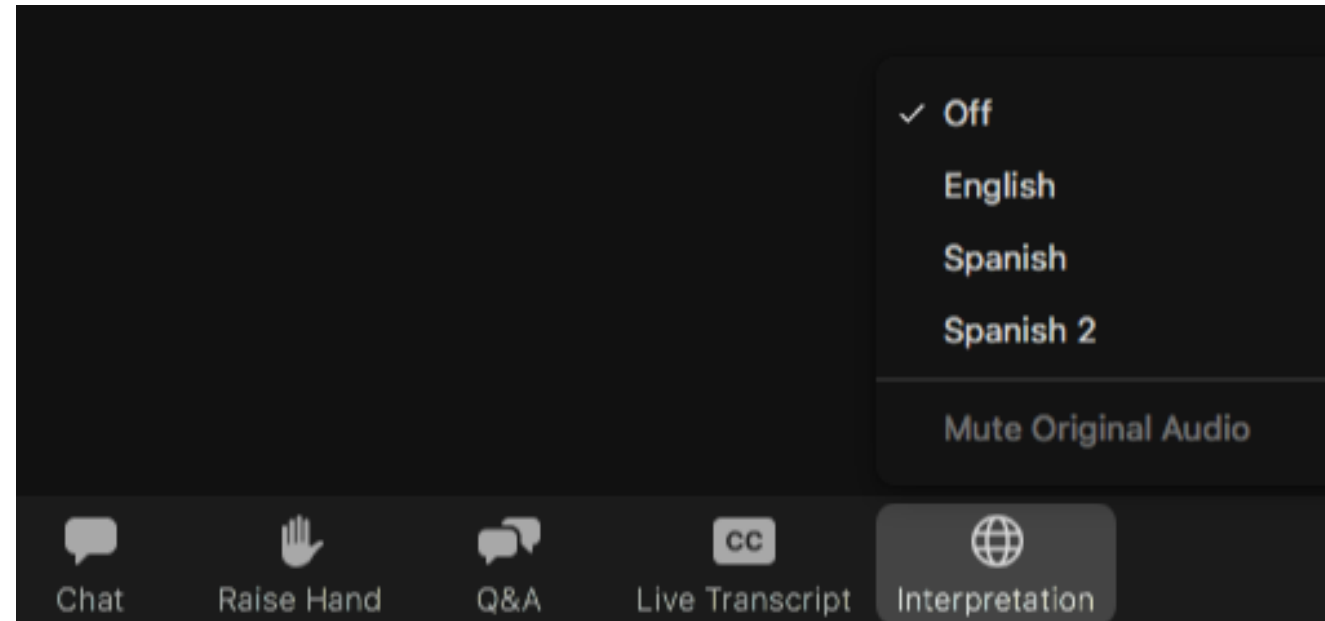

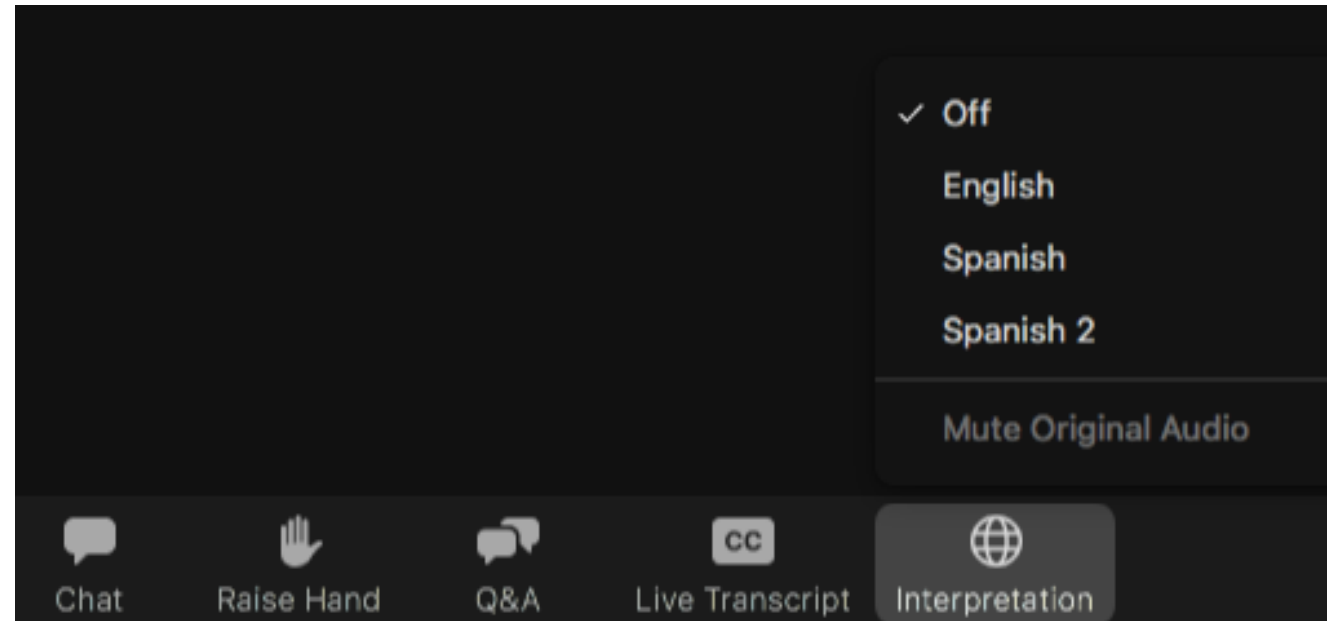

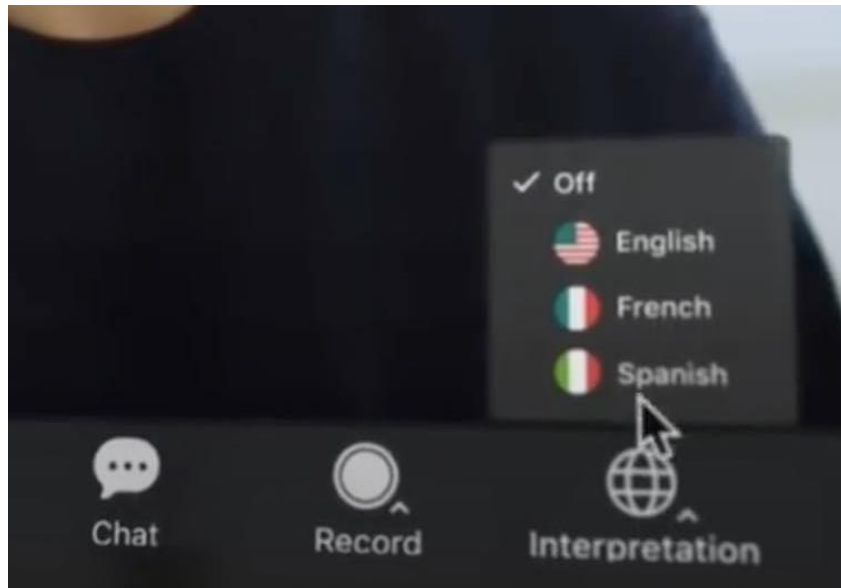

Land Acknowledgement

Chicago is the traditional homelands of the Council