




## New COVID-19 cases in Chicago continue to decline



### COVID-19 cases in Chicago decreasing across all age groups




## New COVID-19 case rates remain highest but decreasing in Black Chicagoans; decreasing in Latinx, Asian, and White Chicagoans




#### Weekly case counts and percentage of people with at least 1 vaccine dose

### Chicago COVID Vaccination

48% of Chicagoans have received at least a first dose of vaccine

55% of White Chicagoans

53% of Asian Chicagoans

39% of Latinx Chicagoans

32% of Black Chicagoans

38% of all Chicagoans have received the completed series

60% of Chicagoans 18+ have received at least a first dose of vaccine 47% of Chicagoans 18+ have received the completed series

69% of Chicagoans 65+ have received at least a first dose of vaccine 59% of Chicagoans 65+ have received the completed series


