

NEW, UPDATED COVID-19 VACCINES ARE HERE...GET YOURS TODAY!

Updated COVID-19 vaccines were designed specifically to target the omicron subvariants. This is a big deal, and very different from the boosters previously offered. CDPH recommends that you get an updated vaccine as soon as possible.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW:

- The updated vaccines are safe. They have met FDA and CDC's rigorous safety, effectiveness, and manufacturing quality standards.
- They're being called "bivalent boosters" because they're a mix of two versions of the vaccine — both boosting protection against original coronavirus strain as well as (newly) protecting against the BA.4 and BA.5 omicron subvariants.
- These updated vaccines will replace current booster doses (monovalent mRNA COVID-19 vaccines) for individuals 12 years of age and older.
- These new vaccines are approved for those who have completed their primary series – two doses of an mRNA vaccine (Pfizer or Moderna) or one dose of Johnson & Johnson (J&J).
- The Pfizer vaccine is available for those age 12 and up, Moderna age 18 and up.
- The updated vaccines are recommended at least two months following completion of the primary series or booster vaccination.
- Patients can mix-and-match mRNA brands for their primary series, previous booster dose(s), and bivalent booster dose you can also pair the updated vaccine with your annual flu shot and some other vaccines.

This new vaccine gives us a chance to try and get ahead of COVID-19 as we head into the fall and winter months by protecting individuals from the dominant variant currently circulating in the U.S
