# **\*** Bally's Chicago Casino Highlights

Key temporary casino metrics since opening Sept. 9<sup>th</sup>, 2023

- 1.7M+ visitors served to-date
  - Second highest casino admissions in the State
  - Critical driver of foot traffic post-pandemic
- \$67M+ in new revenue generated for the City of Chicago
  - \$19.2M gaming tax revenue
  - \$40M initial payment and \$8M in annual payments (\$4M per year)

### 600+ new permanent jobs created

- 71% Chicagoans, 82% minority, 47% women, and 23% SEDA
- Project generated 500+ construction jobs



- Temporary Casino admissions are closer to original expectations
- Spend per admission is lower than anticipated likely due to a greater than expected impact from lack of amenities
- City revenues percentage lower than casino revenue percentage due to graduated tax rate

### **Future Permanent Chicago Casino**

Permanent casino expected to open in Q3 2026

### • \$1.7B investment into our City's downtown

- \$1.34B minimum capital investment
- Entertainment destination development of underutilized site
- Strong multiplier effect across jobs and spend

### • Significant revenue generator for pensions

- Expected to generate hundreds of millions of dollars for the City
- Gaming revenues go to support police and fire pensions

### • 3,000+ permanent jobs to be created

• Expected to also generate 3,000 construction jobs

# **\*** Permanent Casino Financing



- Bally's entered financing transaction with Gaming and Leisure Properties (GLPI)
- GLPI will provide \$940M in construction financing as part of a \$2B overall commitment to Bally's
- Bally's will now build the entire 500-room hotel on the south end of the casino site
- Bally's is still providing public amenities and adhering to prior commitments (riverwalk, riverfront park, Bally's landing space, bird glass design, etc.)
- City held a **Community Advisory Council** (CAC) meeting on **October 24**, **2024**, to discuss the updates
- Bally's to receive **site plan approval** for the changes

### **X** Permanent Casino Construction Status

Permanent Casino currently under demolition. Demolition expected to be complete by February 2025. Opening expected by Q3 2026




# **X SEDA Map (2023)**


# **X SEDA Map (2024)**

Areas of Chicago, based on census tracts, that are the most socio-economically disadvantaged, for the purposes of promoting equitable hiring within areas of economic need



### **X** Temporary Casino Spend 2025 Strategy

#### **Bally's has indicated:**

- As goods and services are needed, they continue to turn to the City database for suppliers
- As they find potential suppliers that are not certified by City of Chicago, they continue to request they work to achieve their certification
- As initial contracts and agreements that were executed prior to opening expire, their goal is to replace as many of them as possible with suppliers who are either currently certified or have completed their application





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- Ensure continued good faith efforts on Chicago Casino goals
- Work to address industry/certification barriers
- Take lessons learned from the Temporary Casino and apply them to the Permanent Casino
