Program Description

As part of the Department of Planning and Development's ongoing efforts under the Chicago Recovery Plan, the Climate Infrastructure Fund (the Fund) provides grants from \$50,000 to \$250,000 to nonprofit organizations and small businesses for climate-related capital projects in three priority areas:

Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency



Energy efficiency upgrades and/or on-site renewable energy

Electric Vehicles and EV Charging



Purchase of electric vehicles and/or installation of electric vehicle charging stations

Green Infrastructure



Mitigation of flooding by rain gardens, permeable paving, native plantings, etc.

Connecting to the 2022 Climate Action Plan

The Climate Infrastructure Fund is intended to catalyze the vision of Chicago's 2022 Climate Action Plan to accelerate Chicago's equitable transition to a robust green economy for all.

The City of Chicago is committed to reducing greenhouse gas emissions that are causing and expediting climate change, bolstering community resiliency to withstand the impacts that Chicagoans are already experiencing, and doing so with intentionality to assure the benefits of such actions reach every neighborhood.

How to Apply

Who: Eligible applicants must be 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations

or small businesses located in Chicago. The Fund prioritizes projects located in environmental justice communities that are

disproportionately impacted by climate change.

What: All proposed projects are reviewed using a set of criteria that

emphasizes impact, equity, and project readiness.

When: The application period is open through August 18, 2023.
