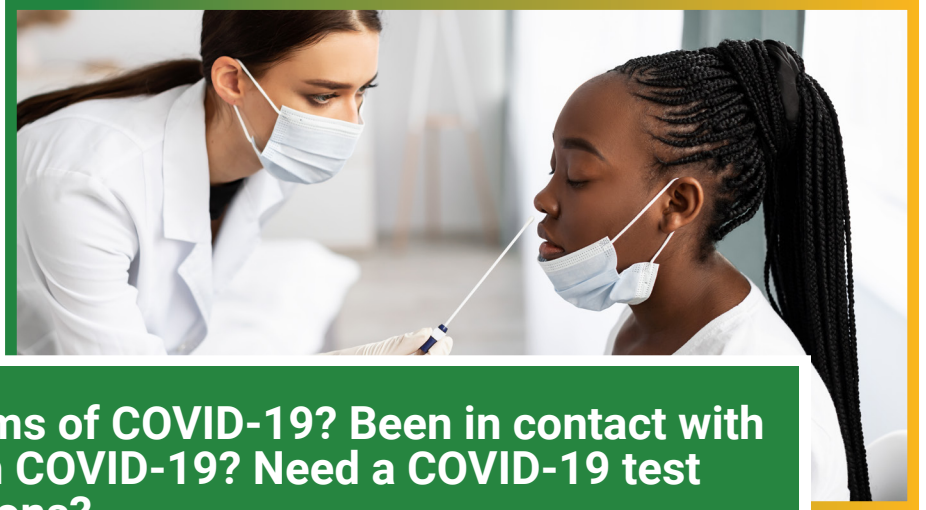


How to find a **COVID-19** **TESTING** **SITE**



Have symptoms of COVID-19? Been in contact with someone with COVID-19? Need a COVID-19 test for other reasons?

Picking a trusted COVID-19 testing site is important. There are many ways to get a COVID-19 test.

ICATT Program

CDC's Increasing Community Access to Testing (ICATT) program provides fair and just access to COVID-19 testing by focusing on higher-risk communities, the uninsured, and surge testing in state and local jurisdictions

Your nearest community health center

If you don't have a healthcare provider or health insurance, contact your nearest community health center to get free COVID-19 testing and subsidized, low-cost healthcare:

Your healthcare provider

Your healthcare provider knows you best. It is particularly important to be connected to your healthcare provider if you are older or have underlying conditions as they may be able to refer you for treatments for COVID-19 (including monoclonal antibodies or antivirals) which lower the risk of severe disease
