- The Pfizer and Moderna vaccines require two doses for most people. While one dose gives you some protection from COVID-19, BOTH doses are needed to get the maximum protection against COVID-19 and its variants. For some people, an additional dose or a booster may be recommended.
- You should get your Pfizer second dose 3 weeks (21 days) after your first dose, your Moderna second dose 28 days after your first dose.
- Even if it has been more than the recommended time, you can still receive your second dose of Moderna or Pfizer and be fully vaccinated. You do not have to restart the vaccine series.
- Everyone ages 12 and older can get a booster dose at least 5 months after getting their second dose of Pfizer or Moderna or at least two months after receiving an initial dose of J&J. Any of the COVID-19 vaccines authorized in the U.S. can be used for the booster dose.
- All COVID-19 vaccines are offered at no cost. No insurance or ID are required.
- Under the City of Chicago Anti-Retaliation Ordinance, anyone who works in Chicago can use accrued paid sick leave or paid time off to get their COVID-19 vaccine.