of the Three Fires: The Odawa, Ojibwe and Potawatomi Nations. Many other Tribes like the Miami, Ho-Chunk, Menominee, Sac and Fox also called this area home. 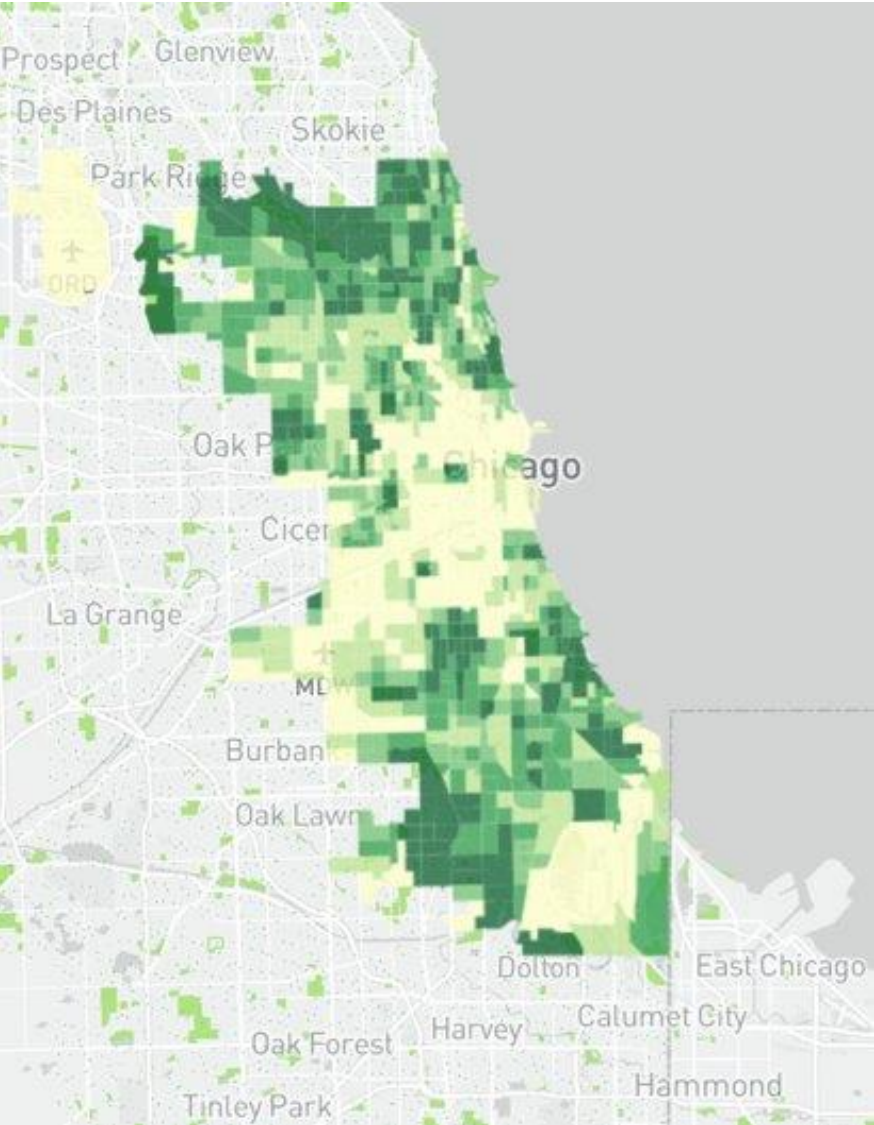

