SAMPLE ENERGY BENCHMARKING NOTIFICATION LETTER

According to City records, a building under your ownership or management must comply with the Chicago Energy Benchmarking Ordinance* by **June 1, 2020.**

Buildings over 50,000 ft² in area must track and report energy use annually and verify data every three years. Your building is also required to complete data verification this year by June 1, 2020.

Start benchmarking today:

- Get Started: Confirm that the building listed above must comply and identify a benchmarking lead.
- Benchmark Your Building: Set up a Portfolio Manager account and a building profile (if a profile does not yet exist). Populate the profile with the required information.

- Report to the City: Generate, review, and submit the report through Portfolio Manager.
