send the recommendation from prior	
20	committees, and then we'll send that report that	
21	you've been waiting for, which is that analysis of	
22	eligible funding.	
23	And then after we get all that	
24	together, the leaders, you guys will work with your	

1	subcommittees to kind of formalize a recommendation.			
2	MS. CHERNAWSKY: So the only subcommittee not			
3	represented here is Affordable Housing, right?			
4	MS. VAUGHN: Sounds about right. I'm going			
5	to go with yes.			
6	MS. CHERNAWSKY: And then the people on here			
7	that don't that aren't assigned, you'll we'll			
8	just			
9	MS. VAUGHN: We'll assign them leaders.			
10	We'll say you've been volunteered because you are			
11	MS. CHERNAWSKY: Told.			
12	MS. VAUGHN: told because you missed			
13	the meeting, and I know you asked for a conference			
14	call. And so we didn't do a conference call. We			
15	just assigned you to a committee as lead. Welcome.			
16	So we'll work with the subcommittee.			
17	You guys will work with the subcommittees to make			
18	final recommendations, and our next meeting will be			
19	November 15th at 2:00 p.m., room 603.			
20	MS. BUTTS: It looks like Sheryl Holman is			
21	assigned housing citizen, and she's on all of them			
22	so			
23	MS. CHERNAWSKY: Is that a different one?			
24	MR. McCLARN: She's on all of them.			

1	MS. BUTTS: Yes.			
2	MS. VAUGHN: We did have some people like			
3	that.			
4	MR. McCLARN: So Sheryl Holman, since she			
5	wants to be all over the place, she's the leader.			
6	She's the leader of Affordable housing.			
7	MS. CHERNAWSKY: You're right, yeah.			
8	MS. BUTTS: That's where I was going with			
9	that.			
10	MS. VAUGHN: Thanks, Cheryl.			
11	All right. So I think that			
12	concludes today's unless you guys have something			
13	else, but if not, we're going to conclude today's			
14	meeting at 2:59, September 18th. Thank you guys			
15	for your patience.