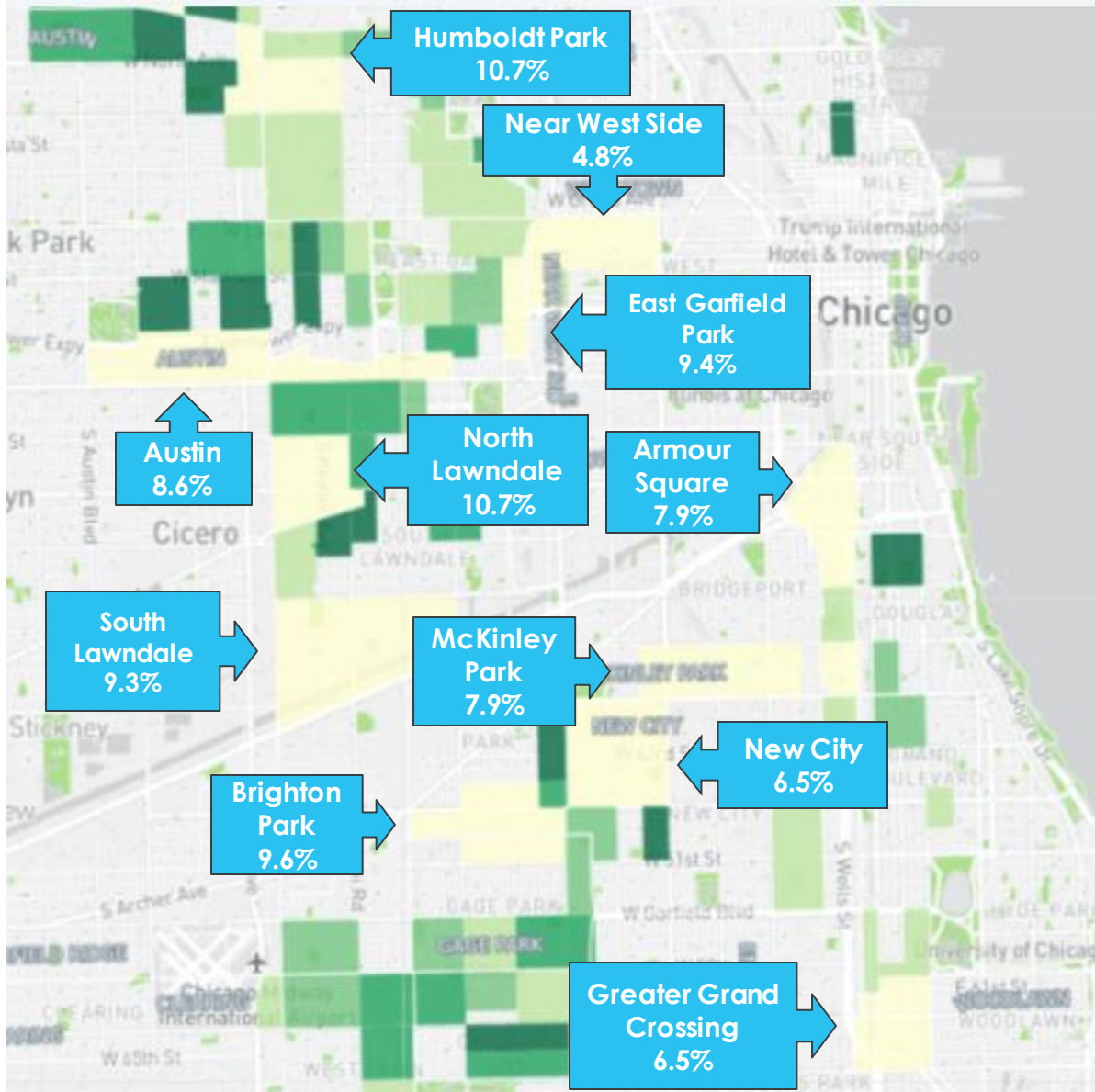


Example w/o Equity Lens: Urban Tree Canopy Coverage
