



A vision for Avondale to become a more livable, walkable, and resilient community.





Traffic Safety Impacts Every Neighborhood in Chicago

In the last five years in Avondale...

12,700 crashes

1,370 people injured

3 people killed



Belmont is a High Crash Corridor.

The existing configuration does not reflect all the ways in which people get around. People walking and biking are disproportionately injured in traffic crashes.



Complete Streets projects...

reduce dangerous speeding, increase safety, and better accommodate people walking, biking, and riding transit.



Belmont will be resurfaced...

which provides the opportunity to make changes to the configuration of the street.



Belmont will become...

a street that prioritizes & balances the needs of people walking, biking, and riding the bus throughout the day.



Belmont will include...

- ▶ Right-sized travel lanes with full-time parking to encourage safer vehicle speeds
- ▶ Curb extensions to shorten pedestrian crossings & improve visibility
- ▶ New crosswalks at Hamlin, Ridgeway, and St Louis with ADA curb ramps
- ▶ **Protected bike lanes** providing the Avondale, Belmont Cragin, and Portage Park neighborhoods with a comfortable connection over the Chicago River & to the Lake
- Bus bulbs and in-lane stops to reduce dwell times and improve bus operations
- Bus priority approaching Milwaukee and Kimball to improve bus speed & reliability
- ► Improved connection to the Belmont Blue Line Station benefitting people walking, biking, and riding the bus throughout the day



This section of Belmont is a High Crash Corridor

Over the last five years...

423 total crashes

72% higher crash rate than all of Belmont

26% higher crash rate than Kimball to Western



People Walking and Biking are Disproportionately Harmed in Crashes

On this stretch of Belmont, people walking and biking make up:

8% of all crashes

38% of all injury crashes

57% of all serious injury crashes



People are Driving too fast on Belmont

590

Per day driving faster than the 30 MPH speed limit



Top speed 60 MPH

These are **FATAL SPEEDS**



The Likelihood of a Person Being Killed Increases as Vehicle Speeds Go Up













80% Risk of Death or Severe Injury



Challenges Crossing the Street for People Walking Along Belmont


10 Intersections on Corridor

- 3 crossings at traffic signals
- 3 crossings marked but uncontrolled
- ▶ 4 crossings unmarked & uncontrolled

More frequent and reliable transit service

Strategy

Encourage sufficient staffing for transit

Collaborate with transportation partners to address bus capacity

Improve bus speeds through dedicated bus infrastructure

Bus Boarding Islands & In-Lane Stops

Bus Priority approaching Milwaukee and Kimball


Coordinate transit improvements across political boundaries and governmental jurisdictions




Create safe and connected sidewalks and bike networks
























Thousands Travel to the Belmont Blue Line Station Each Day

Complete Streets Projects Make Our Streets Safer and Can Save Lives


- ► Traffic injuries and fatalities rose after Covid-19, matching with nationwide trends
- Chicago saw a 30% decrease in traffic fatalities in from 2021 to 2023
- Corresponds to the implementation of more complete streets improvements than ever before





Complete Streets Project on Milwaukee Cut Injury Crashes in Half







Protected Bike Lanes on Kedzie Reduced Speeding by 90%







Improvements on Belmont to the East Reduced Speeding and Injury Crashes

Initial results since last fall...

- ► 12% decrease in all injuries
- ► 69% decrease in serious injuries

These Changes...

- Directly respond to traffic safety issues
- Support recommendations from the Avondale Neighborhood Plan
- Focus on slowing traffic to safe speeds and ensuring the safety of everyone using the street
- Prioritize the safety of the most vulnerable users of the street, people walking and biking, especially children and families
- ► Improve access to the Belmont Blue Line Station
