



- Scottsdale Shopping Center was built in 1955, as one of Chicago's first autooriented shopping malls
- PD 965 was established in 2005 when the mall was redeveloped with a Lowe's Home Improvement Store and Garden Center and new outlot buildings
- At the time, cannabis was not allowed in Illinois
- Underlying C2-2 district now allows Cannabis Business Establishments as a special use







***** Technical Amendment

PD Amendment is to add "Cannabis Business Establishments" (subject to obtaining appropriate licenses and ZBA approvals)

Tenants would occupy existing spaces within the shopping center - no new buildings are proposed









- Operators will follow the City's licensing and special use approval procedures applicable to Cannabis Business Establishments



X DPD Recommendations

The Department of Planning and Development recommends approval of this Technical Amendment to Planned Development No. 965.
