

## Appendix B

### Trees for use in Restricted Spaces, Overhead wires and Other Utilities

This is a list of some of the acceptable trees that at maturity have an anticipated height of 15-35'. Trees in tough urban sites rarely achieve the heights listed for trees based on the native habitats. These heights may vary depending upon existing growing conditions and were gleaned from various sources and are based upon growth after 30 years. Choosing the right tree will depend upon existing site conditions (height and location of utility or structure) and growing conditions. Only single stem trees are acceptable, unless approved by the Bureau of Forestry. Additional varieties/cultivars may be approved by the Bureau of Forestry. The Bureau of Forestry reserves the right to prohibit tree species deemed unsuitable for parkway use.\*
